**CONSENT MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION TO FILE  
INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER**

Pursuant to Rule 263(b), SCACR, Appellant General T. Little, by and through the undersigned attorneys, with the State's consent, respectfully requests a 30-day extension of the December 19, 2018 deadline by which he must file an Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter with the Court in the above-captioned case.

The Court appointed the undersigned counsel as lead counsel for Appellant in an Order dated September 18, 2018, and counsel immediately had to request an extension because of the quick turnaround for the deadline to file an initial brief and designation of matter. On November 14, 2018, the undersigned counsel filed a second extension request seeking an extension until January given the voluminous record from the trial of this matter. The Court issued an Order granting an extension until December 19, 2018. Accordingly, this is the third request for an extension in this matter. The State has graciously consented to all extension requests. Although




