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1 THE COURT: Thank you. Please take your seats. Y'all  
2 need a little time to look over the list? I'm not rushing  
3 you. Take whatever time you need.

4 MR. FLORES: Thank you, Your Honor.

5 (Pause)

6 MS. WIYGUL: Your Honor, just to bring to the Court's  
7 attention, apparently the transport van is in the shop. So  
8 the Detention Center is working on getting Mr. Markham and  
9 Mr. Darnell over to the courthouse.

10 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you.

11 (Pause)

12 (Whereupon Plaintiff's exhibits 1 - 4 were marked for  
13 identification)

14 (Whereupon Defendant's exhibit 1 was marked for  
15 identification)

16 MR. FLORES: Your Honor, we agree as far as voir dire  
17 to strike question two from the Petitioner's list as we did  
18 in Monday's trial.

19 THE COURT: Okay.

20 MS. WIYGUL: And, Your Honor, I believe you should have  
21 the proposed jury instructions from both of us.

22 THE COURT: Same as before?

23 MS. WIYGUL: Yes, Your Honor.

24 MR. FLORES: Yes, sir.

25 (Whereupon court was in recess at 9:14 am)

1 (Whereupon court resumed at 9:32 am)

2 THE COURT: If I could interrupt just a minute. I want  
3 to make sure we're on the right wavelength. On the first  
4 jury we're not getting an alternate, the one we're starting  
5 today?

6 MS. WIYGUL: I don't believe we ---

7 THE COURT: And on the ---

8 MS. WIYGUL: --- need one.

9 THE COURT: --- second one we are getting an alternate?

10 MS. WIYGUL: Yes, Your Honor.

11 MR. FLORES: Yes, sir.

12 THE COURT: All right. Thank you. I didn't mean to  
13 interrupt you.

14 (Pause)

15 (Whereupon the jury panel entered the courtroom at 9:34  
16 am)

17 THE COURT: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen. We now  
18 need to select a jury for the next trial we have this week.  
19 Again, I need to ask you some additional questions in  
20 addition to those that I qualified you under on Monday.

21 This is a case brought by the State of South Carolina  
22 captioned In the Matter of the Care and Treatment of Quentin  
23 Dale Markham. The State in this case has filed a petition  
24 alleging that the Respondent is a sexually violent predator  
25 and seeks to have the Respondent involuntarily committed to

1 a secure facility for long-term control, care and treatment.  
2 Mr. Markham has denied those allegations. And we're going  
3 to have a trial to determine what the facts are.

4 I'm going to judge the law in this case. I'll instruct  
5 the jury as to the law. I need to qualify twelve fair and  
6 impartial jurors to hear the facts and to become the judges  
7 of the facts in this case.

8 First of all, I need to ask you, is there any member of  
9 the jury panel related by blood or marriage to Mr. Quentin  
10 Dale Markham? If so, would you please stand.

11 (No response)

12 **THE COURT:** Is there any member of the jury panel who  
13 has a close business or a social or personal relationship  
14 with Mr. Markham? If so, would you please stand.

15 (No response)

16 **THE COURT:** Thank you. There is no response.

17 Several witnesses may be called upon to testify in this  
18 case. Among those witnesses would be Belinda Crocker,  
19 Captain Jinny Moran, Vincent John Jacob, George VanHook, Dr.  
20 L. William Mulbry, Dr. Rebecca Jackson. Is there any member  
21 of the jury panel related by blood or marriage to any of  
22 these potential witnesses? If so, would you please stand.

23 (No response)

24 **THE COURT:** Is there any member of the jury panel have  
25 a close business, a social or been a patient or treated by

1 any of the doctors or other witnesses? If you have a social  
2 relationship or a business relationship with any of them,  
3 would you please stand?

4 (No response)

5 **THE COURT:** Thank you. There is no response.

6 This is a case in which evidence may show that --  
7 likely will show that Mr. Markham has been convicted in the  
8 past of a sexual offense. He's completed his criminal  
9 sentence related to that conviction. Would that in any way  
10 affect your ability to be a fair and impartial juror in this  
11 case hearing that evidence?

12 (No response)

13 **THE COURT:** Thank you. There is no response.

14 Is there any member of the jury panel who has training,  
15 or experience, or currently or formerly working in the field  
16 of psychiatry, or psychology or law? If you have training  
17 in any of those fields or working in any of those fields,  
18 you or a member of your immediate family, would you please  
19 stand. Yes, ma'am, your name, please.

20 **MS. TIPTON:** Cindy Tipton.

21 **THE COURT:** All right. And what ---

22 **MS. TIPTON:** Psychiatric nurse for five years.

23 **THE COURT:** All right. And if you'd remain standing  
24 just a moment. And your name, please, sir.

25 **MR. GALBREATH:** Nathan Galbreath.

1 THE COURT: All right.

2 MR. GALBREATH: Good morning, Your Honor. I'm a  
3 lawyer.

4 THE COURT: All right. Thank you. Thank you very  
5 much. You may be seated.

6 Is there any member of the jury panel, yourself or a  
7 member of your immediate family, ever been accused or  
8 convicted of a sexual offense or ever been the victim of a  
9 sexual offense? If you or a member of your family have ever  
10 been accused or a victim, would you please stand.

11 (No response)

12 THE COURT: Thank you. There is no response.

13 Is there any member of the jury panel involved now or  
14 in the past been involved in any prison ministry, an  
15 outreach program or any program involving incarcerated  
16 persons? If you now or in the past have been a part of that  
17 organization, would you please stand. Yes, sir, your name,  
18 please.

19 MR. LEMMONS: Bobby Lemmons.

20 THE COURT: All right. And what nature of the outreach  
21 did you have?

22 MR. LEMMONS: Prison ministry through my church.

23 THE COURT: All right. Thank you very much, sir. You  
24 may be seated.

25 Is there any member of the jury panel or a member of

1 your immediate family ever been involved in a civil  
2 commitment proceeding, either a civil commitment against you  
3 or you on behalf of others sought to have someone civilly  
4 committed through probate court or otherwise? If you or a  
5 member of your immediate family have ever been involved in  
6 that in any capacity, would you please stand.

7 (No response)

8 **THE COURT:** Thank you. There is no response.

9 At this time I'll have the attorneys stand and  
10 introduce themselves, if you would, please. Mr. Flores.

11 **MR. FLORES:** Thank you, Your Honor. My name is Lloyd  
12 Flores. And I work for the Office of the Attorney General.

13 **THE COURT:** Ms. Wiygul.

14 **MS. WIYGUL:** My name is Elizabeth Wiygul. I practice  
15 law in Greenville. Sitting with me is Stuart Sarratt, who  
16 practices law in Greenville also.

17 **THE COURT:** Thank you. Is there any member of the jury  
18 panel related by blood or marriage to either of these  
19 attorneys? If so, would you please stand.

20 (No response)

21 **THE COURT:** Is there any member of the jury panel have  
22 a close business, or a social or a personal relationship  
23 with any of these attorneys? If so, would you please stand.

24 (No response)

25 **THE COURT:** Is there any member of the jury panel ever

1 been involved in any litigation in which either of these  
2 attorneys represented you or represented the opposing side?  
3 If so, would you please stand.

4 (No response)

5 **THE COURT:** Thank you. There is no response.

6 Is there any member of the jury panel formed or  
7 expressed an opinion in any way about the facts in this  
8 case? If so, would you please stand.

9 (No response)

10 **THE COURT:** Is there any member of the jury panel aware  
11 of any bias or prejudice that would interfere with your  
12 ability to be a fair and impartial juror if you were  
13 selected in this case? If so, would you please stand.

14 (No response)

15 **THE COURT:** ~~The State of South Carolina and Mr. Markham~~  
16 in this case, the Respondent, they desire to have fair and  
17 impartial jurors to hear this case to determine the facts of  
18 the case and to render a verdict that would speak the truth.  
19 That's their desire and that's what they deserve.

20 Is there any member of the jury panel, if you've been  
21 -- in response to any of the questions I've asked or  
22 otherwise, if you are aware of any reason whatsoever that  
23 you believe you could not be a fair juror in this case,  
24 render a verdict that would speak the truth on the evidence  
25 presented and the law that I give you and that alone, if you

1 feel you could not be a fair juror in this case, would you  
2 please stand.

3 (No response)

4 THE COURT: Thank you. There is no response. Any  
5 other questions from the State?

6 MR. FLORES: Nothing from the State, Your Honor.

7 THE COURT: From the Respondent?

8 MS. WIYGUL: Nothing from Respondent, Your Honor.

9 THE COURT: All right. Let's select a jury.

10 MADAME CLERK: Petitioner goes first.

11 MR. FLORES: Petitioner would strike juror number 5.

12 MADAME CLERK: Petitioner strikes 5.

13 MS. WIYGUL: Respondent strikes 7.

14 MADAME CLERK: Respondent strikes 7.

15 MR. FLORES: Petitioner strikes 10.

16 MADAME CLERK: Petitioner strikes 10.

17 MS. WIYGUL: Respondent strikes 18.

18 MADAME CLERK: Respondent strikes 18.

19 MR. FLORES: Petitioner strikes 14.

20 MADAME CLERK: Petitioner strikes 14.

21 MS. WIYGUL: Respondent strikes 19.

22 MADAME CLERK: Respondent strikes 19.

23 MR. FLORES: Petitioner strikes 1.

24 MADAME CLERK: Petitioner strikes 1.

25 MS. WIYGUL: Respondent strikes 23.

1 THE COURT: We're doing 1 through 20, please.

2 MS. WIYGUL: Respondent strikes 12.

3 MADAME CLERK: Respondent strikes 12. Now I'll read  
4 these back to you. Petitioner strikes 1, 5, 10 and 14.

5 MR. FLORES: That's correct.

6 MADAME CLERK: Respondent strikes 7, 12, 18 and 19.

7 MS. WIYGUL: That's correct.

8 THE COURT: All right. Call our jury.

9 MADAME CLERK: As I call your name, if you would please  
10 bring your things and come up and have a seat in our jury  
11 box. Terry Basinger, Frances Cox, Ann Mann, Michael Doyle,  
12 Bobby Lemmons, Warren White, Cindy Tipton, Anne Elidemir,  
13 Karl Oswald, David Clark, Raymond Thompson and Sheila  
14 Garren.

15 THE COURT: Any matters we need to take care of as far  
16 as the selection of the jury in this case, from the State?

17 MR. FLORES: Nothing, Your Honor.

18 THE COURT: From Respondent?

19 MS. WIYGUL: Nothing from Respondent, Your Honor.

20 THE COURT: Thank you very much. Ladies and gentlemen,  
21 I'm going to ask you, if you would, to please go back to the  
22 jury room at this time. Don't discuss the case in any way.  
23 I'll call you back in just a few moments. We'll be ready to  
24 start the trial. If you'll go with Mr. Lynch at this time  
25 back to your jury room.

1 (Whereupon the jury exited the courtroom at 9:50 am)

2 **THE COURT:** Ladies and gentlemen who were not selected  
3 for the trial of this case, I hope you were not  
4 disappointed. We're going to be selecting another jury in  
5 just a few moments.

6 I'm going to let you, if you would, please, go back  
7 downstairs to the assembly room. There's some matters we  
8 need to take care of. I would say in twenty minutes we'll  
9 have you back up here, and I'll need to qualify you to pick  
10 a jury for the next case. So if you'll just go with Mr.  
11 Frazier back downstairs, we'll call you back in twenty  
12 minutes or so and need your services again. Thank you.

13 (Whereupon the remaining jurors exited the courtroom)

14 **THE COURT:** All right. We'll be at ease until -- Judy  
15 will be giving us another mix.

16 (Whereupon court was in recess at 9:52 am)

17 (Whereupon court resumed at 10:58 am)

18 **THE COURT:** You ready to proceed?

19 **MR. FLORES:** Yes, Your Honor.

20 **MS. WIYGUL:** Yes, Your Honor.

21 **THE COURT:** Okay. If our jury's ready, have them come  
22 in.

23 (Whereupon the jury entered the courtroom at 10:59 am)

24 **THE COURT:** All right, ladies and gentlemen. Thank you  
25 for being patient with us. As you were back there we were

1 selecting another jury for another case that'll start later.  
2 But we're now ready to proceed with this case.

3 Some of you have had an opportunity to serve as a juror  
4 before this week or at other times. Some of you have not.  
5 Let me just briefly tell you a little bit about the process  
6 we'll be having here.

7 The attorneys will be making an opening statement to  
8 you in a few moments. They'll give you an overview of what  
9 the case is about. Then they'll have witnesses to come and  
10 testify. Your job is to evaluate those witnesses, to  
11 determine the credibility of those witnesses, to determine  
12 the truthfulness of the evidence that's presented.

13 After all the evidence is in, then, of course, I'll  
14 instruct you on the law. The case will then be yours to  
15 decide. And certainly you should not be discussing it  
16 before then.

17 Part of my job in addition to ruling on the law and  
18 instructing you on the law is to conduct the trial. And  
19 we're going to take periodic breaks as the case develops.

20 If anytime you need to take a break and I haven't  
21 called for a break, please get my attention, let one of the  
22 bailiffs know. Mr. Lynch to your right, Mr. Frazier in the  
23 back or any of the folks here at the desk. Ms. Jones, or  
24 Ms. White or Ms. Susan Hudgins is the court reporter  
25 directly in front of me. And she'll certainly -- any of

1 these ladies will certainly help you get my attention.

2 You need to be a good listener, obviously. If you're  
3 uncomfortable in any way, need a break, then, please let me  
4 know that so we can take that break.

5 The clerk is going to administer an oath to you to  
6 swear you in for service on this case. I urge you to listen  
7 carefully as this oath is given to you. After the oath is  
8 given, then the attorneys will address you in their opening  
9 statement. Ms. Jones, you may swear the jury at this time.

10 **MADAME CLERK:** If you'll please rise and raise your  
11 right hand. You shall well and truly try case number 2010-  
12 CP-23-9806 in the Matter of the Care and Treatment of  
13 Quentin Dale Markham and a true verdict rendered according  
14 to the law and the evidence so help you God. The correct  
15 response is, I will.

16 **THE JURY:** I will.

17 **MADAME CLERK:** Thank you. You may be seated.

18 **THE COURT:** You may make your opening statement, Mr.  
19 Flores.

20 **MR. FLORES:** Thank you, Your Honor. May it please the  
21 Court.

22 **THE COURT:** Yes, sir.

23 **MR. FLORES:** Good morning, ladies and gentlemen. As I  
24 introduced myself earlier, my name is Lloyd Flores. I work  
25 in the Office of the Attorney General.

