**PRO SE RESPONSE IN RE OF WRIT OF CERTIORARI
AND JOHNSON PETITION**

In respect to Joanna Delany's submission of Johnson's petition and submission of Writ of Certiorari on my behalf, I am requesting the courts to take into consideration further evidence to prove innocence. Such Documents are present in file and numbered as such, in the following:

1. Co-defendant Anthony Ray Letter
 - a. Letter of confession dated, signed and notarized
2. S.C Department of corrections inmate Eric Baxter letter
 - a. Letter of what co-defendant Anthony Ray said directly to him. (Mr. Baxer)
3. S.C Department of Corrections inmate Scott Smith letter
 - a. Letter 2 of what co-defendant Anthony Ray said directly to him. (Mr. Smith)
4. S.C Department of Corrections inmate Kareem Shamel Harry.
 - a. Letter signed, dated and notarized; willing to testify to what co-defendant admitted to him. (Mr. Harry)
5. S.C Department of Corrections inmate James Simpson letter.
 - a. Letter dated and signed baring witness to statements co-defender Anthony Ray said to me.
6. Phone interview between Detective Mrs. Pop and Barbara Jernigan dated on 3/18/2013
 - a. Former Attorney Mr. Diggs failed to submit subpoena to Mrs. Jernigan in my defense.

b. (6B) Highlighted area states Co-defendant told her and time of year he told her.

c. (6C) highlighted areas state that co-defendant Arlie Mullins DID enter the house. Also highlighted area states that co-defendant Anthony Ray admits to shooting victim Mr. Elliott in the head.

d. (6D) highlighted area states that at the time of phone interview 3/18/13, co-defendant still tells Mrs. Jernigan that he (Anthony Ray) shot victim Mr. Elliott in the head.

e. (6E) highlighted area states that co-defendant tells that he had been to Mr. Elliott's house prior to this case. Showing that he did have knowledge of the area. During Trial, co-defendant said he did not know the area.

7. Partial statement of Co-defendant Anthony Ray

a. highlighted area states that "Moon" (Charles Mullins Sr.) went to Mr. Elliott's house earlier on the day of incident.

b. (7B) Co-defendant states the shot was point blank range, yet the pathology results (#8 below) show no residue to the skin.

Also states the other side of head exploded. Pathology results show otherwise.

8. Pathology Results

a. highlighted area shows no surrounding residue

b. (8B) highlighted area Pathology results show both shot wounds measure 1.5cm. Also states discrete projectile, yet further report states an exit wound in the back area. How can projectile be in the body yet there is an exit wound?

c. (8C) states the exit wound in the back area.

9. Forensic report

a. (9A) highlighted area shows that all 3 projectiles were fired from the same gun. A 357 or a .38. No evidence of a .22 firearm.

b. (9B) Forensic report again, showing no evidence of any type of .22 firearm

10. Edward Proctor Cross examination transcript copy

a. Highlighted area shows Dr. Proctor states the holes in body are the same size. (same firearm-same bullet)

Following these examples and statements, I have also included the following:

- 1. My letter to Dr. Proctor, which I did NOT get a response.**
- 2. Copy of recorded phone records between Co-defendant Anthony Ray and his wife. (shows character-highlighted areas)**

- 5. Letter of Character on my behalf, from Mr. Steven McCarthy. Certified Correctional Officer also worked in Office of Disciplinary**
- 6. Classes and credits I have received during incarcerated time.**
- 7. Co-defendant Anthony Ray’s rap sheet since incarceration**

