MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI AND APPENDIX

Counsel for Adonis K. Williams respectfully requests a **final thirty (30) day extension, until March 11, 2019**, in which to file the Petition for Writ of Certiorari and Appendix in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a third request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The Petition for Writ of Certiorari and Appendix are due to be served and filed with the Court today. The Court has granted counsel two previous extensions.

2. Counsel for Adonis K. Williams respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the

Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Leon M. Davis v. The State of South Carolina with the Supreme Court on January 11, 2019. Counsel filed the Anders brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State of South Carolina v. Jarod Tarrell Bostick with the Court of Appeals on January 7, 2019. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of John Fitzgerald Kennedy v. The State of South Carolina with the Supreme Court on December 31, 2018. Counsel filed the brief of petitioner in the case of Kristopher Wilmont Berry v. The State of South Carolina with the Supreme Court on December 14, 2018. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Tarus Tramaine Henry, Sr. v. The State of South Carolina with the Supreme Court on December 12, 2018. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari


and accompanying appendix in the case of Anthony G. Linton v. The State of South Carolina with the Supreme Court on December 11, 2018.