1           This case is brought pursuant to the Sexually Violent  
2 Predator Act. The State believes this case is about the  
3 protection of the citizens of this County and of this State.

4           Before I start discussing this case I do wish to at  
5 least disclaim that the details of this case, the underlying  
6 sexually violent offenses are not very pleasant to hear  
7 about. However, we trust in our jury system to listen to  
8 the facts, all of the facts concerning these cases and  
9 render a verdict that's proper for both the State and Mr.  
10 Markham.

11           Now the Sexually Violent Predator Act was passed by our  
12 Legislature around the year 1998. So it's been around for  
13 about fourteen years.

14           The Legislature had two thoughts in mind when they  
15 passed this Act. The first was that there are individuals  
16 that live within our State that suffer from mental  
17 abnormalities and/or personality disorders that make them  
18 more likely to commit acts of sexual violence. The second  
19 reason is that these individuals need treatment in a secure  
20 facility to protect the public during the treatment process  
21 because they are extremely dangerous individuals.

22           The State believes in this case that Mr. Quentin Dale  
23 Markham is a sexually violent predator. The statute defines  
24 a sexually violent predator as a person -- it has two  
25 requirements. First, that the individual has been convicted

1 of a sexually violent offense. The second requirement is  
2 that the individual must suffer from a mental abnormality or  
3 personality disorder that makes them more likely to commit  
4 acts -- an act of sexual violence if not confined in a  
5 facility, a secure facility for long-term control, care and  
6 treatment.

7 These two things -- these two things the State must  
8 prove beyond a reasonable doubt, that he's been convicted of  
9 a sexually violent offense and that he suffers from a mental  
10 abnormality or personality disorder that makes him more  
11 likely to commit these types of sexually violent offenses.

12 To that end, today, we will present testimony  
13 concerning these sexually violent offenses. He has been  
14 convicted of four separate sexually violent offenses,  
15 including young girls, all under the age of four, four  
16 separate victims. You will learn the details about these  
17 victims, how they occurred, when they occurred.

18 The Act also requires that we show he has a mental  
19 abnormality that would make him more likely to do this.  
20 Today you will hear testimony presented from the State  
21 through a psychiatrist, Dr. William Mulbry, sitting here on  
22 the front row.

23 He will testify that he has diagnosed Mr. Markham with  
24 pedophilia. Dr. Mulbry will explain what that condition is.  
25 He will also explain how he believes that affects his

1 likelihood to re-offend. There are other things you will  
2 hear about concerning Mr. Markham's medical condition, his  
3 past history, that all tied together prove Dr. Mulbry's  
4 opinion in this matter.

5 You will also hear testimony today from a doctor who's  
6 a psychologist who also evaluated Mr. Markham in this case,  
7 Dr. Rebecca Jackson. She also diagnoses Mr. Markham as a  
8 pedophile. She opines that he is not likely to re-offend.

9 And so that question will be presented to you, the  
10 diagnosis, the risks, everything you learn for you to  
11 determine amongst yourselves whether you believe beyond a  
12 reasonable doubt that he does suffer from a mental  
13 abnormality that makes him more likely to commit these acts  
14 of sexual violence.

15 I ask that you listen to all the evidence, and the  
16 evidence that the State presents, all the evidence that Mr.  
17 Markham presents. The State believes that once you've heard  
18 everything you will find that Mr. Markham is a sexually  
19 violent predator beyond a reasonable doubt. He needs  
20 treatment in a controlled environment in the Department of  
21 Mental Health. Thank you.

22 **MS. WIYGUL:** This is Dale Markham. And he's dying.  
23 He's forty-one years old. He suffers from end-stage renal  
24 failure. He was born with one kidney. His other kidney has  
25 shut down. He has to have dialysis three times a week.

1           He has congenital heart failure. That condition has  
2    exacerbated by the renal failure. They feed off each other.  
3    He's dying. And he wants to go home to do it.

4           He pled guilty to four separate counts. That's true.  
5    He pled guilty to every single one of them during one guilty  
6    plea. On January 11th of 2005 he stood before a judge and  
7    he admitted his guilt. And he was sentenced by that judge.  
8    And he has been incarcerated ever since. Now he's completed  
9    his sentence, and the State doesn't want to let him go home.

10           You're going to hear from a doctor that was hired by  
11   the State to evaluate Mr. Markham after he'd been evaluated  
12   by a chief psychologist at the Department of Mental Health  
13   because the chief psychologist at the Department of Mental  
14   Health at the time, Dr. Rebecca Jackson, said that Mr.  
15   Markham did not belong in that program. He just didn't  
16   belong there. There are people that do belong there and Mr.  
17   Markham is not one of them.

18           We ask that you keep that in mind that this isn't a  
19   matter of smacking someone on the wrist or fining them.  
20   This is someone's liberty we're talking about. This is a  
21   trial to determine whether Mr. Markham stays locked up or  
22   whether he's permitted to go home.

23           You're going to hear details about his medical  
24   condition. The State's going to make sure you hear details  
25   about what he pled guilty to. But you need to keep in mind,

1 Mr. Markham's already been punished for what he did. A  
2 general sessions judge heard the details of these cases,  
3 determined the appropriate sentence and sent him to jail in  
4 January of 2005.

5 You're going to hear that while he was at the  
6 Department of Corrections Mr. Markham could not participate  
7 in sex offender treatment because he had to be housed on a  
8 special medical unit in order to receive his dialysis  
9 treatments and the other treatments that he requires all the  
10 time. You're going to hear that he was rushed to the ICU  
11 last week. His family thought that was it then and luckily  
12 it was not. They were able to save him.

13 The word pedophile is a scary word. It makes me  
14 cringe. It makes most people cringe. It's the boogey man  
15 of our modern society. But I ask you not to just be swayed  
16 by that just automatic response to that word. I ask you to  
17 look at Dale as a human being.

18 I ask you to take into careful consideration the fact  
19 that he admitted his guilt and that he's already been  
20 punished for it by the State. We're going to ask that you  
21 find that Dale Markham is not a sexually violent predator  
22 and let him go home to his family.

23 **THE COURT:** Mr. Flores, you may call your first  
24 witness.

25 **MR. FLORES:** Thank you, Your Honor. The State would

1 call Dr. William Mulbry.

2 MADAME CLERK: If you'll please place your left hand on  
3 the Bible and raise your right hand, please, sir.

4 Leonard W. Mulbry, JR., M.D.,  
5 being duly sworn testified as follows:

6 MADAME CLERK: Please state your name for the record.

7 DR. MULBRY: Leonard William Mulbry, Jr.

8 MADAME CLERK: Thank you. You may be seated.

9 Direct Examination by Mr. Flores:

10 Q. Good morning, Dr. Mulbry.

11 A. Good morning.

12 Q. Could you describe for the jury how you are currently  
13 employed?

14 A. I'm employed by the section of forensic psychiatry at  
15 the Medical University of South Carolina where I work with  
16 others in the sexual behaviors lab.

17 Q. And could you describe what professional degrees you  
18 possess?

19 A. I have a master's degree of -- I have a bachelor of  
20 science, a master's degree in pharmacology. I'm an M.D. I  
21 trained in another field of medicine. So I have a --  
22 actually have a degree in orthopaedics and in hand and  
23 microsurgery.

24 I retrained. So I have a degree in -- I have a  
25 residency in psychiatry. And I have a fellowship in

1 forensic psychiatry.

2 Q. And you said you were a medical doctor. You currently  
3 hold a medical license?

4 A. Yes, sir.

5 Q. Could you briefly describe for the jury what the study  
6 of psychiatry is?

7 A. Psychiatry is mental processes. It's differentiated  
8 from neurology, which really looks at the structure of the  
9 brain as we look at mental illnesses, schizophrenia, mood  
10 disorders, bi-polar disorder, depression. We treat a  
11 constellation of illnesses that are not well understood.

12 Q. And do you have a specialized training in that field of  
13 psychiatry?

14 A. I do. Of course, I have a -- I'm training in general  
15 psychiatry and board certified, but I chose to sub-  
16 specialize. So I did a one year fellowship in forensic  
17 psychiatry, which -- legal psychiatry. And that's a  
18 specialty training. And I'm board certified in that also.

19 Q. Could you describe what forensic psychiatry is briefly?

20 A. It turns out that among medical doctors, psychiatrists  
21 and the law intersect quite a lot. And they have to do with  
22 issues such as whether people are able -- are capable of  
23 going to trial with due to a mental illness or whether  
24 they're criminally responsible, that is, are they -- were  
25 they mentally ill when they committed an offense?

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1           We also look at violence risk assessment. We look at  
2 people who are harmed for civil damages. We look at civil  
3 commitment for people who are mentally ill who need to be in  
4 a hospital. We assist with that. Quite a wide variety of  
5 things, but also a lot of it is to try to best assess risk  
6 for future violence.

7 Q. You mentioned that you're board certified in general  
8 psychiatry and forensic psychiatry. Could you describe what  
9 that means?

10 A. The -- each medical specialty has a board. And each  
11 board comes up with all these rules about what you have to  
12 do to be one of them. And basically it almost always  
13 involves a residency or a number of years of training at a  
14 medical school.

15           It almost invariably involves a test, written and/or  
16 oral. And it almost invariably involves some experience in  
17 the field, that is, going through a period of time to  
18 demonstrate that you know what you're doing before you take  
19 that test.

20 Q. And how long have you been board certified in forensic  
21 psychiatry?

22 A. For four years.

23 Q. Have you previously been recognized as and testified as  
24 an expert witness in the fields of psychiatry and forensic  
25 psychiatry in the courts of law of this State?

1 A. I have.

2 Q. How much of your practice is currently dedicated to  
3 forensic psychiatry?

4 A. A hundred percent.

5 Q. Does your work as a forensic psychiatrist allow you to  
6 conduct forensic psychiatric evaluations?

7 A. It does.

8 Q. And approximately how many individuals have you  
9 evaluated?

10 A. Three hundred, four hundred. Four hundred.

11 Q. And these are not all sexually violent predator type  
12 evaluations?

13 A. No, no. The majority of these would be -- we do a good  
14 bit of work for the Department of Mental Health evaluating  
15 competency to stand trial, that is, people unfortunately get  
16 into the judicial system that have a mental illness. We  
17 have to evaluate whether they're capable of going to trial  
18 and assisting their attorneys. And that's probably the  
19 thing I do the most often.

20 We also do a number of evaluations for whether people  
21 were mentally ill at the time of their offense. Again, that  
22 would be a lot of what we do.

23 I also work in probate court and doing civil  
24 commitments. And that would be probably the majority of  
25 what we do. These are less common. They're just not that

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1 many going on.

2 Q. Doctor, Ms. Wiygul has discussed this already in her  
3 opening statement, but you are hired by the State to conduct  
4 an evaluation in this case, correct?

5 A. I was.

6 Q. Have you ever been hired by someone in Ms. Wiygul's  
7 capacity, as a defense counsel?

8 A. To do defense work for sexual offenses, yes, many, many  
9 times. Not specifically on an SVP case by the defense.

10 Q. About how many of these sexually violent predator cases  
11 have you evaluated?

12 A. About twenty.

13 Q. How many of those did you recommend commitment to a  
14 program, to this program?

15 A. About six.

16 Q. Six.

17 A. Five or six.

18 MR. FLORES: Your Honor, at this time we would offer  
19 Dr. Mulbry as an expert in the field of forensic psychiatry.

20 THE COURT: Any voir dire or any objection?

21 MS. WIYGUL: No, Your Honor.

22 THE COURT: All right. Without objection this witness  
23 may be qualified as an expert in the field of forensic  
24 psychiatry. Ladies and gentlemen, an expert witness is a  
25 witness who because of training and experience in some

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1 profession or art or skill would be allowed to give an  
2 opinion.

3 Most witnesses who testify can't give opinions. They  
4 can talk about what they saw, or heard or sensed in some  
5 way, but an individual who because of that training or  
6 experience is qualified as an expert in the field can give  
7 an opinion, can give the basis of that opinion.

8 The fact that a person is qualified as an expert and is  
9 able to give an opinion doesn't mean that you have to accept  
10 that opinion. That's evidence for you to use in any way you  
11 see fit as all other evidence is in a trial. You may  
12 proceed, Mr. Flores.

13 MR. FLORES: Thank you, Your Honor.

14 Q. Dr. Mulbry, what type of evaluations did you conduct in  
15 this case?

16 A. In this case we did a very structured evaluation we do  
17 fairly regularly. They're done in a certain order, in a  
18 certain way. They have a certain number of tests. It  
19 consists of two half days of evaluations and two half days  
20 of testing. The testing, some of it is done on computers.  
21 And some of it is what we call physiologic testing.

22 Q. And you do use the word we. What do you -- could you  
23 explain ---

24 A. Because ---

25 Q. --- who we are?

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1 A. I'm sorry. The actual testing is done by Dr. Dwyer who  
2 runs the lab. The reason for that is that certain of these  
3 tests require certain types of degree to do them. In other  
4 words, certain tests have to have a person who's qualified  
5 to do them.

6 And that requires either a Ph.D or an Ed, a certain  
7 kind of a degree with an extensive background in statistics.  
8 Without one of those two degrees you're simply not allowed  
9 to give the test. So that in this case Dr. Dwyer, who has  
10 an Ed, actually does the testing and provides the results.

11 Q. Is it common for experts in your field to rely on test  
12 results run by individuals with an Ed or a Ph.D?

13 A. Absolutely.

14 Q. Could you describe for the jury your protocol in  
15 rendering -- in rendering an opinion in these types of  
16 matters?

17 A. The individual would come in, the first half day he  
18 does a computer test. And there's about five of them. They  
19 take about half a day. They used to be done on paper. Now  
20 they're all done on computers.

21 The second half of that -- the second half of that day  
22 I start the interviews. Typically takes about three hours.  
23 That's about the limits of most people's attention and  
24 they'll start getting tired. And so we do about half of the  
25 day of evaluation, about two and a half to three hour

1 interview, typically.

2 They then come back a second day for the physiologic  
3 testing, often known as a PPG. When that testing is  
4 complete we then complete all of the interview the second  
5 half of that day.

6 On the second half of that day we also go over all of  
7 the data that we have obtained. In other words, the person  
8 is given the results of all of the testing that we've done  
9 and we ask what they think about it. Is there a reason why  
10 this response or that response was made?

11 And sometimes they'll say, I don't know, I didn't  
12 understand the question. They'll come up with a reason why.  
13 So we present all of the data that we've learned to them to  
14 get their opinion about why that may have come out that way.