8. My own rap sheet since incarceration.

To the courts of south Carolina,

This statement is being written because I can not live with what I have done any longer. I feel I have to right a terrible wrong that I have committed and clear an innocent man that had no part whatsoever in a crime that I played a part in and had knowledge of. The reason I testified in Brad Mullins trial was because the solicitors office offered me a deal before Brad mullins trial that if I testified against Brad mullins I would receive leniency from the state and receive the sentence I am serving now, but if I didn't I was threatened and told that if I didn't cooperate they would offer someone else the deal and guaranteed me I would face murder charges and receive the maximum life sentence. I decided to cooperate with the solicitors office and falsely accuse Brad mullins because it insured me a lighter sentence. At the time I made this decision I was dealing with a lot of stress put on not only me, but my family as well and I couldn't cope with the possibility of losing my wife and my children and I was willing to falsely testify against Brad Mullins and wrongfully accuse him knowing he had no part in the crime to satisfy the solicitor and to receive the deal I was promised for my testimony against Brad mullins. Brad Mullins was not involved in any crime with me and he only knew about the crime because I told him about it and after I told him I realized that he was one more person that could implicate me in the crime so I pointed the finger at him and testified against him and repeated exactly

what the state coached me to say. I am writing this statement now because I no longer want any part in wrongfully convicting and falsely accusing a person who wasn't even at the scene of the crime nor had any participation in the crime. I was afraid at the time and did what I was told in order to receive what the solicitors office guaranteed me for my testimony. I only did this because my wife was involved as well and the solicitor who prosecuted the case against Brad mullins, told my wife they would help her get our children back if she cooperated with them and testified to what I had told her to say against Brad mullins to insure that my wife wouldn't be prosecuted as well. I pray the courts forgive me and pray the courts view this statement and see me as a man who wants to correct and straighten not only a grave injustice on another human life, but also a man thats trying to right his wrongs.

My name is James Simpson S.C.D.C. # 176162, and I am incarcerated at Perry Cor. Inst. I am housed in Q-1 whereas the C.B.U. and Perry Dog Project is located

As part of the Dog Project we are required to outreach with inmates housed within other units. During one of the outreach sessions myself, and Bradley Mullins went to Q-4 to pick up inmates who volunteered to go on the yard for Dog Therapy. One of these inmates was Anthony Ray. Mr. Ray asked to be added to this outreach in order to speak directly to Mr. Mullins. Mr. Mullins asked me to witness this meeting because he wasn't sure of the motivations of Mr. Ray. Being a Mentor in the CBU I was willing to supervise this meeting.

It was during one of these meetings, there were at least half a dozen of

such meetings initiated by Mr. Ray.
If Mr. Mullins was not present Mr. Ray
would ask someone to see if Mr. Mullins
would make himself available.

Mr. Ray, within my presence, informed
Mr. Mullins that he had falsely testified
against him in court for a promise of a
lesser offense. He further stated that the
solicitor knew he was being untruthful
yet allowed him to testify anyway.

Mr. Ray stated he had allowed Christ
into his life and asked for Mr. Mullins
forgiveness and stated he would himself
write a statement for Mr. Mullins and
be truthful as to the events of the crime
he committed.

JERNIGAN: October 19th, 1980.

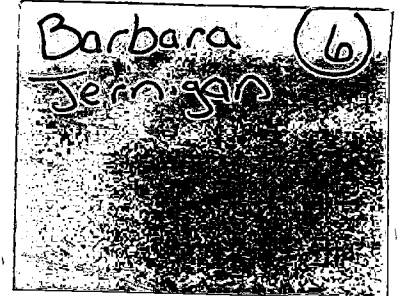
POP: And you're social?

JERNIGAN: 230-27-4306.

POP: Okay. And Barbara I'm going to read you you're rights and again like I said we're being recorded and you are consenting to that recording, correct?

JERNIGAN: Yes ma'am.

POP: Okay. You have the right to remain silent. Anything you say can and will be used in against you in a court of law. You have the right to talk with an attorney and have him present with you while you are being questioned. If you can't afford to hire an attorney, one will be appointed to represent you before any



questioning if you wish. If you desire to make a statement or answer questions today you have the right to stop at any time. Barbara do you understand your rights?

JERNIGAN: Yes ma'am.

