4 Smith, come around, please.

5 THE DEFENDANT: (Complying.)

6 THE CLERK: Sir, if you will please raise your  
7 right hand.

8 THE DEFENDANT: (Complying.)

9 THE CLERK: Do you solemnly swear or affirm to  
10 tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the  
11 truth?

12 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, ma'am.

13 THE CLERK: Thank you.

14 THE COURT: All right. You're Patrick Todd  
15 Smith?

16 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

17 THE COURT: Mr. Smith, have you read or had  
18 read to you the reports of your alleged probation  
19 violations?

20 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

21 THE COURT: Do you have them with you?

22 MS. GURNEY: I -- I believe I do, Your Honor,  
23 but we have a motion.

24 THE COURT: Okay.

25 MS. GURNEY: Mr. Smith was recently screened

1 for drug court. We -- we found that out recently  
2 and accepted. However, drug court in Anderson  
3 doesn't run with probation, so we're just requesting  
4 a continuance in order to hopefully try to work  
5 something out and -- and see what we can do.

6 THE COURT: Was he served the warrant in this  
7 matter?

8 PROBATION OFFICER: Your honor, they're all  
9 citations and a ---

10 THE COURT: They're all citations?

11 PROBATION OFFICER: Yes, sir.

12 THE COURT: I'm really not inclined to continue  
13 him if he's got three cases and he picked up three  
14 more arrests.

15 MS. GURNEY: And he is in the detention center.

16 THE COURT: And we've got a victim over here.  
17 I'm not really inclined to do that. I'll take that  
18 under advisement. I want to hear.

19 Mr. Smith?

20 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

21 THE COURT: Asking you earlier, have you read  
22 or had read to you the reports of your alleged  
23 probation violation?

24 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir. Mr. McCormick here,  
25 he's -- he's had lots of information for me.

1 THE COURT: The question was, have you read  
2 them or had them read to you? That's the only  
3 question I asked.

4 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

5 THE COURT: Do you agree or do you disagree  
6 that you willfully violated the terms of your  
7 probation?

8 MS. GURNEY: Your Honor, he agrees with  
9 some ---

10 THE COURT: He's going to talk to me about it.

11 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir. I -- yes, sir. I  
12 did violate some of the conditions.

13 THE COURT: Okay. Tell me what you did to  
14 violate these.

15 THE DEFENDANT: I was hanging around the wrong  
16 crowd and caught some more charges, driving under  
17 suspension.

18 THE COURT: Basically, it says, Mr. Smith, that  
19 you failed to report to your initial entry on  
20 April 17 -- of 2017 or June of 2017; is that  
21 correct?

22 THE DEFENDANT: Mr. McCormick, I always  
23 reported.

24 THE COURT: Talk to me.

25 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

1 THE COURT: Okay.

2 THE DEFENDANT: I always reported to my thing.  
3 I failed to pay my rest -- some of my restitution,  
4 but I always reported to Mr. McCormick.

5 THE COURT: Well, let me stop you right there.  
6 And I'm going to let you speak.

7 Tell me about it, please, sir.

8 PROBATION OFFICER: Yes, sir. He's in -- he  
9 currently has four probation cases that are active.  
10 He's only in violation of three of those.

11 Since that he -- his last probation violation  
12 hearing was on February 6, 2017. And since then,  
13 he's been arrested ---

14 THE COURT: Three times?

15 PROBATION OFFICER: --- ten times.

16 THE COURT: Ten?

17 PROBATION OFFICER: Yes, sir. I have a list  
18 through Anderson, Oconee, and all over. And  
19 sometimes he was arrested in Anderson and then  
20 transported to Oconee and vice versa.

21 And he's -- since that last probation violation  
22 hearing, he's received two more probation --  
23 probation sentences. He's in -- he owes restitution  
24 on all of them except for the newest one, and he  
25 hasn't made a payment on his restitution since

1 August of 2016.

2 THE COURT: Sir, what is your name?

3 THE VICTIM: Darrell Whobrey, W-h-o-b-r-e-y.

4 THE COURT: I'll be glad to hear anything you  
5 have. How much money have you received? I assume  
6 that you're owed restitution.