15 Q. And once you've performed the interviews, all these  
16 tests, what do you do next?

17 A. We then -- prior to seeing the individual we've all  
18 reviewed all of the records. The records would consist of  
19 -- amongst of all the materials that were used to convict  
20 them of the original offense, all discovery. We get all of  
21 that.

22 We get most all of the indictments that the court has  
23 put forth. We get the -- all of the information about their  
24 psychiatric history, about their medical records. We get  
25 all of the information from the South Carolina Department of

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1 Corrections, where they've been for the last couple of  
2 years.

3 We then range out. If we find some piece of  
4 information that we feel like we need, if they were ever in  
5 a hospital as a kid, we try to get those records. Anything  
6 that is in any way germane to the opinion, we really try to  
7 track it down and find it and review it. So we've reviewed  
8 all of that material before we even talk to the person.

9 We then talk to -- two days, basically two days of  
10 evaluation. We then sit down and write a report that looks  
11 -- it is an amalgam of all of the information that we've got  
12 from the records and all that we've learned during our two  
13 days of evaluating the individual.

14 Q. Doctor, Ms. Wiygul alluded to this during her opening  
15 statement, but how were you approached to conduct an  
16 evaluation in this case?

17 A. We were approached by the Attorney General's Office.  
18 They asked us. And we've done this a number of times. When  
19 there are recommendations that someone not go into the  
20 program, we are asked to take a look at that, the records  
21 and/or do a full evaluation, to get basically a second  
22 opinion. And we give a second opinion.

23 Sometimes we just do it based on the records.  
24 Sometimes we feel that there's enough concern or we feel  
25 that we need more information. We bring them down for the

1 two days of evaluation.

2 Q. Do you know if the Attorney General asks you to look at  
3 these in every case that's denied by the court appointed  
4 evaluator?

5 A. It's my understanding that they don't, but I don't  
6 know.

7 Q. Doctor, how were you paid to conduct your evaluation in  
8 this case?

9 A. I am an hourly employee of the Medical University of  
10 South Carolina.

11 Q. And how much do you make as a result ---

12 A. Seven hundred -- seven hundred and twenty dollars a  
13 day.

14 Q. Which is roughly how much per hour?

15 A. Ninety dollars an hour.

16 Q. Ninety dollars. Doctor, as far as that evaluation that  
17 you were -- that we've been discussing did you actually --  
18 you did meet with Mr. Markham?

19 A. I did.

20 Q. And would you identify him for the jury?

21 A. Mr. Markham is sitting over ...

22 (Whereupon the witness pointed to the Respondent)

23 MR. FLORES: We would ask that the record reflect that  
24 Dr. Mulbry did identify Mr. Markham.

25 THE COURT: So reflected.

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1 MR. FLORES: Thank you, Your Honor.

2 Q. Now in discussing your protocol you've mentioned that  
3 you sat down with Mr. Markham on two separate occasions for  
4 approximately five hours, but you also stated that you  
5 relied on documents for information. How did you obtain  
6 that information?

7 A. The -- most of it is the material that is forwarded on  
8 from the Attorney General's Office, who, as I understand,  
9 obtains from a variety of sources. But basically they try  
10 to provide us with every piece of information that was  
11 provided to the DMH examiner who made the recommendation  
12 that Mr. Markham not go in the program.

13 The key is that we try to start with a level playing  
14 field. We try to have the same information that that  
15 examiner had. Sometimes there's pieces -- bits and pieces  
16 missing. If we find there's a missing piece, we ask for it  
17 to be obtained. And it's collected into a chart.

18 Q. This information, these legal documents, is this the  
19 type of information that's typically and reasonably relied  
20 upon by other experts in your field?

21 A. It is.

22 Q. At the time of your interview was there anything you  
23 could not obtain?

24 A. No, I don't think so. I think we had pretty much  
25 everything we asked for.

1 Q. And you considered and relied upon all this information  
2 that you just listed and also upon your interview with Mr.  
3 Markham in rendering your opinion in this matter, is that  
4 correct?

5 A. Yes, sir.

6 Q. Doctor, can you explain to the jury how an individual's  
7 past sexual offense behavior relates to his future sexual  
8 offense behavior?

9 A. All future -- predictions of future behavior are based  
10 on -- we use a certain actuarial and certain structured  
11 evaluations to try to determine this. But the basic rule  
12 starts with the best predictor of future behavior is past  
13 behavior. So that's kind of the starting point. How you've  
14 been is the best predictor of what's -- how you're going to  
15 be in the future.

16 So that we start with that sort of as a premise. And  
17 then we do statistic -- there are a number of what we call  
18 -- psychologists call them instruments, but they're  
19 psychological tests, forms that you can fill out,  
20 demographic data that you can look at. And these provide  
21 information about whether or not somebody is likely to be at  
22 risk in the future.

23 There is a whole research field that has to do with  
24 this that looks at the risk of recidivism because obviously  
25 being able to have some sense of it is very, very important

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1 for how you treat people in the future. Much of this comes  
2 from places that determine sentences based on what this  
3 information shows. And it helps guide us into determining  
4 the type of treatment, the length of treatment and the risk  
5 of recidivism guides us in that respect. The risk, I'm  
6 sorry, the risk of re-offending, recidivism being the risk  
7 of re-offending.

8 Q. Now would a person's past criminal history, would that  
9 ever be a sole basis for you to offer opinion in a matter  
10 like this?

11 A. No. You'd like to have a great deal more information  
12 than that.

13 Q. And you did not rely solely upon Mr. Markham's criminal  
14 history?

15 A. No.

16 Q. Doctor, what had Mr. Markham been convicted at the time  
17 of his -- of your evaluation?

18 A. Mr. Markham had been convicted of four acts -- four  
19 counts of lewd acts on a minor.

20 Q. And to your knowledge is committing a lewd act or a  
21 lewd act on a minor, is that a sexually violent offense?

22 A. As described by South Carolina statute of law it is  
23 defined as a sexually violent offense.

24 MR. FLORES: Your Honor, may I approach the witness?

25 THE COURT: You may do so.

1 MR. FLORES: Thank you, Your Honor.

2 Q. Dr. Mulbry, I'm going to hand you what's been marked as  
3 Plaintiff's exhibit 1. Would you please review these sets  
4 of documents.

5 (Pause)

6 Q. Dr. Mulbry, have you seen these documents before?

7 A. I've seen copies of them.

8 Q. And what are -- what is this set of documents?

9 A. This is -- this is an indictment from the court -- it  
10 starts with an indictment from the court of general  
11 sessions, October term, 2004, in the State versus Quentin  
12 Dale Markham. It has a copy -- an affidavit, which  
13 describes the offenses, what's behind the indictment. And  
14 it also has the sentencing sheet from the court of general  
15 sessions. This is the sentencing sheet.

16 Q. Now according to -- and how do you know that these are,  
17 in fact, the sheets that they portray themselves to be?

18 A. I've got a -- this sticker. Oh, and I'm sorry, and a  
19 raised seal -- it's got a raised seal and it's signed by the  
20 Clerk of Court as a true copy. As a certified copy, I'm  
21 sorry.

22 Q. Could you, looking at those documents, tell when this  
23 particular offense took place?

24 A. Between January 1998 and the 31st day of December 1998,  
25 during the year 1998.

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1 Q. Based upon your review of the legal documents in this  
2 case, based upon your evaluation of Mr. Markham and  
3 everything else you relied upon, do you know what happened  
4 concerning this offense?

5 A. This offense involved multiple acts of fondling the  
6 genitalia and performing oral sex on a little girl, who, I  
7 believe, was about four years old at the time.

8 Q. Okay. Do you know where these acts took place?

9 A. I believe in Mr. Markham's home.

10 Q. And they're multiple acts?

11 A. By his account, three to four.

12 MR.. FLORES: Your Honor, we would move Plaintiff's  
13 exhibit 1 into evidence at this time.

14 THE COURT: Any objection?

15 MS. WIYGUL: Without objection.

16 THE COURT: Without objection, exhibit 1 is admitted  
17 into evidence. It may be published.

18 Q. Now you obtained those facts underlying that opinion  
19 through law enforcement records, through your evaluation of  
20 Mr. Markham. Is that what's typically done by experts in  
21 your field?

22 A. It is.

23 Q. Following this incident based on what you've reviewed  
24 to render your opinion in this matter was Mr. Markham  
25 arrested for this particular offense?

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1 A. He was. He was -- it was discovered. He was charged  
2 and, I believe, bonded out to the community.

3 Q. Are you aware of any statements he may have gave -- may  
4 have given at the time to law enforcement concerning these  
5 acts?

6 A. At the time when he was questioned he made a statement  
7 that he was attracted to children.

8 Q. Do you -- are you aware of when Mr. Markham was bonded  
9 out of jail, released on bail?

10 A. Not precisely.

11 Q. Would that information be in your report, perhaps?

12 A. I think -- my memory is it was shortly thereafter, but  
13 I don't remember the precise date.

14 Q. But you are -- you are certain and you can confirm this  
15 with Mr. Markham that he was indeed bonded ---

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. --- or bailed out of jail?

18 A. Yes. He was bonded out, yes.

19 MR. FLORES: I'm going to approach -- if I may, Your  
20 Honor, if I could approach the witness.

21 THE COURT: Yes, sir.

22 Q. I'm going to hand you a series of documents labeled  
23 Plaintiff's exhibits 2, 3 and 4. If you would just review  
24 that information, please.

25 (Pause)

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1 Q. Doctor, have you seen these documents before?

2 A. I have seen copies of them that were included in his  
3 discovery material.

4 Q. And after reviewing them how do you know that they are  
5 what they portray to be?

6 A. Again, these are certified as -- certified copies by  
7 the Greenville County Clerk of Court.

8 Q. And what do the exhibits consist of?

9 A. Again, each one of these, each one has -- the cover  
10 sheet is the indictment with an affidavit about the nature  
11 of the charge, lewd act on a minor. Each one for a  
12 different child. Then also included are the sentencing  
13 sheets for the conviction for each child. And last is the  
14 arrest warrants that are the -- this states the offense  
15 against each one of the three little girls.

16 Q. Where did these offenses take place according to the  
17 indictments?

18 A. These took place, they were 2002, 2003.

19 Q. So this was after the period Mr. Markham bonded out of  
20 jail?

21 A. That's correct.

22 Q. Could you describe for the jury each of these  
23 individual offenses, who the victims were and what took  
24 place?

25 A. Again, using data from my interviews with him and the

1 reports and the report from Dr. Jackson, one of the little  
2 girls was another act of fondling, touching genitalia and  
3 oral sex. She -- the little girl reported some digital  
4 penetration, which has never been well documented and Mr.  
5 Markham has consistently denied it. The second two children  
6 were most -- were just fondling, fondling genitalia.

7 Q. Do you know where the acts took place?

8 A. I think they all -- all described as being in his home.

9 MR. FLORES: Your Honor, at this time we would offer --  
10 we would move Plaintiff's exhibit 2, 3 and 4 into evidence.

11 MS. WIYGUL: Without objection.

12 THE COURT: Without objection, exhibits 2, 3 and 4 are  
13 admitted into evidence and may be published.

14 Q. Now you've discussed already, doctor, that it's  
15 important to understand past criminal history of an  
16 individual when performing these evaluations. What was  
17 significant to you in this case about Mr. Markham's past  
18 criminal history?

19 A. When we -- when we look at the risk of recurrence, of  
20 recidivism, one of the things, the number one thing that we  
21 know it correlates with is what is called sexual deviancy.  
22 And that's been shown in huge actuarial studies where  
23 they've looked at hundreds, if not thousands of people who  
24 have offended. And they've looked at what correlates with  
25 people who re-offend.

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1           And very consistently the things that come up as  
2 correlating with re-offense so that you can look at them and  
3 say this person is at higher risk is, in fact, the number  
4 one is what is called sexual deviancy, that is, responding  
5 to unusual or abnormal sexual stimuli. Pedophilia, that is  
6 an attraction to children, would be one of those abnormal  
7 attractions.

8       Q.   Was it significant to your opinion that Mr. Markham was  
9 out on bond when he committed further sexually violent  
10 offenses?

11      A.   Very much so. The -- significantly Mr. Markham had  
12 been charged with the first charge with the charges in 1998,  
13 was out on bond awaiting sentencing and re-offended not -- a  
14 number of times, many times, which is sort of -- which is a  
15 bit unusual, actually. You would think that once caught,  
16 once under scrutiny, once being observed and watched one  
17 would really try to conform one's behaviors.

18           The fact that he was unable to do so, I stress that,  
19 unable to do so because of this desire, this inability to  
20 resist these urges is significant. It implies that the  
21 urges are very powerful and that they were more than even, I  
22 mean, you're out on bond for the first charge and you re-  
23 offend. It's significant that he -- that those urges were  
24 so strong as that they overwhelmed that sense of scrutiny.

25      Q.   Now, doctor, you discussed as part of evaluation

1 process that you or others in your laboratory or section  
2 performed a number of assessments.

3 A. Yes, sir.

4 Q. What types of assessments did you perform in this -- or  
5 have performed with this?

6 A. Again, these are protocol that everybody does. And the  
7 first is called a Conners' Continuous Performance Test. And  
8 it's actually a pretty common test that we do on all kinds  
9 of people looking for attention deficit issues.

10 And the reason that we do it is we're looking for  
11 impulsiveness. It sometimes picks up impulsiveness. And if  
12 you've got kids with ADHD they may have done a Conners'.  
13 It's a computer test where there's an "x" pops up and you  
14 tap a key. It's a pretty commonly done thing. And so the  
15 first test we do is that Conners' Test. And we're looking  
16 for a tendency for impulsiveness.

17 Q. Let me ask you this, doctor, before you go on. Did you  
18 learn anything about Mr. Markham and impulsiveness as a  
19 result of that test?

20 A. He was actually inconclusive. He ranked right -- what  
21 it does is it takes the data from a whole bunch of people  
22 who clearly have impulsive problems and it takes a whole  
23 bunch of data from people that clearly don't. And his  
24 responses fall right in the dead -- sat in the middle  
25 between those two populations.

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1           So he doesn't fall neatly into the people who clearly  
2           have the problem, doesn't fall neatly into the group who  
3           doesn't. He's kind of midway in between. So we would call  
4           it inconclusive. We didn't draw any conclusions  
5           particularly from it.