POP: Are you willing to speak to me?

JERNIGAN: Yes.

POP: Freely and voluntarily and you haven't been promised or threatened?

JERNIGAN: Yes.

POP: Okay. Now Barbara who is your brother?

JERNIGAN: Charles Mullins.

POP: And is Charles involved in an incident here in South Carolina?

JERNIGAN: Yes.

POP: And is that um do you know those? Do you know what the charges are for your brother?

JERNIGAN: Yes.

POP: Okay. And those, can you tell me what you think those charges are?

JERNIGAN: Um first degree murder, first degree burglary, and armed robbery, I believe.

POP: Correct. And I'm calling you today um and you're all the way up in Kentucky so that's why we're doing this by phone. But um do you have any information that can assist in this investigation?

JERNIGAN: Yes.

POP: Okay and is it firsthand knowledge or hearsay?

JERNIGAN: Firsthand knowledge.

POP: And is that from one of the other people charged in this incident?

JERNIGAN: Yes.

POP: Okay. Tell me do you, do you remember who gave you this information?

JERNIGAN: Anthony Ray.

POP: And how, how are, how do you know Anthony Ray?

JERNIGAN: He's my first cousin.

POP: Okay. And who is he married too or was?

JERNIGAN: He was married to uh Latonya Ray.

POP: Okay, alright and do you remember about when you got this information?

JERNIGAN: It was spring, early summer 2009.

POP: Okay. And where were you?

JERNIGAN: At their residence in North Carolina.

POP: And where were they living at? Where were they living?

JERNIGAN: In North Carolina.

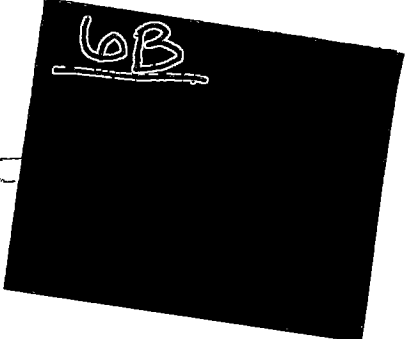
POP: Okay. Do you remember the address by chance?

JERNIGAN: 1024 Hazel Street Clayton.

POP: And where did you live?

JERNIGAN: 702 Live Oak Church Road Selma, North Carolina.

POP: Okay so you lived in North Carolina as well?



JERNIGAN: Yes ma'am.

POP: ~~Alright so the first time you ever heard anything about this it was from Anthony at Anthony's house?~~

JERNIGAN: Yes.

POP: Okay can you tell me what was said?

JERNIGAN: He tried to discuss a murder that he was involved in and I didn't want to hear it. But the more he talked about it the more he unraveled details. Um as far as location um going into this man's house.

POP: What?

JERNIGAN: Getting guns.

POP: Yeah what did he say when he was trying to talk about the murder? Did he say how did he bring that up?

JERNIGAN: He asked me had I ever heard about the murder that took place in South Carolina.

POP: Mm, hmm and what did he say it was over?

JERNIGAN: And I'm sorry.

POP: What did he say it was about the murder in South Carolina?

JERNIGAN: Um he said a man was killed.

POP: Did he say why?

JERNIGAN: Um over a struggle over some guns.

POP: Okay. So can, do you mind telling me um what Anthony said about this murder?

JERNIGAN: ~~Um Anthony said that he went to the man's residence.~~

POP: What'd he say before that?

JERNIGAN: Um.

POP: Who was with him?

JERNIGAN: Um Brad Mullins and Arlie Mullins.

POP: Okay were they, where were they before they went to this man's house?

JERNIGAN: They were in South Carolina.

POP: Okay do you know where?

JERNIGAN: Um I do not.

POP: Okay.

JERNIGAN: Prior to this not.

POP: Okay. Did he say they were drinking or partying or how they?

JERNIGAN: Yes.

POP: Okay.

JERNIGAN: They had been drinking.

