MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE

MEMORANDUM IN SUPPORT

1. Appellants William HELLwood, aka Elk of The Wood is a 68 year old man, a Layman with a medical issue, not an Esquire, herein requests an extension of time to file his appeal.

Jenkins v. McKeithen, 395 U.S. 411, 421 (1959); Picking v. Pennsylvania R. Co., 151 Fed 2nd 240; Pucket v. Cox, 456 2nd 233

Pro se pleadings are to be considered without regard to technicality; pro se litigants' pleadings are not to be held to the same high standards of perfection as lawyers.

Puckett v. Cox, 456 F. 2d 233 (1972) (6th Cir. USCA)

It was held that a pro se complaint requires a less stringent reading than one drafted by a lawyer per Justice Black in Conley v. Gibson (see case listed above, Pro Se Rights Section).


2. Appellants are without Counsel, so far, unable to find an Attorney that will take an interest in this Appeal.

3. Appellants have been unable to find an Attorney with knowledge of the issues brought in the lower court, to be raised on Appeal.

4. Appellants are poor, sustaining on \$ 660.00 notes per month Social Security benefits, with no funds available to retain an Attorney as Counsel in this Action, also involved in a Medical action.
5. Appellants are at complete disadvantage, as Appellant currently lives some 70 miles from the court, in an undeveloped wooded area, without electric power, running water, or reliable cell phone or internet access, needed to continue research to raise proper elements on Appeal.
6. Appellants are currently seeking donations to cover the fees for the Transcription of the Trial record Estimated to be \$1215.00 notes and cover the \$250.00 notes filing fees in the Appeal Court. *Sherar v. Cullen, 481 F. 2d 946 (1973) "There can be no sanction or penalty imposed upon one because of his exercise of Constitutional Rights."*
7. Appellant is currently still researching to understand the complex Rules of Appeal and researching additional law that supports his position accreted in the lower court and to write his appeal.
8. Appellant would seek the court to direct the Appellant to an Attorney or Law firm that does Pro Bono work competent in the area of Negotiable Instruments Law, Uniform Commercial Code, South Carolina Commercial Code
9. Appellant request a 90 day extension of time to accomplish the above stated matters.