6           Q.    What's the next test you did?

7           A.    The next test would be what's called the SASSI. It's a  
8           Substance Abuse Subtle Screening Inventory. And again, this  
9           is a test that asks a whole series of questions.

10          And what they've done is taken a whole bunch of people  
11          that clearly have trouble with drugs and alcohol. And they  
12          take a whole bunch of people who clearly don't have any  
13          trouble with drugs and alcohol and they look at their  
14          responses to a series of questions. And then you take this  
15          -- any given individual and give them the same test, you ask  
16          them the same questions and you look at which population of  
17          people they are most like.

18          In Mr. Markham's case, he has a high probability of  
19          trouble with alcohol or drugs. He falls into the category  
20          of people who -- his responses are most similar to people  
21          who have significant problems with alcohol or drugs.

22          Q.    Based on your review of the records in this case and  
23          the history, and the legal documents are you aware of any  
24          alcohol issues in the past?

25          A.    Indeed Mr. Markham had had significant problems in the

1 distant past. He was drinking very heavily during the  
2 period of time that -- in question, admits to having  
3 significant alcohol problems and, in fact, at the time of  
4 the second set of charges checked himself in to be  
5 detoxified at a facility prior to his incarceration.

6 Q. Doctor, Mr. Markham's use of alcohol, does that affect  
7 his ability to commit these offenses ---

8 A. There's no question that alcohol lowers your  
9 inhibitions. It lowers your ability to think out the  
10 consequences of what you do. It, however, does not change  
11 your sexual interests. It does not shift what kind of  
12 things you're attracted to.

13 Now, again, it does, it lowers that wall that keeps you  
14 from acting on them, but it doesn't change them and it  
15 doesn't make, in this case, children any more desirable  
16 because of drinking.

17 Q. Doctor, what's the next assessment you would have  
18 performed or you did perform in this case?

19 A. The next one would be what's called the Personality  
20 Assessment Inventory. It's basically a personality test.  
21 It's a fairly wide ranging test that looks at personality  
22 characteristics, traits and weaknesses, tries to get a sense  
23 of what kind of coping mechanisms that you use, what your  
24 personality is like.

25 Q. What was it you learned about Mr. Markham in this

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1 particular assessment?

2 A. Mr. Markham has a personality that's -- that could be  
3 safely characterized as having significant anxiety. He --  
4 it's so much so that it interferes with concentration and  
5 ability to relax.

6 He's one of those very anxious people who has trouble  
7 sleeping at night and he gets tired easily because of  
8 anxiety. He has a fair amount of distress in his life. He  
9 -- it also indicates that when he deals with this stress he  
10 can use some fairly unhealthy coping mechanisms to do so.

11 He -- the test specifically noted that, quote, in  
12 social settings he is submissive, passive, withdrawn and  
13 resistant to taking the first step and lacks confidence.  
14 And he describes some poor anger control. These are -- I'm  
15 quoting directly from the personality test that was done.

16 Q. Now the Conners', as you described, the substance  
17 abuse, SASSI Test, the Personality Assessment Inventory,  
18 these were all part of your protocol -- it helped shape your  
19 opinion in this matter, is that correct?

20 A. That's -- yes, sir.

21 Q. And is that type -- are these types of assessments,  
22 these three assessments is the type that are used by other  
23 evaluators in your field?

24 A. They are. Yes, sir. Our protocol, in fact, is modeled  
25 specifically on the one from Johns Hopkins. I'm sorry, I

1 should have mentioned that. That -- Dr. Dwyer went to Johns  
2 Hopkins and then has been up to Canada. And so we have  
3 specifically modeled our protocol on the one that was  
4 developed at Johns Hopkins.

5 Q. Doctor, what other assessments did you use in this  
6 case?

7 A. The next one was -- is called an Abel. An Abel -- It's  
8 called the Abel Assessment of Sexual Interests. And it's  
9 basically a computer evaluation. And it falls into two  
10 broad categories. One is is what's called a self-  
11 assessment. And they ask you what your interests are, just  
12 flat out, do you like looking at -- do you like -- are you  
13 interested in women, or in men, or in kids or anything else.  
14 It assesses what you actually tell them.

15 You then look at sets of pictures. And they do a set  
16 called a visual reaction time. And the details of it are  
17 proprietary, but by Dr. Abel. But basically it is a measure  
18 of comparative -- what you like to look at in effect. And  
19 it appears to be based on the fact that people like to look  
20 at what they're interested in.

21 And so the Abel Assessment looks at that on a  
22 statistical basis. It's done on a computer. You're asked  
23 to rate what you think, the attractiveness or  
24 unattractiveness of the image that you're looking at. You  
25 look at a long series of photographs and you rate the

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1 attractiveness of that person. And the computer keeps track  
2 of what you're looking at and how long you look at it.

3 Q. What did this assessment tell you about Mr. Markham?

4 A. This assessment showed that Mr. Markham has interest  
5 both in adult women and in children. It showed significant  
6 interest, clinically significant interest both in adolescent  
7 girls and in girls under the age of five.

8 Q. Dr. Mulbry, what other assessments did you perform?

9 A. The other test would be what's called a PPG, which is a  
10 Penile Plethysmograph. And basically it is -- they would  
11 put little electrodes to look at skin -- sweating, skin  
12 conductivity, would look at heart rate, look at breathing.  
13 Sort of like you might in a polygraph, almost.

14 But there's one additional device. And that is they  
15 measure penile width or penile response. And they then --  
16 you listen to a series of auditory scenarios. And then you  
17 watch a series of video scenarios. And these -- both of  
18 these, both auditory and visual present a whole series of  
19 different types of situations.

20 Some of them are consensual sexual activity between a  
21 husband and a wife. And some of them are non-consensual  
22 activity between a man and woman. Some are consensual  
23 activity between men. Some are sensual -- consensual  
24 activity among men and adolescents. Some are non-consensual  
25 activities between adults and children. Some involve non-

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1 consensual or forceful sexual activity.

2 And all of these scenarios are presented, you look at  
3 the person's response to those scenarios, and from it you  
4 can derive a -- an estimate or a sense of what their sexual  
5 interests are.

6 Q. Now when you performed this test or this assessment on  
7 Mr. Markham what did the results tell you?

8 A. We didn't get much response consistent with Mr.  
9 Markham's -- well, for whatever reason, probably consistent  
10 with his illness, we did not -- Mr. Markham did not respond  
11 sexually, did not achieve an erection to any of the data  
12 that he was shown at all.

13 Q. And I believe from your list earlier you had one more  
14 assessment that you did perform.

15 A. And that would be the Static.

16 Q. The Static.

17 A. We also did a Static-99. A Static-99 is a well  
18 researched instrument or test, psychological test that looks  
19 at the person's history, their history, and looks for ten  
20 features. And you take those ten statistical features and  
21 you put -- you do a statistical analysis. And from it you  
22 derive a risk of re-offense based on those historical  
23 factors.

24 Q. And what did this assessment tell you about Mr.  
25 Markham?

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1 A. It showed his risk of recidivism to be relatively low.  
2 I think his score was a 1. That's about as low as it gets,  
3 actually. So based on that instrument alone, that review of  
4 his historical data, his risk would be relatively -- would  
5 be quite low.

6 Q. Does the Static require you to accept that score or  
7 does it require you to look at that score or the subject?

8 A. The Static, when you read the -- when you look at the  
9 Static the Static alone and the people that designed it say  
10 this, has what's called moderate predictability. In other  
11 words, how good -- how good -- how good it is at predicting  
12 what's going to happen.

13 Well, even the people who designed it say that it's  
14 moderate alone. And they specifically say it cannot be used  
15 alone and should not be used alone because all it does is  
16 look at historical factors. It looks at how many violent  
17 offenses you've had, how many times you've been convicted,  
18 how old you are.

19 It takes a look at your victims. Are they -- were they  
20 family members? Were they strangers? Were there any boys  
21 who were offended against? It looks at a number of  
22 historical factors that have predictive ability for the  
23 future.

24 However, the people who designed it specifically say  
25 that alone its ability to predict is only moderate. They

1 specifically note that it does not evaluate what they call  
2 criminogenic needs. And the test does not look at those  
3 acute factors and that that is one of the reasons that it  
4 cannot be used alone.

5 Q. What is a criminogenic factor?

6 A. A criminogenic factor is an acute need. In other  
7 words, it's something that doesn't just necessarily show up  
8 in the statistics in your past. If there's anything that  
9 would make you, -- that is ongoing today, now, at this time,  
10 it makes your risk higher. That Static-99 is not going to  
11 pick that up. All it's doing is looking at what you've done  
12 in the past. The -- it does not assess ongoing issues today  
13 in the here and now.

14 Q. The Static, the Penile Plethysmograph and the Abel  
15 Assessment, they were all part of what you relied upon in  
16 rendering your opinion in this matter?

17 A. Yes, sir.

18 Q. Do other experts in your field reasonably rely upon  
19 these instruments in arriving to an opinion in these  
20 matters?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. Doctor, you've stated that yours is the, quote, second  
23 opinion. Did you rely upon Dr. Jackson's evaluation of Mr.  
24 Markham in reaching your conclusion in this case?

25 A. I certainly read it carefully.

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1 Q. Why would you do such -- why would you do so?

2 A. Well, because most importantly if there's something I  
3 don't know that she knows that makes his risk lower, you'd  
4 want to know that. So I could say his risk was low. I  
5 mean, you wouldn't want to miss something.

6 Also, if I disagree, then I have to be able to state  
7 pretty clearly why I disagree, and I have to be able to  
8 defend it. And so looking at how she came to that  
9 conclusion is key to disagreeing if you're going to  
10 disagree.

11 Q. We'll come back to her report in a few moments. I want  
12 to ask you, doctor, what are risk factors?

13 A. Risk factors are features, characteristics, traits,  
14 historical data, anything that you can study that gives you  
15 information about what might happen down the road. So age  
16 is a risk factor.

17 Like it or -- sex is a risk factor. The very fact that  
18 you're a male is a risk factor for re-offending sexually.  
19 Your age is a risk factor. How many times you've offended  
20 in the past is a risk factor. Your ongoing -- and those  
21 would be historical risk factors. Your desires, your --  
22 what attracts you. What your day-to-day needs are are what  
23 are called acute factors. They're ongoing at this time.

24 Q. Based on your evaluation and information do you -- did  
25 you find that Mr. Markham had any significant risk factors?

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1 A. He does. And it's based primarily again on something I  
2 mentioned earlier, which was a giant meta-analysis -- a  
3 giant study where they take all the other studies and they  
4 put them together and they try to come up with what features  
5 most -- make someone most likely to re-offend. What risk  
6 factor matters the most in determining whether somebody is  
7 likely to re-offend again.

8 Q. And what type of risk factors ---

9 A. And the risk factor -- it's Hanson's Study. And Hanson  
10 showed that the most significant risk factor -- actually,  
11 there are two. One is anti-social behavior. But the other  
12 significant risk factor was deviant -- deviant arousal.  
13 That is when you -- the more abnormal the stimulus, the  
14 object of your desire, the more likely you are to  
15 recidivate, to re-offend.

16 Q. And, doctor, was this risk factor or these studies,  
17 were they part of the basis for your opinion in this matter?

18 A. Very much so.

19 Q. And they would be typically reasonably relied upon by  
20 other experts in your field?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. Doctor, we discussed or Ms. Wiygul discussed in opening  
23 statements Mr. Markham's medical history. We know you're a  
24 medical doctor. Could you describe for the jury his current  
25 state, his current medical condition?

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1 A. I'm going by his SCDC records. But he, Mr. Markham has  
2 renal failure. His kidneys don't work at all or so -- or so  
3 little that are not functional. And Mr. Markham, like so  
4 many others with renal failure, requires three times a week  
5 dialysis. Three times a week he has to go to a dialysis  
6 unit.

7 You usually have to sit there, I would imagine, about  
8 three or four hours and be dialyzed. And that's -- short of  
9 getting a kidney transplant, that won't change. He'll be  
10 that way for the rest of his life. And that is the case.

11 Q. I believe Ms. Wiygul also mentioned congestive heart  
12 failure.

13 A. One of the problems that you have with kidney failure  
14 is controlling the amount of fluid in your body because  
15 that's your kidneys' job. You're counting on this machine  
16 that you do three times a week to keep -- to do that for  
17 you. So the problem is that if at any point along the way  
18 you get fluid overloaded, you go into what's called  
19 congestive heart. It is -- it's dangerous. I mean, it's a  
20 significant medical issue. There's no question. And people  
21 with renal failure are very prone to it. And it's -- it is  
22 a significant medical complication.

23 Q. We'll come back to the medical condition in just a few  
24 moments. Was there any other information upon which you  
25 relied rendering your opinion in this matter?

1 A. All of the historical data that came through the  
2 records, my interviews, the testing, those would be the  
3 three broad categories. It would be all of the written  
4 information that we received from everybody, the interviews  
5 that we did and the testing that we did.

6 Q. Doctor, based on your examination of Mr. Markham,  
7 reviewing these records, the assessments you've conducted,  
8 all these risk factors that we've discussed and medical  
9 condition, did you render an opinion to a reasonable degree  
10 of medical certainty as to whether Mr. Markham has a mental  
11 abnormality or a personality disorder?

12 A. I did.

13 Q. And what was that opinion?

14 A. That he -- that Mr. Markham has the medical diagnosis,  
15 pedophilia, attracted to females, non-exclusive type.

16 Q. Could you describe for the jury what that means?

17 A. Pedophilia is a sexual attraction to prepubescent  
18 children. It's -- the reason it has its own diagnosis is  
19 that for the most part the normal human sexual response is  
20 to be attracted to folks of the appropriate gender who have  
21 developed secondary sexual characteristics, whatever those  
22 are.

23 In other words, they -- that's what we consider  
24 attractive. And all you have to do is look at things, movie  
25 stars and magazines and you get a pretty good sense of what

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1 people find -- most people find attractive.

2 Unfortunately, some people it goes -- it goes awry for  
3 some reason and they become attracted to children who have  
4 not yet undergone puberty. It is -- it is listed under the  
5 broad category of pedophilias along with a number of other  
6 diagnoses, exhibitionism, and a number of others. But it's  
7 considered a deviant sexual arousal.

8 In Mr. Markham's case even a bit more so even because  
9 the children tended to be under the age of five. It's  
10 pretty -- it's getting -- it's pretty young. There were a  
11 few that were older. I think some of the later victims were  
12 a bit older. But it's -- that in and of itself is a pretty  
13 significant deviancy. And it meets the criteria of  
14 pedophilia.