POP: Okay.

JERNIGAN: Um which is normal for them.

POP: Okay.

JERNIGAN: Um and they talked about an easy target for some guns. So the three of them Brad, Anthony, and Arlie went to this residence which ran down a long dirt driveway. Um and broke into this house and proceeded to ransack and steal his guns and other various items.

POP: Did they say what those other items were?

JERNIGAN: No.

POP: Okay. And when, did they say um at this point did they say who was driving?

JERNIGAN: Not at this point no.

POP: And, and okay. And what did they, did he say anything about when they pulled up to the house what it looked like? Did it look like somebody was home or not home or?

JERNIGAN: He said it looked like no one was home. There was a small light on um maybe from a lamp. He said he didn't know which room it was coming from but the rest of the house was dark.

POP: Okay. And when you said, you said down a long dirt road. Did the man have one house or more than one house or how did they know?

JERNIGAN: Um he said it was a hunting lodge.

POP: Okay. That the man's house was a hunting lodge or he had a hunting lodge?

JERNIGAN: Um he didn't, he just said it was a hunting lodge back there.

POP: Okay, okay alright. And who went? Did he say who went in the house?

JERNIGAN: Anthony, Brad, and Arlie were the first three to enter the house.

POP: Okay. And what did he say about the inside of the house?

JERNIGAN: Um he said that they got guns. They found guns, got some, a few from a gun cabinet um and other, other guns that were just laying around is what he said. Um he didn't specify on the wall or anything like that. Um they had a good amount between the three of them and Arlie was ready to go.

POP: Okay. Well did they say what they were putting the guns in? How they were carrying 'em?

JERNIGAN: No, no I just assumed their hands. He did not specify.

POP: Okay, alright. And so Arlie was ready to leave.

JERNIGAN: ~~Arlie told them they had enough that they needed to go before they got caught.~~

POP: Okay.

JERNIGAN: ~~So Arlie left out of the house.~~

POP: Okay.

JERNIGAN: Anthony and Brad were not ready to go. They wanted to check out the rest of the house. So Brad proceeded on to other rooms and Anthony followed shortly behind him.

POP: Okay and then?

JERNIGAN: In one particular room were several other guns.

POP: Okay. And then what did Anthony say?

JERNIGAN: Anthony said that a man startled Brad and Brad startled him.

POP: Okay.

JERNIGAN: ~~And the gentleman that was there grabbed Brad and there was a struggle between the two of them and Brad then yelled for Anthony.~~

POP: Okay.

JERNIGAN: ~~So Anthony went to him and the man had Brad down and Anthony said he assumed the guy was gonna call the cops and he placed the gun between the man's eyes and told him to let him go. And the man said please don't shoot me. Please don't kill me and Anthony's exact words were say goodbye mother fucker and he shot him.~~

POP: Okay. And what did Anthony?

JERNIGAN: And left a (unintelligible).

POP: Okay. And then they went and got in the, in their, in the car?

JERNIGAN: They went to a vehicle, yes.

POP: Okay and did he say who was driving?

JERNIGAN: My brother was driving.

POP: And who's your little brother?

JERNIGAN: Charles Mullins.

POP: Okay. And did he say what your brother Charles was driving?

JERNIGAN: Not, they just said a truck.

POP: Okay, alright and where did they go after this?

JERNIGAN: To my dad's house.

POP: Okay um did Anthony say anything about maybe what the man, other than him being an old man. Did he say anything else about him?

JERNIGAN: No.

POP: Okay did he say anything about what he was wearing?

JERNIGAN: He did not.

POP: And did he say anything like he, he shot him once or he shot him twice or anything about that?

JERNIGAN: ~~Um I do believe he said there were two shots.~~

POP: Okay.

JERNIGAN: Um but he did not specify as to where he shot the man.

POP: Okay. Okay and after they got home to your dad's house, that's Charles Senior?

