MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME  
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT  
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

---

Counsel for Eric Emanuel English respectfully requests a **fourth and final thirty (30) day extension, until February 19, 2019**, in which to file the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the above-referenced case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in this case are due to be served and filed with the Court today. The Court has granted counsel three previous extensions.
2. Counsel for Eric Emanuel English respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the

number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage her caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.

3. Counsel filed the return to petition for writ of certiorari in the case of Christopher Middleton v. The State with the Supreme Court on January 14, 2019. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Antoine Lakida Hightower with this Court on January 9, 2019. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari with the accompanying appendix in the case of Raymond Powell v. The State with the Supreme Court on January 7, 2019. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari with the accompanying appendix in the case of William Richard Greene v. The State with the Supreme Court on January 3, 2019. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari with the accompanying appendix in the case of Doni Terrelle Anderson v. The State with the Supreme Court on December 28, 2018. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari with the accompanying appendix in the case of James L. Moore v. The State with the Supreme Court on December 13, 2018. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of In the Matter of the Care and Treatment of Robert Powell with this Court on November 28, 2018. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari with the accompanying appendix in the case of Joshua A. Reed v. The State with the Supreme Court on November 26, 2018. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Terrance L. Bland with this Court on November 16, 2018. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of In the Interest of Zahi H., a Juvenile Under the Age of Seventeen with this Court on November 16, 2018.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload

will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request shown by signature below.

WHEREFORE, the undersigned counsel would respectfully request a **fourth and final thirty (30) day extension until February 19, 2019**, in which to file the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in this case based upon the above exigent circumstances. Counsel requests that the time limits for filing the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter be held in abeyance pending a ruling on this motion.