7 THE VICTIM: \$10,900.

8 THE COURT: Have you been paid anything?

9 THE VICTIM: Less than \$10.

10 THE COURT: Less than \$10?

11 THE VICTIM: Yes, sir.

12 THE COURT: Since 2016?

13 THE VICTIM: Yes, sir.

14 THE COURT: Have you been working?

15 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

16 THE COURT: Why haven't you been paying the  
17 restitution?

18 THE DEFENDANT: After I was -- see, I believe  
19 that case was like 2015 when that happened.

20 THE COURT: Sir, you need to direct your  
21 comments to me.

22 THE DEFENDANT: I'm sorry. I'm sorry.

23 I believe it was in 2015 when I -- when that  
24 particular case happened. I went to prison for a  
25 year, 18 months I believe. I came home. I went to

1 work for Pickens Construction. I worked for Pickens  
2 Construction for about ten months, and then I went  
3 and switched over to Moseley Bros. Construction.  
4 Went to work for Wesley Moseley.

5 THE COURT: That's fine and well and I'm glad  
6 you're working. The question was, however, why  
7 haven't you paid your restitution?

8 THE DEFENDANT: I just wasn't being  
9 responsible. I failed -- I failed to be -- to do  
10 my -- pay my duties and I just wasn't being  
11 responsible.

12 THE COURT: All right. Ms. Gurney, I cut you  
13 off two times now. Go ahead.

14 MS. GURNEY: That's all right. What -- what we  
15 would ask if you're not inclined to grant the  
16 continuance ---

17 THE COURT: I'm not going to grant the  
18 continuance. He got arrested ten times. He's a  
19 menace.

20 MS. GURNEY: --- would be to revoke time on  
21 HIP. While he's on HIP, I believe he could  
22 participate in drug court which would hopefully  
23 address the underlying situation of his addiction.

24 And then once is that completed, then he would  
25 be -- continue on these probation cases.

1 THE DEFENDANT: Your Honor, may I speak?

2 THE COURT: Yes, sir.

3 THE DEFENDANT: I was released last June, June  
4 of 2016.

5 THE COURT: From?

6 THE DEFENDANT: From SCDC. I went to work. I  
7 did -- I stayed clean until December, Christmas Eve  
8 of 2016.

9 I went back. I stayed working until January,  
10 and I got pulled over on my way to work. I mean, I  
11 know this, but I got pulled ---

12 THE COURT: What were you saying?

13 THE DEFENDANT: I went -- I got pulled over. I  
14 went to jail for driving under suspension, and I had  
15 a Lortab in my vehicle. I went to jail for a  
16 controlled substance.

17 I caught four more driving under suspensions  
18 like in a month and a half. And I got told by  
19 the -- it was a burglary or prevention team that the  
20 county had put together. They told me that I was  
21 put on a target list. The police would come up to  
22 my house, run the numbers on everything in the  
23 house.

24 And this -- and it became where, I mean, I  
25 couldn't go to the store without getting pulled over

1 or -- and so five of these -- five of these arrests  
2 that I had was driving under suspension.

3 After I lost my job, I couldn't get my truck  
4 out of the impound anymore. I couldn't no longer  
5 because I was ---

6 THE COURT: How did you lose your job?

7 THE DEFENDANT: Because I -- I couldn't get  
8 back and forth to work. I had -- it was five  
9 driving under suspensions.

10 I went to -- one of the times I was at the --  
11 at the store, I had got a little side job. I bought  
12 me a pressure washer and I was pressure washing.  
13 Well, I stopped at the store to fill up and was  
14 putting gas and all in my little pressure washers.  
15 And a deputy rolls in, sees my truck, locks me up  
16 for driving under suspension again.

17 I had a previous warrant from 2015. This was  
18 before I ever got put on the probations that I was  
19 on currently. It was a charge -- I wrote the  
20 counties -- Oconee County -- it was from Oconee  
21 County General Sessions bench warrant for an old  
22 charge from 2015 at the same time this charge --  
23 this man's stuff here.

24 And anyway, I had a bench warrant on me, and I  
25 went to the court. Judge Maddox gave me 15. He put

1 me on ten years, suspended to five years probation  
2 for the charge, but it was a charge from all this --  
3 before all this occurred that I'm on.

4 You put me on probation and gave me three  
5 probations. You run them all consecutive so I could  
6 pay the restitution back for this man right here.

7 THE COURT: You didn't bother doing it. Paid  
8 him less than \$10 in two years.

9 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir. And I -- and they  
10 knew what it was. I got caught back up in my drug  
11 addiction. And I just -- and, you know, when I got  
12 the extra money instead of paying my bills, my power  
13 got cut off at my house, my water got cut off at my  
14 house. You know what I mean?