JERNIGAN: Yes ma'am.

POP: Okay. What happened there?

JERNIGAN: They discussed it um Charlie and Anthony had words over it and.

POP: Your, your brother or your dad?

JERNIGAN: My, my brother, no my brother Charlie.

POP: Okay, mm, hmm.

JERNIGAN: Um and Anthony had words over what the hell they were doing.

POP: Mm, hmm.

JERNIGAN: And what were they thinking? And Charlie left, my brother Charlie left.

POP: Okay and where did he go?

JERNIGAN: Back home to the mountains to my mother.

POP: Okay, alright and then what?

JERNIGAN: Um Anthony said that it was discussed a little more there at my dad's residence. And then from that moment on nobody spoke of it.

POP: Okay. And did they go as a group somewhere?

JERNIGAN: Um that I do not know.

POP: Did they go to Louisiana?

JERNIGAN: Oh yes they went to Louisiana um after Hurricane Katrina.

POP: Okay.

JERNIGAN: And they were supposed to be gonna try to help do some cleanup but something fell through with that, fell short with money, they, they then tried to sell or pawn the guns that they had gotten from this man's house.

POP: In Louisiana?

JERNIGAN: Yes.

POP: ~~And Anthony's still telling you this story?~~

JERNIGAN: ~~Yes.~~

POP: Okay.

JERNIGAN: And he tells it just as he told it this very day.

POP: Okay. And did you ever see any of these guns?

JERNIGAN: No.

POP: Okay. And so did they sell or pawn or get rid of any of these guns?

JERNIGAN: From what I can understand a few of them were pawned somewhere in Louisiana.

POP: Mm, hmm.

JERNIGAN: Um and one was supposedly tossed into a swamp like pond sort of area.

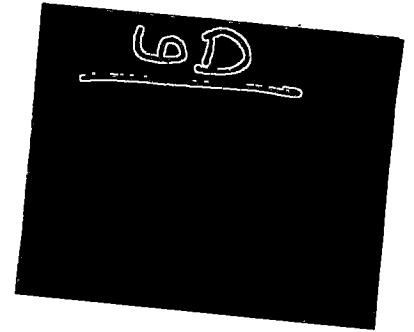
POP: ~~Okay. And this is what Anthony's telling you?~~

JERNIGAN: ~~Yes.~~

POP: Okay did he say who threw it in a, a swamp?

JERNIGAN: He did not.

POP: Okay. Does it, do you know um anybody that may have some of these guns or know where they are?



JERNIGAN: Um I believe Arlie's dad may know where some of them are.

POP: Okay. Let me ask you this um was there on this same night that um Anthony's telling you all this did he discuss how they knew this man or, or?

JERNIGAN: Um he said that he had been to this gentleman's house prior to this. Um he had been in there before.

POP: Did he say for what purpose?

JERNIGAN: And, this same purpose to take the man's guns and he had, he had stolen other items um but never like, not quite like this.

POP: Okay from this same man?

JERNIGAN: Yes ma'am.

POP: So did he say who had, who else was with him when he went in this man's house before to burglarize it?

JERNIGAN: No ma'am.

POP: Okay.

JERNIGAN: He just said he knew that the home was there but the house was loaded and it was an easy target.

POP: Okay. And did he say anything about when he'd gone in this man's house before this?

JERNIGAN: No.

POP: Okay. Without getting into um detail has anybody else discussed the details of this crime with you?

JERNIGAN: Yes.

POP: And who would that be?

JERNIGAN: Anthony's wife, Latonya.

POP: Okay and when did she start talking to you about it?

JERNIGAN: After Anthony was arrested.

POP: Okay. Okay, well Barbara I'm getting ready to um turn the recorder off. The ending time is um I don't know if I said it earlier but um 1:54. Um you do know that you are um subject to have to testify in court. Will you, are you willing to do that?

JERNIGAN: Yes ma'am.

