

ORDER

Appellant has filed a notice of appeal from an order of the Administrative Law Court, which remanded the case to Respondent for a new hearing regarding Appellant's inmate grievance. Respondent has filed a motion to dismiss, arguing the underlying order is not immediately appealable. After consideration, Respondent's motion is granted and this appeal is dismissed. *See Charlotte-Mecklenburg Hospital Authority v. South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control*, 387 S.C. 265, 267, 692 S.E.2d 894, 895 (2010) (dismissing an appeal from an order of the Administrative Law Court, which remanded the case to the Department of Health and Environmental Control for a final determination regarding a certificate of need, because the order was "not a final decision which is immediately appealable under [section 1-23-610 [of the South Carolina Code (Supp. 2012)]").
