**MOTION FOR THIRD EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE
INITIAL BRIEF OF RESPONDENT AND
DESIGNATION OF MATTER**

The undersigned counsel would respectfully request a short, **seven (7) day extension** in which to file the Initial Brief of Respondent in the above-referenced case. In support of this motion, counsel would respectfully show the Court the following:

1. Respondent's Initial Brief is due today, February 1, 2019, upon this Court's grant of Respondent's second request for an extension filed on January 2, 2019.
2. The undersigned attorney for Respondent has had a number of state and federal matters to attend since January 2, 2019, several of those matters being in capital case litigation. Specifically, Respondent notes: Counsel prepared and submitted a Motion to Lift Stay, and a reply in to the opposition to lift the stay in Stephen Corey Bryant v. Sterling, C/A No. 9:16-1423-DCN-BM, a capital federal habeas action; prepared and submitted a Memorandum in Support of Unsealing Ex Parte Funding Matters in Mikal D. Mahdi v. Stirling, C/A No. 8:16-3911-TMC-

BM, another capital case in federal habeas; prepared and filed a status report in another capital habeas action, Bayan Aleksey v. Stirling, C/A No. 5:14-cv-03016-JMC-KDW; prepared for and attended a motion hearing on the State's motion to dismiss in a capital state successive PCR action, and also is working on drafting a proposed order granting the motion to dismiss which is due on Monday, February 4, 2019, Bobby Wayne Stone v. State, C/A No. 2018-CP-43-1025; received and review the report of the Magistrate in another capital case in federal habeas, Steven Bixby v. Stirling, C/A No. 4:17-cv-00954-BHH; received and review an opinion in another capital case in federal habeas, Williams v. Stirling, No. 18-2, 2019 WL 332975 (4th Cir. Jan. 28, 2019); is currently working on a response in opposition to a Rule 59 motion due to be filed today in a capital state successive PCR action, Stephen Corey Bryant v. State, C/A No. 2016-CP-43-828; and, has been working on a proposed order of dismissal in another capital state PCR action, Jerry Buck Inman v. State, C/A No.: 2012-CP-39-918, which was originally due on January 22, 2019, and has been extended to March 11, 2019; and, has reviewed discovery matters in another capital state PCR action, Ricky Lee Blackwell, v. State, C/A No. 2018-CP-42-00928. Counsel also had to travel to Richmond, Virginia on January 28, 2019 to appear before the United States Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals on January 29, 2019 for a hearing in Broderick William Seay, Jr. v. Sheriff Al Cannon, a non-capital federal habeas action, C/A No. 18-7242. Additionally, counsel has pending the Initial Brief of Respondent in the matter of State v. Tommy Lee Benton, Appellate Case No. 2017-002553; and has been making some progress on that briefing, in addition to counsel's supervisory duties for the unit's seven (7) other attorneys, which includes consultation and editing of various other pleadings and briefs filed within the last month. Counsel has also been working on the brief in this matter, and has substantially

completed the brief. With a few minor adjustments, the brief will be ready for filing. Thus, counsel is only requesting a limited amount of time to properly complete and submit the brief.

3. Due to counsel's involvement in the above listed matters, and her supervisory duties for the unit, counsel was unable to timely complete the Initial Brief of Respondent in this proceeding. However, as noted, counsel has been working on the brief, and the brief is substantially completed.

4. This limited request is made in good faith, and not for the purposes of delay.

5. Respondent has consulted with Assistant Appellate Defender Taylor D. Gilliam on behalf of opposing counsel, Assistant Appellate Defender David Alexander, who has graciously consented to this request.

WHEREFORE, in light of the foregoing, counsel for Respondent respectfully requests a seven (7) day extension of time to serve and file the Initial Brief of Respondent and Designation of Matter.