15 Then the word attracted to females is based on the fact  
16 that he's shown no interest at all in males. He's only  
17 attracted to females.

18 The modifier of non-exclusive indicates he's also  
19 attracted to adult women. He has some attraction to adult  
20 women. He's carried on two long-term -- many long-term  
21 relationships with women, had many sexual relationships with  
22 them.

23 His Abel exam shows that he's attracted to adult women.  
24 And so he's non-exclusive. There are pedophiles who are  
25 only attracted to kids. Most are actually attracted to both

1 kids and adults.

2 Q. Is this condition considered a life-long condition?

3 A. It is.

4 Q. And you said it was listed in a -- listed -- do you  
5 recognize this book?

6 A. I do.

7 Q. And what is this book?

8 A. This is the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual. It is a  
9 description of all of the psychiatric diagnoses that we  
10 make. And every diagnosis we make should fit the criteria  
11 found in that book.

12 Q. And so you relied upon this?

13 A. I did.

14 Q. Doctor, at this time do you have an opinion to a

15 reasonable degree of medical certainty as to whether Mr.

16 Markham's pedophilia affects his emotional or volitional

17 capacity so that he is predisposed to commit future sexually

18 violent offenses?

19 A. I do.

20 Q. And what is that opinion?

21 A. That his pedophilia causes him to be -- to have a

22 propensity to re-offend.

23 Q. Can you explain why you believe Mr. Markham's

24 pedophilia affects his emotional or volitional capacity?

25 A. One, the data shows that it does. Hanson's data is

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1 pretty clear that the fact that, again, the deviant sexual  
2 arousal causes re-offense.

3 I'm also struck by the fact that even on bond, being  
4 charged with offending against a five year old that his  
5 urges were so strong and powerful that he re-offended  
6 multiple times, actually. Those two things suggest to me  
7 that these urges are very powerful and that he -- the  
8 arousal pattern, the stimuli, that when -- is very attracted  
9 to and very hard for him to control.

10 Q. Doctor, do you have an opinion to a reasonable degree  
11 of medical certainty as to whether Mr. Markham has the  
12 propensity to be dangerous and to commit future sexually  
13 violent offenses?

14 A. I do.

15 Q. And what is that opinion?

16 A. That Mr. Markham does have a propensity to commit  
17 future sexually violent offenses.

18 Q. Doctor, do you have an opinion to a reasonable degree  
19 of medical certainty as to whether Mr. Markham's propensity  
20 to commit future sexually violent offenses is of such a  
21 degree that it poses a menace to the health and safety of  
22 others?

23 A. I do.

24 Q. And what is that opinion?

25 A. That he does have such a propensity that he poses a

1 risk to others.

2 Q. Can you explain why you believe that to be -- why he --  
3 his condition, circumstances, why he poses a menace to the  
4 health and safety of others?

5 A. Three main points, two of which I'll just mention  
6 again, the deviant sexual arousal and the risks  
7 statistically. Number two, the evidence that this is  
8 powerful, the fact that he was out on bond and re-offended  
9 even on bond under legal sanctions.

10 And number three, though his medical conditions  
11 interfere with his capacity to have erections, if in all of  
12 his offenses, in every single one, there is no evidence  
13 whatsoever that erectile function played any kind of role.  
14 These all involve fondling and oral sex.

15 And though Mr. Markham -- there's clear evidence that  
16 Mr. Markham does have erectile dysfunction as a function of  
17 his illness, it doesn't provide him any protection. It  
18 doesn't -- it did, but it doesn't provide any protection  
19 against re-offending based on the type of offenses that he's  
20 drawn to.

21 Q. Doctor, do you have an opinion to a reasonable degree  
22 of medical certainty as to whether Mr. Markham has serious  
23 difficulty in controlling his behavior and his propensities  
24 to be dangerous?

25 A. I do.

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1 Q. And what is that opinion?

2 A. That he has difficulty controlling his behaviors.

3 Q. Upon what do you base that opinion?

4 A. Again, the history, his history. There's not -- no  
5 question that he's attracted to children. There's not any  
6 question that it's happened before. There's evidence that  
7 he -- that legal sanctions don't preclude further offenses.  
8 And though ill, no question, nothing about his illnesses  
9 that will preclude him from re-offending in exactly the same  
10 way that he's re-offended in the past.

11 Q. Doctor, do you have an opinion to a reasonable degree  
12 of medical certainty whether Mr. Markham's pedophilia makes  
13 him likely to engage in acts of sexual violence if he is not  
14 confined in a secure facility for long-term control, care  
15 and treatment?

16 A. He is likely to do so based upon his past history, by  
17 doing so, and again the sexual arousal, failure on bond,  
18 those ---

19 Q. And that is -- that opinion is to a reasonable degree  
20 of medical certainty?

21 A. It is.

22 Q. Doctor, do you have an opinion to a reasonable degree  
23 of medical certainty as to whether Mr. Markham meets the  
24 legal criteria to be found to be a sexually violent predator  
25 at this time?

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1 A. I believe that he does meet that criteria.

2 Q. Now, doctor, Mr. Markham's sentence included a term of  
3 probation, five years probation.

4 A. It did.

5 Q. Did you consider that in coming to your ultimate  
6 conclusion in this case?

7 A. I did weigh that. And almost automatically probation  
8 comes with treatment, out-patient treatment. And the reason  
9 -- what weighed against it was the offense on bond.

10 In other words, you'd like to think that on probation  
11 that you could simply just go out and get treatment as an  
12 out-patient and that the public would be safe, but if you  
13 look at what's happened in the past, it didn't work that  
14 way. He was out on bond, re-offended multiple times on  
15 bond. It suggests that legal sanctions are not enough to  
16 control behaviors.

17 Q. Doctor, I'd like to come back now to Dr. Jackson's  
18 evaluation since you used that as one of the pieces in  
19 rendering your opinion in this matter. Does Dr. Jackson  
20 diagnose Mr. Markham with any mental illness or personality  
21 disorder?

22 A. The same diagnosis as I gave, pedophilia, attracted to  
23 females, non-exclusive type. And we both actually diagnosed  
24 alcohol dependence in a controlled environment based on his  
25 history of having had trouble with alcohol in the past.

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1 Q. What was her ultimate opinion in this matter?

2 A. Her ultimate opinion was that based on his low score on  
3 the Static-99, looking at the historical factors, that he  
4 matched a population of people that was at low risk for re-  
5 offense. She also felt that his medical condition would  
6 serve as protection against further offenses. And based on  
7 those two factors she felt that he was not a candidate for  
8 the SVP program.

9 Q. What led you to a different conclusion?

10 A. The -- what led me was, one, I don't rely entirely on  
11 the Static-99. You have to -- I think you have to look at  
12 these acute factors, these acute risk factors. And so I  
13 included those.

14 Number -- and second of all, I really don't think that  
15 his medical condition provides any assurance that he won't  
16 re-offend. It does not preclude the type of offenses that  
17 he has committed in the past. If he had committed other  
18 types of sexual offenses, that might be true. But in these  
19 types of sexual offenses, there's nothing about his medical  
20 condition that will prevent those from happening again.

21 Q. Doctor, just to review again. You are a medical doctor  
22 licensed within this State?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. And your opinion to a reasonable degree of medical  
25 certainty is that he fits the legal criteria to be found to

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1 be a sexually violent predator at this time?

2 A. Yes, sir.

3 MR. FLORES: Beg the Court's indulgence.

4 THE COURT: Yes, sir.

5 (Pause)

6 MR. FLORES: Your Honor, I have no further questions at  
7 this time.

8 THE COURT: Ms. Wiygul, you may cross examine the  
9 witness.

10 Cross Examination by Ms. Wiygul:

11 Q. Dr. Mulbry, other than these offenses what was -- what  
12 else has Mr. Markham been convicted of?

13 A. Driving.

14 Q. Would you agree that it's driving under suspension and  
15 open container?

16 A. Yes, ma'am.

17 Q. So Mr. Markham had never been to jail before January of  
18 2005, had he?

19 A. That's not -- as far as I know, that's correct.

20 Q. All right. When Mr. Markham committed these offenses  
21 he was not on dialysis yet, was he?

22 A. That's correct.

23 Q. I'm going to ask you to look at these exhibits that the  
24 State's entered, specifically the page that looks like this,  
25 which is a sentencing sheet.

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1 A. Yes, ma'am.

2 Q. Going back to the dates of these offenses and through  
3 your review of the records would you agree that the first  
4 offense occurred in 1998?

5 A. Yes, ma'am.

6 Q. And that offense was reported in 2002, correct?

7 A. 2001?

8 Q. 2001 -- end of 2001, beginning of 2002?

9 A. Yeah, I'm going by memory, but I believe it's 2001.

10 Q. And Mr. Markham was drinking during that offense, ---

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. --- correct? He was ---

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. --- in no way sober?

15 A. He was, by his history, drinking very heavily, yes.

16 Q. Okay. And then the next three offenses, the offenses  
17 that caused you such concern, that occurred while he was out  
18 on bond, they took place in May, July, August of 2003, isn't  
19 that correct? You can look on the sentencing sheets there.  
20 They reference the date of offense on the top right corner.

21 A. I'm looking at number two, which said they occurred  
22 between -- between August 2002 and July 2003, over the  
23 period of a year.

24 Q. Are you looking at the sentencing sheet, doctor?

25 A. I'm sorry. No, I'm looking at the indictments.

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1 Q. If you'll look at the top right hand corner of that  
2 sentencing sheet you'll see an area where it says date of  
3 offense.

4 A. Date of offense, correct, July 10th, 2003.

5 Q. And the other two occurred in May and August, correct?

6 A. That's what was listed on the court of general sessions  
7 sentencing sheet.

8 Q. Okay. If you'll look right above the signatures,  
9 towards the middle of the page here, it'll have a section  
10 that says the plea is. And then it has whether it was a  
11 negotiated sentence, whether there was a recommendation by  
12 the State. How are these sentence -- how are these  
13 sentencing sheets marked?

14 A. I'm going to make sure I'm ...

15 Q. It's right above the ---

16 A. Oh, I'm sorry. The plea is -- it's without  
17 negotiations or recommendation.

18 Q. All right. And being familiar with the criminal  
19 justice system and having participated in hundreds of  
20 criminal trials you're aware that this crime that he pled  
21 guilty to carries a potential sentence of fifteen years,  
22 correct?

23 A. I'm not a hundred percent certain, honestly, but that  
24 sounds right.

25 Q. Okay. So that would tell you that the discretion of

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1 the sentencing judge was to sentence Mr. Markham anywhere  
2 from zero to fifteen years, correct?

3 A. Correct.

4 Q. And if you'll look right above where it says the plea  
5 is, could you tell me how that charge is marked? It's  
6 marked non-violent, isn't it?

7 A. Correct, it is.

8 Q. Because charges that are considered violent under the  
9 Sexually Violent Predator Act, that doesn't mean they're  
10 considered violent in the criminal system, correct?

11 A. As we would commonly use the term violent, that's  
12 correct.

13 Q. So the sentencing judge at his discretion could have  
14 sentenced Mr. Markham up to fifteen years times four, so up  
15 to sixty years, correct?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. And what was the sentence?

18 A. He received ten years and five years of probation.

19 Q. Okay. And there was actually a determinate term of  
20 fifteen years, correct, suspended upon the service of ten  
21 followed by five years probation?

22 A. Yes, ma'am. I'm sorry. Determinate fifteen years,  
23 service of ten, five years probation.

24 Q. Okay. Doctor, let's talk a little bit about sexual  
25 deviancy. The Static-99 doesn't measure sexual deviancy,

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1 does it?

2 A. It does not.

3 Q. It's not set up for that?

4 A. No.

5 Q. Okay. And the sexual arousal measure, deviant sexual  
6 arousal, that doesn't really apply to Mr. Markham because he  
7 cannot become sexually aroused, correct? He ---

8 A. Um-hum (affirmative).

9 Q. --- is impotent due to his medical condition.

10 A. No, it does not. Arousal has to do with a mental  
11 state. No, it does not. Deviant sexual arousal is what  
12 your fantasies are about, what your interests are, what your  
13 acts are directed toward.

14 Q. Okay.

15 A. Not what you can do.

16 Q. You mentioned that the risk factors that matter the  
17 most are anti-social behavior and deviant arousal, but you  
18 did not diagnose Mr. Markham with any type of personality  
19 disorder, correct?

20 A. That's correct.

21 Q. Okay. So that's just kind of a general?

22 A. That's a general. That's ---

23 Q. Okay. All right. And you went into a little bit of  
24 the discussion about congestive heart failure and how it  
25 relates to Mr. Markham's medical condition. Isn't it true

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1 that if Mr. Markham were having a heart attack he wouldn't  
2 even realize it?

3 A. I don't know that that's -- I don't know that that's  
4 necessarily true.

5 Q. Okay. But he's very prone to having a heart attack,  
6 right?

7 A. Yes. He's at elevated risk, yes.

8 Q. Okay. You stated all his victims were under the age of  
9 four.

10 A. No. I think some were as old as eight or nine.

11 Q. Uh-huh (affirmative).

12 A. And I think the first two were four, in the four to  
13 five year old range.

14 Q. I believe it was ages five, nine, eight and nine.

15 A. Yes. Yes, ma'am.

16 Q. Okay. Let's talk about all the assessments you  
17 performed. You performed, or I'm sorry, Dr. Dwyer performed  
18 the assessment. Dr. Dwyer performed one, two, three, four,  
19 five -- five assessments, correct?

20 A. Yes, ma'am.

21 Q. Okay. And the Connors', no conclusions, correct?

22 A. Yes, ma'am.

23 Q. And the PPG couldn't be used due to the medical  
24 condition, correct?

25 A. Correct.

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1 Q. And the SASSI just tells you what you already knew,  
2 he's an alcoholic.

3 A. That's correct.

4 Q. And ---

5 A. He was. Was an alcoholic. Is an alcoholic presently,  
6 but no longer dependent.

7 Q. The personality test just told you he's a very anxious  
8 individual.

9 A. That's correct.

10 Q. Do you believe that all pedophiles should be civilly  
11 committed?

12 A. No.

13 Q. You stated that you did a lot of work, hundreds -- were  
14 involved with hundreds of cases that weren't this type,  
15 sexually violent predator type cases.

16 A. Correct.

17 Q. If someone's unable to control their behavior due to a  
18 mental illness, what's that called under the legal -- legal  
19 field? If someone can't help what they're doing because of  
20 a mental illness, they can't stop themselves because they're  
21 so mentally ill?