15 And then I'm not blaming anybody. It's my  
16 fault. I should've took responsibility, but I lost  
17 my vehicle. So I turned to what I knew next, and  
18 that was going back into a life of crime.

19 When I go to -- when I've been in prison, I  
20 mean, I'm not saying prison is easy, but prison --  
21 go to prison, I stay clean. I don't do any drugs.  
22 I get healthy. I go in there. I work, you know, so  
23 I can get my mind right. I get back. I'm a  
24 Christian. You know, I put my faith in God and --  
25 but when I get out, I go three or four months and

1 then I'm -- it's just like the stress builds up, and  
2 then I'm right back where I'm at.

3 I mean, I'm not a -- I'm not a bad person. I  
4 don't go out just taking people's stuff. I don't do  
5 that ---

6 THE COURT: Well, you might realize that ---

7 THE DEFENDANT: --- just to -- just to -- just  
8 to make my -- to support my drug habit.

9 But I go three -- I go three -- I've went six  
10 months. My mother is here in court today, and I  
11 have went -- I have -- I just celebrated a year. I  
12 forget. How long ago was that? I mean, it's just  
13 here recently I celebrated a year.

14 After I celebrate a year, okay, I -- I'm  
15 gonna -- I can do it one more time, you know,  
16 because I pat myself. I guess a pat on my back, and  
17 then next thing I know here we are.

18 Nikki -- Nikki Lindsey came and talked to me  
19 because I wrote the judge at the time, and I told  
20 her, "Look, I've been going three or four months all  
21 my life. I stay out and I stay clean, and then I go  
22 right back to drugs.

23 And then this time I got some receiving stolen  
24 good charges on me. And instead of stealing, I  
25 justified, well, I'm not stealing it. It's like

1 I -- I would buy it from somebody.

2 THE COURT: Don't tell me about your underlying  
3 charges.

4 THE DEFENDANT: I'm just -- I'm just being  
5 honest with you. I mean, regardless, it don't  
6 matter. I'm being honest with this man.

7 And I would -- and I would -- I would wheel and  
8 deal with stuff. And then that's how I justify,  
9 well, I'm not stealing it, so I'd -- I would, you  
10 know -- you understand what I'm -- you understand  
11 what I'm trying to say?

12 THE COURT: Yes, sir, I do.

13 THE DEFENDANT: And, well, anyway,  
14 Ms. Lindsey -- Nikki Lindsey came and talked to me  
15 Wednesday from the drug court, and I told her my  
16 situation. We talked several hours at the jail.

17 And that's -- that -- I should've been put in  
18 this program a long time ago, I mean, because it's  
19 a -- it's a -- I can go down and go to prison. I  
20 can -- I can go to prison. I can do this. They've  
21 got programs in there and everything, but it don't  
22 mean diddly-squat until I'm out here on the street  
23 actually put in front of life. You know what I'm  
24 saying?

25 It's like a -- it's so many times, you know, I

1 just had that little bit of accountability. That's  
2 three drug tests a week in that program. They tell  
3 you -- you have to call and check in with them every  
4 day. You have so many things you have to do. It's  
5 almost like a structure, a prison structure outside  
6 of prison. That's what I need.

7 And, I mean, I -- I mean, I'll take  
8 responsibility. If you send me to prison, I'll --  
9 I'll -- I'll go to prison.

10 THE COURT: Well, let me just tell you right  
11 now, I am going to send you to prison. I find that  
12 you willfully violated your probation. It purports  
13 you've been arrested. You didn't pay any monies.  
14 Then you had -- you willfully didn't pay any monies.

15 So I'm going to revoke 40 months. I'm going to  
16 toll him while he's in.

17 When he comes out, I want him drug tested for  
18 the first year intensely. That way we can monitor  
19 you.

20 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

21 THE COURT: Okay, sir?

22 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

23 THE COURT: And you'll continue on and get this  
24 gentleman paid once you get out.

25 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

1           THE COURT: You seem like you actually have the  
2 ability to be a decent person.

3           THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

4           THE COURT: All right. I'm going to give you  
5 40 months. Give him credit for time served. Good  
6 luck to you.

7           MS. GURNEY: Thank you, Your Honor.

8           THE COURT: All right. Thank you. Let the  
9 time satisfy arrears.

10          PROBATION OFFICER: Yes, sir.




