
STATEMENT OF ISSUES PURSUANT TO RULE 410

- I. The Defendant's guilty plea was not knowingly or voluntarily entered because he did not adequately understand or was not adequately informed of:
- a. the nature of the charges;
 - b. that he was waiving significant constitutional rights by pleading guilty;
 - c. the collateral consequences of the plea;
 - d. or the potential sentence he could receive.

Had the Defendant fully understood or been fully informed of the aforementioned, he would not have pled guilty and instead would have proceeded to trial. *See generally Boykin v. Alabama*, 395 U.S. 238 (1969); *United States v. Ruiz*, 536 U.S. 622, 628 (2002); *Mabry v. Johnson*, 467 U.S. 504, 507 (1984).

- II. The Defendant's guilty plea was not knowingly or voluntarily entered because of material defects in the plea colloquy. *See generally Boykin*, 395 U.S. at 241; *State v. Armstrong*, 263 S.C. 594, 598, 211 S.E.2d 889, 891 (1975).