22 A. You mean capacity to conform?

23 Q. Um-hum (affirmative). Would that be like -- if someone  
24 fit that category would that be not guilty or guilty, but  
25 mentally ill?

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1 A. There are arguments about whether or not pedophilia and  
2 deviant sexual arousal equates to capacity to conform. It  
3 doesn't in every case.

4 Q. Okay. So just because you suffer from pedophilia, just  
5 because you would be somewhere in your mind attracted to  
6 inappropriate individuals does not mean you would act on  
7 that?

8 A. Oh, no, absolutely not. No.

9 Q. We spoke about how much you were getting paid. How  
10 much was Dr. Dwyer paid for his participation?

11 A. I don't know.

12 Q. Okay. And were any additional funds paid for the  
13 testing?

14 A. I'm not aware -- I'm really not a part of that. I'm an  
15 hourly employee.

16 Q. Okay. Other than your interview with Mr. Markham all  
17 of your material came -- was forwarded from the AG's Office,  
18 correct? The Department of Correction records, ---

19 A. Everything I remember ---

20 Q. --- the incident reports?

21 A. Sometimes we get records from other sources.

22 Q. Right. But in this case you ---

23 A. In this case I think it all came from the Attorney  
24 General's Office.

25 Q. Okay. And you stated that the medical condition, from

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1 what you could tell from the SCDC records, you considered  
2 that in coming to your opinion, correct?

3 A. I considered it, yes.

4 Q. Okay. And you're aware that Mr. Markham has been  
5 confined at the Greenville County Detention Center waiting  
6 on this trial since his release from SCDC, correct?

7 A. Yes, ma'am.

8 Q. I'm going to show you a stack of paperwork. Would you  
9 identify that for the Court?

10 A. It's labeled medical records, cost of treatment,  
11 Greenville Detention Center.

12 Q. And ---

13 **MR. FLORES:** Your Honor, if we could take up an issue  
14 outside the presence of the jury, please.

15 **THE COURT:** All right. Ladies and gentlemen, I'm going  
16 to let you go back to your jury room just for a moment.  
17 We'll take care of this legal matter and then we'll call you  
18 back. Don't discuss the case while you're out.

19 (Whereupon the jury exited the courtroom at 12:27 pm)

20 **THE COURT:** All right. Mr. Flores, I'll be glad to  
21 hear from you.

22 **MR. FLORES:** Yes, Your Honor. This series of documents  
23 can actually be categorized into two sets. There's a large  
24 portion of what would be considered medical type records,  
25 intake, medical treatment, requests for treatment,

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1 physician's orders. That's what this stack would be.

2 These three sheets, which are found at the end of the  
3 packet all pertain to the cost of dialysis and services  
4 concerning Mr. Markham's medical condition while he's been  
5 at the Greenville County Detention Center.

6 MS. WIYGUL: And that is an accurate representation,  
7 Your Honor.

8 THE COURT: All right.

9 MR. FLORES: We would -- I've spoken with Ms. Wiygul  
10 about these records. We would stipulate to their  
11 authenticity. There's, indeed, a certified stamp on the  
12 records. However, we would object to any admission of these  
13 into -- as a set of documents into evidence.

14 If she wishes to question Dr. Mulbry about these  
15 documents, which he has not seen to this day, I have no  
16 objection to that. But with regard to putting these records  
17 in evidence to go to the jury, I believe that, first, I  
18 don't feel that they're relevant to the issue. I think Dr.  
19 Mulbry is quite clear that he does have a kidney condition  
20 which requires three times a week dialysis. And quite  
21 clearly, that's not going to change.

22 And so I don't feel that they're relevant to the issue  
23 before the Court at this time with regard to the costs. I  
24 don't believe that's at all relevant to why we're here today  
25 determining whether he's a sexually violent predator.

1           And further to that, if -- I guess, as far as a rule  
2   403 analysis, I feel that these documents -- especially the  
3   cost figures have the potential to confuse the jury about  
4   what the issues of this case really are.

5           **THE COURT:** Okay. Ms. Wiygul.

6           **MS. WIYGUL:** May I respond, Your Honor?

7           **THE COURT:** Yes, sir. Yes, ma'am.

8           **MS. WIYGUL:** The State's doctor, Dr. Mulbry has  
9   testified that his medical condition is relevant to his  
10   opinion and is relevant as to whether he meets the criteria  
11   for commitment under this Act. The cost would go to his  
12   family's willingness to incur those costs to have him home.

13           **THE COURT:** What was his date of release? How long has  
14   he been at the LEC?

15           **MS. WIYGUL:** He's been at the LEC, Your Honor, since  
16   April 18th of last year.

17           **THE COURT:** So that was the date he was released from  
18   SCDC?

19           **MS. WIYGUL:** Yes, Your Honor.

20           **THE COURT:** Anything else, Mr. Flores?

21           **MR. FLORES:** Nothing else, Your Honor.

22           **THE COURT:** All right. I'll overrule your objection.  
23   I'll allow her to introduce the documents. Your objection  
24   is noted for the record.

25           **MR. FLORES:** Thank you, Your Honor.

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1 MS. WIYGUL: Thank you.

2 THE COURT: You want to go ahead now while we're out  
3 and have them marked? Are they already marked?

4 MS. WIYGUL: They're already marked, Your Honor.

5 THE COURT: Okay.

6 MS. WIYGUL: Well, I've just got it as one exhibit, but  
7 it's marked.

8 THE COURT: Okay. And going off subject, this is your  
9 case, this witness?

10 MR. FLORES: Yes, Your Honor.

11 THE COURT: Do you have witnesses available ---

12 MS. WIYGUL: I do, Your Honor. They're ---

13 THE COURT: --- now to ---

14 MS. WIYGUL: --- right here.

15 THE COURT: I'm just wondering schedule-wise. Dr.  
16 Jackson ---

17 MS. WIYGUL: I don't anticipate Dr. Jackson being on  
18 the stand as long as Dr. Mulbry. And I believe that the lay  
19 witnesses will have fairly short testimony.

20 THE COURT: So we could perhaps -- well, I won't --  
21 we'll see how it goes. We'll -- Dr. Jackson going to  
22 testify first, you anticipate? Or ---

23 MS. WIYGUL: Yes, sir.

24 THE COURT: --- later? Okay. I didn't know if we'd  
25 have short ones, then ---

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1 MS. WIYGUL: We can do that ---

2 THE COURT: It doesn't matter. We'll ---

3 MS. WIYGUL: It's not going to make a difference.

4 THE COURT: We'll see how long we'll go. All right.

5 If the jury's ready, you can have them come back in.

6 (Whereupon the jury entered the courtroom at 12:34 am)

7 MS. WIYGUL: Your Honor, may we approach?

8 THE COURT: Yes, ma'am.

9 (Whereupon a bench conference was held off the record  
10 in the presence of the jury, but out of their hearing)

11 THE COURT: All right. Ms. Wiygul, you may continue  
12 your cross examination of the witness.

13 Cross Examination by Ms. Wiygul Continued:

14 Q. Doctor, just in case anybody's forgotten, can you  
15 identify what you're looking at there?

16 A. The folder is labeled medical records and cost of  
17 treatment at Greenville Detention Center.

18 Q. Okay. And Mr. Markham actually completed his sentence  
19 in the Department of Corrections, correct?

20 A. Yes, ma'am.

21 Q. And so he's been at the Greenville County Detention  
22 Center since about March of last year?

23 A. Yes, ma'am.

24 Q. Okay.

25 MS. WIYGUL: At this time I would move that this

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1 exhibit be entered as Respondent's 1.

2 THE COURT: Subject to objection, exhibit is admitted  
3 and may be published.

4 (Whereupon Defendant's exhibit 1 was admitted into  
5 evidence)

6 Q. Doctor, looking on the very last pages, last couple of  
7 pages of these documents, and you can take it apart if you  
8 need to to look at it, can you tell us how much Mr.

9 Markham's medical care has costed? And you can -- you can  
10 break them down. I ---

11 A. There is ---

12 Q. --- don't want to make ---

13 A. Looks like there ---

14 Q. --- you do addition.

15 A. --- there are separate charts here.

16 Q. Correct.

17 A. It looks like separate sets of -- it looks like three  
18 separate sets of -- of ---

19 Q. Correct. You can give us the three separate figures.

20 A. Okay. The first one is listed by vendor amount and  
21 description. And the first one, the total at the bottom of  
22 the page is a hundred and sixty-one thousand, nine hundred  
23 twenty-one dollars and twenty-four cents (\$161,921.24).

24 Q. Okay.

25 A. The second page looks like Laboratory Services and

1 Dialysis at Greer. And it is labeled thirty-six thousand,  
2 six hundred twenty-seven dollars and sixty-nine cents  
3 (\$36,627.69).

4 And a third page indicates medication charges for April  
5 2011 through today, non-formulary med charges, eighteen  
6 thousand, four hundred and forty-nine dollars, ninety-three  
7 cents (\$18,449.93).

8 Q. Okay. So it's expensive medical treatment, correct?

9 A. It is.

10 Q. To treat his condition?

11 A. It is.

12 Q. During the time that Mr. Markham -- from 2005 until  
13 March of last year while Mr. Markham was in the Department  
14 of Corrections did he receive any disciplinary infractions?

15 A. Nothing of -- I don't remember any at all.

16 Q. He didn't have any, did he?

17 A. I don't remember any at all, no, ma'am.

18 Q. And he completed the incarceration portion of his  
19 sentence before he was taken to the county jail, correct?

20 A. Yes, ma'am.

21 Q. When the Sexually Violent Predator Act refers to  
22 treatment it's not talking about treatment for medical  
23 conditions, is it?

24 A. The treatment referred to specifically in the Act  
25 refers to treatment for the -- for the sexual difficulty.

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1 Q. Okay.

2 A. Treatment -- medical treatment, of course, goes along  
3 with being a ward of the State.

4 Q. And in reviewing Mr. Markham's SCDC records you're  
5 aware that he asked to be given sex offender treatment while  
6 he was in prison, didn't he?

7 A. He did.

8 Q. But he couldn't participate, could he?

9 A. That's correct.

10 Q. And why couldn't he participate?

11 A. I'm going to assume that his dialysis held him at Broad  
12 River. The treatment facility is at another site. And for  
13 that reason he had to stay where the dialysis is.

14 Q. And you stated that after the May, July, August  
15 offenses in 2003 Mr. Markham checked himself into an in-  
16 patient alcohol rehab center, correct?

17 A. I believe so, yes, ma'am.

18 Q. I have no further questions. Thank you, doctor.

19 THE COURT: Anything in redirect?

20 MR. FLORES: No questions, Your Honor.

21 THE COURT: All right. Thank you. Dr. Mulbry, you may  
22 step down from the witness stand.

23 MR. FLORES: Your Honor, Dr. Mulbry is here under  
24 subpoena. We'd ask that he be released from that at this  
25 time.

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1 MS. WIYGUL: Without objection.

2 THE COURT: Without objection he may be released.

3 Thank you, sir.

4 MR. FLORES: Your Honor, at this time the State rests.

5 THE COURT: All right. Anything from the Defense as  
6 far as witnesses?

7 MS. WIYGUL: Your Honor, we would call Dr. Rebecca  
8 Jackson.

9 THE COURT: All right. Dr. Jackson, if you'd come  
10 around, please, and be sworn.

11 MADAME CLERK: Place your left hand on the Bible and  
12 raise your right hand, please.

13 Rebecca Jackson, being  
14 duly sworn testified as follows:

15 MADAME CLERK: Please state your name for the record.

16 DR. JACKSON: Rebecca Jackson.

17 MADAME CLERK: Thank you. You may be seated.

18 Direct Examination by Ms. Wiygul:

19 Q. Hi, Dr. Jackson. Could you tell us a little bit about  
20 your education and experience?

21 A. Sure. I have a bachelor's degree in psychology, a  
22 master's degree in psychology and a PhD in clinical  
23 psychology.

24 Q. And tell us a little bit about your work history.

25 A. Sure. I've been working with sex offender civil

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1 commitment population, otherwise known as sexually violent  
2 predators, since 2003 in Washington, New Hampshire, South  
3 Carolina and now in Florida. I've been a consultant to the  
4 Washington and New Hampshire programs for many years.

5 I was previously a chief psychologist with the South  
6 Carolina Department of Mental Health where I evaluated men  
7 under the sex offender civil commitment law. Since July of  
8 2011 I have been working at the Florida Sex Offender Civil  
9 Commitment Center, which is Florida's equivalent to the  
10 Sexually Violent Predator Law. I'm currently the clinical  
11 director of that program.

12 Q. Have you ever testified in court in relation to these  
13 commitments?

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. And approximately how many?

16 A. In pre-commitment sex offender civil commitment, about  
17 a dozen times in South Carolina.

18 Q. Okay. And have you been recognized by a -- as an  
19 expert by the South ---

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. --- Carolina courts?

22 MS. WIYGUL: At this time we would move to have Dr.  
23 Jackson recognized as an expert in forensic psychology.

24 THE COURT: Any voir dire or any objection?

25 MR. FLORES: No, Your Honor, no objection.

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1 THE COURT: Without objection this witness will be  
2 considered an expert and may give her opinion and the basis  
3 thereof.

4 Q. Doctor, when you were chief psychologist of the South  
5 Carolina program did you perform evaluations of possible  
6 candidates for the program?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. And in that capacity did the State ask you to perform  
9 an evaluation on Mr. Markham?

10 A. I was an employee of the State, the Department of  
11 Mental Health. So whenever someone was referred by the  
12 multi-disciplinary team as potentially meeting criteria  
13 under the civil commitment law, then they were referred to  
14 the Department of Mental Health for an evaluation.

15 Q. Okay. And did you review the same materials in  
16 preparation for that evaluation that Dr. Mulbry reviewed in  
17 preparation for ---

18 A. It certainly sounds that way. The Attorney General's  
19 Office frequently forwards the discovery material to any  
20 evaluator who is assigned to the case.

21 Q. And what does that generally include?

22 A. Generally it would be the police reports, the incident  
23 -- any incident reports, victim reports, any affidavits, the  
24 sentencing sheets, information about the Sexually Violent  
25 Predator Act itself, any Department of Corrections records

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1 from the prison or jail where he's detained, any other prior  
2 psychological or psychiatric evaluations that he underwent,  
3 any medical records that may be relevant, any other school  
4 or mental health records that may be more rare but relevant  
5 to the case would be forwarded.