POP: Are you willing to drive to South Carolina to do that?

JERNIGAN: Yes ma'am.

POP: And the things that you've told me today are truthful?

JERNIGAN: Yes ma'am.

POP: Okay. I'm going to turn the recorder off, okay.

JERNIGAN: Okay.

He states that "moon" and Brad knew where they were at.

He states that Brad lived in a rental house of the man before.

"moon" stated that he had been by the man's house earlier that day and knew the man wasn't there.

He states "moon" knew the man had some guns, a lot of guns.

He states that it was agreed that he, Brad, Arlie and Lil Charlie would go to this man's house to get the guns.

He states that they all 4 wore gloves.

He states that it was dark when they got to the man's house.

They stopped about 100yds from the house on the dirt road.

He states lil Charlie was driving his blazer, Arlie was up front, Brad was sitting behind Lil Charlie and Anthony was sitting behind Arlie.

He states when they get there everybody gets out of the car.

He states he goes to the front door with Brad and knock.

He states there is a truck at the house.

He states no body answered.

He states Brad goes around to the back of the house.

He states he hears a window break and he goes to the back of the house.

He states he doesn't know where Arlie and Lil Charlie are at this point.

He states when he gets there Brad was already in the house.

He states Brad comes out with 2 long guns, tells him he is going to go get some more.

He states that Brad comes back the second time with 2 more guns and a blanket. (outside)

Anthony starts putting the guns in the blanket.

He states they were probably 10 mins and he was tying up the blanket when he hears a shot from inside the house.

He states he could not remember how many shots he heard.

He states he goes into the back door, see Brad and this man who is naked wrestling over the gun.

He states the gun goes off, he shot him in the head and the man's head exploded.

He states he ran out the back door.

He states after he ran out the back door he ran into little Charlie and Arlie.

He states he told them "he shot him, he shot him".

He states Arlie and Lil Charlie grab the blanket with guns and run to Lil Charlie's blazer.

He states they put the bag of guns in the back of the blazer and waited a few mins when Brad came to the car.

Brad comes up to the car and throws something in the back of the blazer and they left and drove to "moons" house.

~~He states they drove straight to "moons" house and didn't stop anywhere on the way back.~~

He states when they got back to "moons" Lil Charlie went inside to get "moon" and Delilah.

He states they are at the shed behind "moons" house.

They get the guns out of the truck and that when he saw what Brad threw in the back at the house. He states it was a little pillow case with 10-12 pistols in it.

He states the guns are all laid out in the Barn/shed.

He states Arlie, lil Charlie and himself get the guns out.

He states Verne comes out.

He states the pistols are all laid out and everybody is looking at the pistols and then they all get put back into the pillowcase.

At some point in time Brad takes lil Charlie's Blazer and leaves.

He states "moon" tells Verne to wrap the guns up and put them into the tool trailer. He states the pistols get put back into the pillowcase.

He states that it gets decided that because the pistols can be traced they need to get rid of them.

He states that Arlie, Lil Charlie and himself get the pistols and get into Lil Charlie's pickup truck.

~~He states they drive to a little bridge and the pistols get thrown into a swamp. He did not get out of the truck but Arlie and Lil Charlie did.~~

He states 2-3 days later they leave to go to Louisiana after a Hurricane.

He states the events that occurred at Mr. Elliott's house were discussed when they got back.

He states that Brad told him the man came out of his bedroom, the man had a gun, Brad ran for the gun and they were wrestling over the gun.

~~He states that when he walked in the house after he heard a shot the man was naked and still alive.~~

He states he did not hear the man say anything nor did he hear Brad say anything to the man.

He states that they all left for LA except for "Moon and Uncle Allen". They showed up the next day when they all met at a campground in GA.

He stated that "Moon" went over to Mr. Elliott's house the day of the murder.

