ORDER

First, Appellant's motion to exceed the page limitations for his brief is denied.

Second, Appellant's motions for the appointment of counsel are denied. *Ex parte Dibble*, 279 S.C. 592, 595, 310 S.E.2d 440, 442 (Ct. App. 1983). This court will not act on another motion for the appointment of counsel

Third, Appellant's motion for "leave to supplement the record on appeal" is denied.


Fourth, Appellant's motions "for no extra briefs or cost" are construed as requests to reduce the filing requirements for Appellant's briefs and the record on appeal. The motion is granted to the extent that Appellant must still serve Respondents as required by the rules, but he is permitted to file only six copies of his final briefs (with one copy being filed unbound) and six copies of the record on appeal (with one copy being filed unbound).

Fifth, Appellant's motion to "discontinue all court deadlines until a full and fair constitutional challenge . . . can be heard" is denied.

Sixth, Appellant's motion regarding his constitutional challenge is denied.

Seventh, Respondents' motion to strike is granted to the extent that matters not actually presented to the lower court shall be stricken from Appellant's designation

of matter and any references shall be omitted from Appellant's brief. Specifically, the designated matter "Constitutional challenge of the truth" shall not be included in the record on appeal. Within thirty days of the date of this order, Appellant shall serve and file an amended initial brief that omits references to this designated matter. Respondents shall serve and file Respondents' initial brief and designation of matter within thirty days after service of Appellant's amended initial brief. Respondents' motion to strike is otherwise denied.