6 Q. Okay. And did you interview Mr. Markham?

7 A. I did.

8 Q. Did you base your opinions solely on the Static-99?

9 A. Of course not.

10 Q. Okay. Well, first off, I guess, could you -- could you  
11 tell us what you considered when you met with Mr. Markham or  
12 prior to meeting with Mr. Markham and what played a part in  
13 your opinion?

14 A. Sure. Certainly I've read all of the information that  
15 was forwarded from the Attorney General's Office. So I read  
16 about Mr. Markham's offenses, read about his history, read  
17 about his behavior at the Department of Corrections.

18 What goes into the evaluation -- specifically what the  
19 law asks us to assess is whether someone is mentally  
20 abnormal and extremely dangerous and likely to commit acts  
21 of sexual violence. So to that end, I look at information  
22 that would help determine whether he does have a mental  
23 abnormality, but also whether he is likely to re-offend.  
24 And likely is further defined in the statute as likely to  
25 create a menace to the health and safety of society.

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1           So I'm looking at extreme dangerousness, whether he's  
2           so likely as to be a menace as a result of this mental  
3           abnormality. Those are the kinds of things that I'm  
4           assessing him for.

5           Q.    Okay. And Dr. Mulbry was very concerned about sexual  
6           arousal deviancy.

7           A.    Um-hum (affirmative).

8           Q.    Could you -- could you tell us a little bit about that  
9           and how it relates to Mr. Markham?

10          A.    Sure. Mr. -- Dr. Mulbry is correct. Hanson did a  
11          large study in which sexual deviance, sexual deviant  
12          interests does emerge as one of the strongest predictors of  
13          future sexual offending.

14          What wasn't quite accurate is that that's not reflected  
15          in the Static-99 instrument. And it's reflected in a couple  
16          of different ways. For one, you do look at prior sexual  
17          offenses. And sexual offenses are reflective certainly of  
18          sexually deviant interests. If it's criminal behavior, it's  
19          also defined socially as deviant in most cases.

20          And there's also an item on the scale for having a male  
21          victim. Having sexually deviant interests in men is also --  
22          or boys is also reflected on this instrument.

23          But apart from that, well, what's important to know  
24          about the research on sexually deviant interests is the  
25          following; that, yes, it's a large category that is an

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1 important predictor. When you look really closely at the  
2 studies that make up that finding and drill it down, what  
3 you find is that sexual preference for sexual deviance is  
4 important.

5 And that means that you have more sexual arousal to  
6 this deviant stimulus than you do to non-deviant stimulus.  
7 So in this case you would have more arousal to children than  
8 you have to adults. So it's preference versus interest.  
9 That's really predictive.

10 And the second piece of that that's really predictive  
11 is interest in boys. Having a male victim increases your  
12 risk tremendously above and beyond if you have female  
13 victims. Even among individuals with pedophilia, those with  
14 only girl victims re-offend at much lower rates than do  
15 individuals diagnosed with pedophilia who have male victims  
16 or both male and female victims.

17 Q. Was it significant to you that Mr. Markham was an  
18 active alcoholic, he was drunk during every offense?

19 A. It is certainly significant. Similarly to what Dr.  
20 Mulbry said, that it does lower our inhibitions for  
21 anything. It doesn't change our interests, but it does  
22 change our inhibitions. It lowers them when something comes  
23 into our field, we're much more likely to act on that.

24 Q. And was it significant to you that when confronted with  
25 the allegations Mr. Markham immediately admitted them and

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1 showed remorse?

2 A. Disclosure can be important in acknowledging --  
3 accepting responsibility for one's offenses can be  
4 important.

5 Q. Can you explain -- well, let me ask you first, we've  
6 heard that Dr. Mulbry was not qualified to administer these  
7 tests.

8 A. Um-hum (affirmative).

9 Q. The PPG, and the SASSI, and the Abel or other tests  
10 that were administered.

11 A. That's correct.

12 Q. Are you qualified to administer these tests?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. Okay. Is there a danger in taking the results from  
15 these tests without understanding the underlying -- how the  
16 tests work and what needs to be done to administer them?

17 A. There certainly can be. And this is why there are  
18 rules about who can administer them. He mentioned that Dr.  
19 Dwyer did administer the tests.

20 And I don't know how much of the report he interpreted.  
21 My assumption would be Dr. Mulbry got consultation in  
22 interpreting these reports. It's typically how psychiatry  
23 and psychology would work together. But without that  
24 consultation, sure, there's a risk of misinterpretation of  
25 results.

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1 Q. Okay. And after reviewing these things and speaking  
2 with Mr. Markham were you able to come up with an opinion to  
3 a reasonable degree of psychological certainty in this case?

4 A. Yes.

5 Q. And can you tell us what that is?

6 A. Given the criteria that someone must have, a mental  
7 abnormality, but also that he is likely to commit future  
8 acts of sexual violence to the degree that makes him a  
9 menace to society, I did not find that Mr. Markham rose to  
10 that level of dangerousness. I found that he did not meet  
11 criteria under the law.

12 Q. Okay. And we heard that Mr. Markham was not on  
13 dialysis or in serious treatment for his medical conditions  
14 whenever these offenses occurred.

15 A. Correct. He ---

16 Q. Could you tell us how not only the medical conditions  
17 he suffers, but the treatment would affect or have an effect  
18 on your findings?

19 A. Sure. I personally did find that relevant. And Dr.  
20 Mulbry's correct in that Mr. Markham's sexual offenses did  
21 not necessarily involve erections or ejaculation. And that  
22 is impacted by his illness.

23 However, sexual behavior involves many other aspects  
24 than simply erectile functioning. It includes interests,  
25 strength, mobility, access, all these kinds of things that

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1 will be limited either as a direct or indirect result of Mr.  
2 Markham's illness and his treatment.

3 His energy level has waned. His interest in -- self-  
4 reported interest in sexual activity has gone down. His  
5 endurance and mobility is certainly limited. The fact that  
6 he's in treatment as frequently as he is and as seriously  
7 ill as he is is going to further reduce his endurance,  
8 strength and mobility as well as his potential access to any  
9 victims in the community.

10 Q. Okay. And we heard a lot of discussion about risk  
11 factors.

12 A. Um-hum (affirmative).

13 Q. Did you take the risk factors into account when  
14 reaching your opinion?

15 A. Certainly. And we talked earlier about how risk  
16 factors could be static in nature. And those are the  
17 historical factors. Prior sex offenses, having any male  
18 victims, having unrelated victims, those are historic  
19 factors.

20 And then there's also dynamic factors, which were  
21 called criminogenic needs earlier. Dynamic's another word  
22 that simply means these things are changeable over time.  
23 Those are two different kinds of risk factors.

24 Q. Okay. But -- and you considered all of this?

25 A. I did. Mr. Markham does have a couple of the static

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1 risk factors, which is how we arrived at a score of 1,  
2 again, a low score on the Static-99. I also looked both in  
3 his record, in his offense history, in his behavior at the  
4 prison, in the interview, things he told me.

5 I looked for those dynamic risk factors, those  
6 changeable kinds of things that would either increase or  
7 decrease that risk and was really unable to find anything  
8 that would increase that risk above what's estimated by the  
9 Static-99.

10 Q. Dr. Jackson, how much are you being paid for your  
11 testimony today?

12 A. The State paid for my travel arrangements, but I'm not  
13 being reimbursed for my time at all today.

14 Q. Okay. And just to clarify, it is your expert opinion  
15 that Mr. Markham does not qualify as a sexually violent  
16 offender?

17 A. That is correct.

18 Q. Thank you, doctor.

19 **THE COURT:** You may cross examine the witness, Mr.  
20 Flores.

21 **MR. FLORES:** Thank you, Your Honor. Just very briefly.

22 Cross Examination by Mr. Flores:

23 Q. Good afternoon, Dr. Jackson.

24 A. Good afternoon.

25 Q. Is it correct that you were appointed by the courts to

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1 perform the evaluation of Mr. Markham?

2 A. That is correct.

3 Q. So you were not asked by the Attorney General to  
4 perform an evaluation in this case?

5 A. Correct.

6 Q. And isn't it true that it was part of your former  
7 employment with the Department of Mental Health?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. So, in fact, it is not the State requesting a second or  
10 the additional evaluation, is that correct?

11 A. That's correct. The State -- when I said that I was  
12 thinking Department of Mental Health, which is a State  
13 agency, not to confuse it with the State's Attorney  
14 General's Office. That is correct. I'm appointed by the  
15 court who appoints the Department of Mental Health who in  
16 turn appointed me, yes.

17 Q. And you've testified in these cases both for and  
18 against a commitment, correct?

19 A. I have.

20 Q. Both for someone like Defense counsel and also for the  
21 Attorney General's Office?

22 A. Many times, yes.

23 Q. Now Ms. Wiygul has stated that -- pointed out that Dr.  
24 Dwyer performed a number of these assessments because he has  
25 an Ed and that Dr. Mulbry does not. And you've just spoken

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1 that it's not uncommon for a psychologist or psychiatrist to  
2 consult with others who are degreed in those fields to  
3 perform these assessments, is that correct?

4 A. Correct.

5 Q. Did you perform any of these other assessments that Dr.  
6 Mulbry did in his ---

7 A. I chose not to give any additional assessments.

8 Q. So it's not your protocol to gather all of that  
9 information like Dr. Mulbry, is that correct?

10 A. The particular tests that Dr. Mulbry gave, as he  
11 mentioned, is his routine in their laboratory. He mentioned  
12 they've seen very few sexually violent predators. The bulk  
13 of their patients are traditionally mentally ill patients  
14 who come in through the courts for competency or insanity  
15 cases.

16 So those tests such as the PAI they mentioned and the  
17 Connors' for ADHD is much -- is more relevant to a  
18 traditionally mentally ill population. They tell us very  
19 little about whether someone meets criteria for sexually  
20 violent predator specifically. So over the years I have  
21 definitely developed much more of a specialized narrow  
22 evaluation because I don't do those competency in examining  
23 cases.

24 MR. FLORES: I beg the Court's indulgence.

25 THE COURT: Yes, sir.

REBECCA JACKSON - CROSS EXAMINATION BY MR. FLORES

1 (Pause)

2 MR. FLORES: May I approach the witness, Your Honor?

3 THE COURT: You may.

4 MR. FLORES: Thank you.

5 Q. I'm going to hand you a document. Could you just  
6 identify that document?

7 A. It's a copy of the report I wrote on Mr. Markham.

8 Q. Would you flip to the final page of that particular  
9 document. And would you read the final paragraph under the  
10 opinions. Actually, start at the opinion section and just  
11 read the last sentence, the paragraphs.

12 A. The last two paragraphs -- the whole entire ---

13 Q. Yes.

14 A. --- the opinion section?

15 Whether Mr. Markham is a sexually violent predator is a  
16 legal decision to be made by the legal fact-finder. As  
17 such, the following opinion is not intended to be  
18 dispositive on this issue, but to assist the fact-finder in  
19 the decision making process.

20 It is noted that examiner's opinions are limited by  
21 several factors. For example: estimates of re-offense  
22 risks are based on group data that cannot be directly  
23 applied to an individual respondent. Furthermore, some  
24 terminology in the SVP statute such as likely to engage in  
25 acts of sexual violence is not clearly defined.

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1           The purpose of this evaluation is to inform the trier  
2 of fact regarding whether Mr. Markham, quote, suffers from a  
3 mental abnormality or personality disorder that makes him  
4 likely to engage in acts of sexual violence if not confined  
5 in a secure facility for long-term control, care and  
6 treatment. Mr. Markham has been convicted of engaging in  
7 sexual acts with minor females and appears to meet criteria  
8 for pedophilia, sexually attracted to females.

9           However, his actuarial assessed risk for committing  
10 future sexual violence is in the low range and is lower than  
11 that of the typical sex offender in the developmental  
12 sample. Mr. Markham does not appear to have additional risk  
13 factors that would increase this risk.

14           In contrast, Mr. Markham suffers from end-stage renal  
15 disease and is required to undergo dialysis. It is unlikely  
16 that he will receive a kidney transplant or that his medical  
17 condition will improve. His family help may further reduce  
18 his risk of re-offending. Furthermore, Mr. Markham will be  
19 required to serve five years probation after his release.

20           It is the opinion of this evaluator, therefore, that  
21 Mr. Markham does not meet criteria for civil commitment as  
22 outlined in the SVP Act, followed by my signature and title.

23 Q. Thank you, doctor. Just a final series of questions.  
24 You are not -- you do not possess a degree -- a doctor of  
25 medicine degree?

BELINDA CROCKER - DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MS. WIYGUL

1 A. I do not.

2 Q. You don't have a doctor of -- a Phd ---

3 A. A doctor of philosophy in clinical psychology.

4 Q. Psychology. So you are -- not having a medical degree,  
5 you are also not licensed to practice medicine?

6 A. That is correct.

7 MR. FLORES: That's all I have for Dr. Jackson, Your  
8 Honor.

9 THE COURT: Any redirect?

10 MS. WIYGUL: No, Your Honor.

11 THE COURT: All right. Thank you, Dr. Jackson. You  
12 may step down. You may call your next witness, Ms. Wiygul.

13 MS. WIYGUL: Respondent calls Belinda Crocker.

14 THE COURT: If you'd come around, please, and be sworn.

15 MADAME CLERK: If you'll just place your left hand on  
16 the Bible and raise your right hand.

17 Belinda Crocker,  
18 being duly sworn testified as follows:

19 MADAME CLERK: Please state your name for the record.

20 MS. CROCKER: Belinda Crocker.

21 MADAME CLERK: Thank you. You may be seated.

22 Direct Examination by Ms. Wiygul:

23 Q. Belinda, tell us how you know Dale.

24 A. Dale's my brother, half brother ---

25 MADAME COURT REPORTER: I'm sorry, ---

BELINDA CROCKER - DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MS. WIYGUL

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- 1           THE COURT: Could you get over toward the microphone,  
2 please.
- 3 A. We have same mom, different dads. He's my brother.
- 4 Q. Okay. And are you close with him?
- 5 A. Very close. He's also my best friend.
- 6 Q. Did you grow up together?
- 7 A. Off and on, yes. He lived in Tennessee as a child,  
8 but, you know, I was younger. There's about ten years  
9 difference between us.
- 10 Q. Okay. When did y'all actually become close?
- 11 A. I'd say when I was probably about five. I mean, he  
12 started, you know, he was a teenager and then driving. So  
13 he could come by more.
- 14 Q. Okay.
- 15 A. And so when he did, you know, I was very attached to  
16 him.
- 17 Q. Okay.
- 18 A. You know.
- 19 Q. Did he ever make any inappropriate ---
- 20 A. No, he did not.
- 21 Q. --- actions toward you?
- 22 A. No.
- 23 Q. Are you familiar with his medical condition?
- 24 A. I am.
- 25 Q. And what do you hope to see happen with him?

