## ORDER

---

This appeal was dismissed on November 2, 2018. No petition for rehearing was filed as of November 20, 2018, and this Court sent down the remittitur on that day. Appellants have now filed a motion requesting that this court recall the remittitur and reinstate the appeal. A remittitur cannot be recalled except upon "a very strong showing . . . that remittitur was sent down through some mistake or inadvertence on the part of this Court or its officer." *State v. Keels*, 39 S.C. 553, 17 S.E. 802 (1893). Appellants have failed to make such a showing. Because Appellants

failed to timely file a petition for rehearing with this Court, remittitur was properly sent, and this Court no longer has jurisdiction over the case. Appellants' motion, therefore, is denied.
