

Plaintiffs in Richland Case 4900 moved this Court for an Order compelling the Defendant to produce certain documents identified in her discovery, including approximately 139 bankers boxes of documents and an undetermined number of compact disks containing electronically stored documents. A hearing was held on the motion on February 6, 2017, at which time all parties were heard. After having considered the arguments, the Court rules as follows: (1) Defendant shall produce the compact disks to plaintiff's counsel within ten (10) days, and plaintiff's counsel will have ten (10) days to duplicate the compact disks and return them; (2) The week of May 1, 2017 Defendant will make available at her office the approximately 139 bankers boxes of documents identified in her discovery. Counsel for both parties will review each document to determine whether the document is relevant or contains privileged information; and Defendant will prepare a privilege log concerning any documents over which she claims any privilege. The documents will then be made available for copying at Armfields School Supply in Whitmire, South Carolina. Should one week not be sufficient for the review contemplated in this Order, the plaintiffs will notify the Court early in the review process and seek guidance as to the enlargement of time for the review.