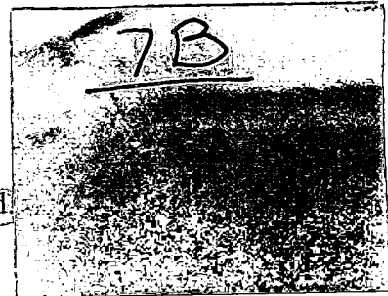

The projectile traversed the head in a left to right and anterior direction at approximately 20 degrees showing an exit site through the skull above the right eye. A partially flattened, jacketed projectile was recovered from the subcutaneous tissues above the right eye. There were associated calvarial fractures radiating from the are of the entrance site.

The second projectile penetrated the right chest and traversed the body in a right to left direction penetrating rib space rib 3-4 in the posterior axillary line the lateral aspect of the vertebral column at rib space T4. Vertebral column segments were removed but a discrete projectile was not recovered. Additional examination revealed extensive decompositional changes.

Toxicologic evaluation revealed a blood ethanol of 43 mg/dL (.04 gm%) and a blood drug screen was negative.

In summary, this 68-year-old Caucasian male died as the result of multiple gunshot wounds, the most significant being the gunshot wound to the left head. The wound to the chest was significant; however, due to the degree of decomposition, I was unable to discern the extent of damage to visceral organs. The manner of death based upon this evaluation and current information from investigative authorities is homicide.

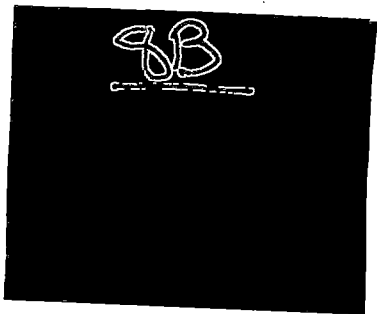

I was able to collect two DNA blood swabs from the heart for a DNA profile and examination. I cleared the autopsy at 0915 hours.

On the 26th day of September 2008, at approximately 2300 hours, this Investigator along with Detectives N. Livingston and R. Crocker executed a search warrant for room 1202 at Waters Gate Resort in the Garden City section of Horry County. Entry was made into the apartment utilizing a key obtained from security personnel at the resort. Photographs were taken upon entering the residence. There were two bedrooms, one being located on the south side of the residence and the other on the north side of the residence. A long hallway ended at the kitchen/living room area. There was a porch located on the east side of the residence. The entire residence was trashed with clothing being scattered around in the bedroom on south side of the residence and food being left out in the kitchen of the apartment. A search of the residence produced two copies of an arrest warrant for John Anderson for Simple Assault and Battery. This arrest warrant was obtained from the table located in the living room of the apartment. Located in the bedroom on the north side of the apartment was an incident report involving James Anderson as the victim of an Assault and Battery with John Anderson as the suspect also located in the same room, under the mattress of the bed was a small metal "crack" pipe. Both of these items were collected. The entire apartment was searched and photographed with no other items collected as evidence.

I have been a certified Correctional Officer for 13 years, and worked in the Office of the Disciplinary Officer for 10 years serving as Council Substitute, and have never witnessed Mr. Mullins being anything but the ideal inmate. Polite, obedient, and a full time horticultural worker, who puts in 40 hours a week working on the landscape here at Perry Correctional. He is assigned tasks and completes them. Because he lives in and participates in the Character Based Living Unit, Mr. Mullins is a Mentor to other men in the program (he has been in it since 2014). He also participates in a support group for fellow inmates, and also works in the prestigious Dog Training Program (on site from Healing Species in Orangeburg) and the specialized bee keeping program.

Most of my day is spend with the small burdensome population who thrive on stealing, moving drugs and contraband, and endangering the lives of the other inmates, the staff at Perry Correctional, and public at large. He record has no disciplinary actions of any sort, and that is very rare, and I know he earned the respect of the staff and fellow inmates. A Correctional Facility like Perry would go out of business if filled with people like Brad. And that would be a great thing.