BELINDA CROCKER - DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MS. WIYGUL

1 A. I think, you know, they've done the best they can, but  
2 the treatment my brother needs is support. He needs to be  
3 at home because my brother's going to die. And there's no  
4 hope for him. And I'm there to take care of him and get him  
5 the treatment that he needs and give him the support. I'm a  
6 mother also.

7 Q. Ms. Crocker, would your brother be staying with you?

8 A. He'll be staying with my mom.

9 Q. Okay.

10 A. But ---

11 Q. Earlier we heard someone testify that out-patient sex  
12 offender treatment would most likely be a requirement of  
13 probation.

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. And, I guess, in the hope that he would be released,  
16 have you taken any steps to look into that?

17 A. I have. And I have talked to them. And with him being  
18 on probation they are going to accept him. And I will be,  
19 you know, willing, you know, me and my mom and step-dad are  
20 going to take him back and forth to those treatments to make  
21 sure he's there.

22 Q. And who would that treatment be with? Do you recall  
23 the name?

24 A. I don't. He's in Taylors.

25 Q. And you spoke with that office?

BELINDA CROCKER - DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MS. WIYGUL

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- 1 A. Yes, I did. I spoke with them on Friday.
- 2 Q. Okay. All right. You said that you have children.
- 3 A. Yes, ma'am.
- 4 Q. How many children do you have?
- 5 A. I have four, one deceased.
- 6 Q. I'm sorry, I can't ---
- 7 A. I have four children, one that has passed away.
- 8 Q. Okay. And how old are those children?
- 9 A. My three boys are fourteen almost, nine and six.
- 10 Q. Okay. You know what your brother did ---
- 11 A. Yes.
- 12 Q. --- and admitted to.
- 13 A. Yes.
- 14 Q. How do you plan to help him when he gets out to make
- 15 ~~sure nothing like that happens again?~~
- 16 A. To get him treatment, get him counseling, to make sure
- 17 he stays in those treatments.
- 18 Q. Okay.
- 19 A. Everything I can possibly.
- 20 Q. Have you observed any changes in your brother over the
- 21 past couple of years just as far as his health goes?
- 22 A. He's getting worse. He's getting weaker. I just seen
- 23 my brother in ICU last week. And, you know, it didn't look
- 24 good. He had twelve to fourteen pounds of fluid in his
- 25 lungs.

BELINDA CROCKER - DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MS. WIYGUL

1 Q. He was in ICU ---

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. --- here in Greenville?

4 A. Um-hum (affirmative). Intensive Care Unit.

5 Q. Why was he there?

6 A. Because of the fluid in his lungs. It was twelve to  
7 fourteen pounds of mass, volume, because he can't go to the  
8 bathroom and it had built up.

9 Q. Okay.

10 A. And he, you know, some of the medicine requires extra  
11 through -- when he eats and he don't get it. And when you  
12 don't get it, it messes with your heart. And your heart  
13 doesn't give you the calcium and all that stuff. My brother  
14 needs a thing when he has a heart attack to shock him to  
15 bring him back to life or he won't know that he has it. He  
16 would just completely die right then.

17 Q. Now you stated something about food. Does his medical  
18 condition require a special diet?

19 A. Yes, it does.

20 Q. To the best of your knowledge, is that diet available  
21 in the Detention Center?

22 A. No. Dialysis doctors over there even sent his  
23 progresses, I think it's called, his professes (phonetics),  
24 I can't pronounce it. It's -- they are really high. And  
25 what that does then it gets your heart because of failure

BELINDA CROCKER - DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MS. WIYGUL

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1 that could, you know, 'cause he doesn't get the medicine or  
2 the food.

3 They cannot have, you know, certain drinks, certain,  
4 you know, and it's like greasy food and stuff like that.  
5 I'm not for sure. It's all kinds of foods. But foods that  
6 they feed them just -- he has to have that medicine to break  
7 it down. And he doesn't get it. They refuse to give him  
8 that extra medicine.

9 Q. Have you spoken with your other family members and with  
10 friends of the family ---

11 A. I have.

12 Q. --- about the care that Dale's going to need over the  
13 next year or so?

14 A. I have. And we've all agreed. Me and my mom, we live  
15 two minutes away from each other. And I don't work because  
16 I have health issues myself. And so between that, and my  
17 step-dad, and my mom, and my fiancé, we've all agreed, you  
18 know, one of us will be available twenty-four hours a day.

19 Q. Okay. I have no further questions. Thank you, ma'am.

20 THE COURT: Any cross examination?

21 MR. FLORES: I have nothing for this witness, Your  
22 Honor.

23 THE COURT: All right. Thank you. You may step down.  
24 You may call your next witness, Ms. Wiygul.

25 MS. WIYGUL: Respondent calls George VanHook.



QUENTIN D. MARKHAM - DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MS. WIYGUL

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1 Q. Are you prepared to take on that responsibility?

2 A. Yes, ma'am.

3 Q. And you understand that Dale will be on probation for  
4 the next five years?

5 A. Yes, ma'am.

6 Q. Okay. And you understand that he will require out-  
7 patient sex offender treatment?

8 A. Yes, ma'am.

9 Q. And are you prepared to see that he gets everything  
10 that he needs?

11 A. Yes, ma'am. Everything possible that I can do.

12 Q. I have no further questions. Thank you.

13 THE COURT: Any cross examination?

14 MR. FLORES: Nothing for this witness, Your Honor.

15 THE COURT: Thank you, sir. You may step down, Mr.  
16 VanHook.

17 A. Thank you.

18 MS. WIYGUL: Respondent calls Quentin Dale Markham.

19 THE COURT: Please come around, sir.

20 MADAME CLERK: If you'll place your left hand on the  
21 Bible, raise your right hand, please.

22 Quentin Dale Markham,  
23 being duly sworn testified as follows:

24 MADAME CLERK: Please state your name for the record.

25 MR. MARKHAM: Quentin Dale Markham.

QUENTIN D. MARKHAM - DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MS. WIYGUL

1 MADAME CLERK: Thank you. You may be seated.

2 Direct Examination by Ms. Wiygul:

3 Q. Dale, did you plead guilty to these four counts that  
4 have been discussed today?

5 A. Yes, ma'am.

6 Q. And did you do that because you were guilty?

7 A. Yes, ma'am.

8 Q. And did you ever try to deny guilt?

9 A. No. At first I was scared and I did try to deny, but  
10 it just came out after. Plus I had told the investigator

11 ---

12 Q. You told the investigator what you did?

13 A. Besides, I couldn't live like that anymore. I mean, I  
14 was drinking myself to death. You know, I was miserable.

15 And I was just so relieved when it finally came out.

16 Q. Dale, when did you start drinking?

17 A. I started when I was about fifteen. It didn't really  
18 progress until I was twenty-one.

19 Q. When you were twenty-one how much did you drink a day?

20 A. I started out about a six pack every evening, slowly  
21 progressed to a twelve. By the time -- probably three, four  
22 months into it I was drinking almost a case a day.

23 Q. When these offenses occurred how much were you drinking  
24 on a daily basis?

25 A. Over a case a day. Once a week when I'd cash my check

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1 I would get liquor on top of the beer. I was constantly  
2 drinking.

3 Q. Do you have a clear memory of exactly what you did?

4 A. Not all of it, no.

5 Q. Okay.

6 A. There's times and certain things that based -- the  
7 three young ladies said that I don't remember, ---

8 Q. Okay.

9 A. --- I don't remember doing, but like I said, you know,  
10 I never denied it.

11 Q. How does it make you feel today to know you did these  
12 things?

13 A. Embarrassed, ashamed. I've shamed my family, shamed  
14 myself. Eight years of my life gone because of it.

15 Q. When you pled guilty in January of 2005 did you  
16 understand that there was a possibility you could get sixty  
17 years?

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. And did you have any promise of leniency?

20 A. No.

21 Q. Did you have any -- did the State recommend a light  
22 sentence for you?

23 A. No.

24 Q. Why did you plead guilty?

25 A. Because I was guilty. And I wanted it to stop.

QUENTIN D. MARKHAM - DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MS. WIYGUL

1 Q. Okay.

2 A. I just -- the drinking, and the sickness and the  
3 constant shame. I ---

4 Q. Dale, what ---

5 A. --- just wanted it to stop.

6 Q. You don't -- you don't have to go into great detail. I  
7 think we have a pretty good understanding. But can you just  
8 tell us in general terms how your illness has progressed  
9 since 2005?

10 A. Well, my urinary fluid's stopped. I don't -- I retain  
11 all fluids. Everything I drink, everything I eat, I have to  
12 watch everything. And in my surroundings I can't do that  
13 because they don't offer foods, and drinks, the things I  
14 need.

15 Q. Can you use the bathroom like the rest of us?

16 A. No. No. I don't have any urination at all, ---

17 Q. How ---

18 A. --- fluids.

19 Q. How does that work?

20 A. It's just that dialysis removes the fluids from my  
21 blood. I can't -- I don't produce any urine. My kidney is  
22 gone. There's no kidney function whatsoever.

23 Q. Okay. And how many kidneys were you born with?

24 A. One.

25 Q. How many times have you ended up hospitalized over

QUENTIN D. MARKHAM - DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MS. WIYGUL

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1 this?

2 A. This was the second time that I was in overload.

3 Q. Okay.

4 A. And I wasn't familiar -- I didn't know that I was  
5 because my treatments, they go a certain weight and they  
6 pull a certain amount of weight. And either I've lost  
7 weight or something happens in my body that just causes it.

8 Q. Okay.

9 A. Collect too much fluid.

10 Q. All right. Now is your plan to live with your mother  
11 and your step-father?

12 A. Yes, ma'am.

13 Q. And do you plan to seek out-patient sex offender  
14 treatment?

15 A. From day one.

16 Q. And do you understand that you will be on probation for  
17 the next five years?

18 A. That's fine with me. All I ask is a chance to show  
19 them, ---

20 Q. Okay.

21 A. --- you know, that I'm not -- I'm not that person.

22 Q. Towards that end, Dale, prior to going to jail in 2005  
23 had you ever been to jail before?

24 A. No. I got arrested for DUS in Greer. And at the time  
25 I wasn't even -- didn't even know I was driving under

QUENTIN D. MARKHAM - CROSS EXAMINATION BY MR. FLORES

1 suspension then.

2 Q. Okay.

3 A. So, I mean, I've never been in trouble.

4 Q. I don't have any further questions. Thank you, Dale.

5 THE COURT: You may cross examine.

6 MR. FLORES: Beg the Court's indulgence for a moment.

7 THE COURT: Yes, sir.

8 (Pause)

9 Cross Examination by Mr. Flores:

10 Q. Good afternoon, Mr. Markham. I'm going to show you a  
11 document. It's taken from Respondent's exhibit -- from  
12 Respondent's exhibit 1. It's already been admitted into  
13 evidence. Would you identify what this is?

14 A. That's a -- I wrote in medical about the fluids and the  
15 food. And they say that they meet all standards, but they  
16 do not. If you get the standards from a dietician  
17 concerning dialysis patients they will tell you their diet  
18 does not meet standards.

19 Q. This document does say our diets meet all ADA  
20 standards, is that correct? That's what it says?

21 A. That's what that document says, sir. Yes, it does.  
22 But that is from the jail's medical facility.

23 Q. I'm going to show you a document and see if you  
24 recognize the handwriting. Mr. Markham, is that your  
25 handwriting?

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1 A. I don't remember this. And it doesn't look like all of  
2 my handwriting, no. Several pieces of it does not look like  
3 my handwriting. And this was wrote, if I'm not mistaken,  
4 when I was first arrested in 2003.

5 Q. So you recognize that ---

6 A. Oh, I recognize it, yes. It was wrote in 2003 when I  
7 was arrested, just coming off alcohol, very angry, very  
8 distraught, never been to jail a day in my life, scared. I  
9 said a lot of things I didn't mean because I was mad. You  
10 would be too if somebody just took your life like that. But  
11 I grew up when I accepted responsibility for what I did.

12 Q. Mr. Markham, who was this document sent to?

13 A. That was sent to my ex-wife. Like I said, I was very  
14 angry. She and along with her family was all involved in  
15 this whole situation. And I ---

16 MS. WIYGUL: Your Honor, I would ask that this matter  
17 be addressed outside the presence of the jury.

18 THE COURT: All right. Ladies and gentlemen, I'm going  
19 to ask you to go back to your jury room. Don't discuss the  
20 case. We'll see if we can finish this witness before we  
21 take a lunch break. I hope you can wait with us just a  
22 little bit. Just go back and we'll take care of this legal  
23 matter, and then we'll call you back.

24 (Whereupon the jury exited the courtroom at 1:18 pm)

25 MS. WIYGUL: Your Honor, we would ask that this

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1 document not be admitted into evidence under rule 403 as it  
2 would be much more prejudicial than probative as well as  
3 it's -- I'm drawing a blank here, as well as its relevance  
4 to this commitment proceeding. It's a letter that was  
5 written in 2003 to Mr. Markham's ex-wife in which he's  
6 basically just ranting.

7 MR. FLORES: Your Honor, we would submit that this  
8 letter was part of the evaluator's -- both evaluators had  
9 this letter, relied upon it in rendering their opinion as  
10 they've talked about the legal documents. Mr. Markham has  
11 authenticated this letter.

12 We think the contents are highly relevant about state  
13 of mind, also concerning his anger issues, which have been  
14 discussed. While Mr. Markham has discussed those issues, we  
15 think this is very much relevant for the jury to see in this  
16 case.

17 MS. WIYGUL: And, Your Honor, we would ---

18 MR. FLORES: We would ---

19 MS. WIYGUL: --- concede -- we would concede that the  
20 letter is definitely relevant to Mr. Markham's state of mind  
21 in 2003, but not today.

22 (Pause)

23 THE COURT: Mr. Flores, is this being offered for the  
24 purpose to show anger? I mean, is that the -- what  
25 relevance does it ---

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1 MR. FLORES: Well, Mr. ---

2 THE COURT: --- have? I know they evaluated it as part  
3 of his record, but ...

4 MR. FLORES: That's correct. And also what's been  
5 played out here at this time is that Mr. Markham came  
6 forward and was completely honest, completely -- came forth,  
7 pled guilty and expressed remorse at that time. This was  
8 written at about the same time and he expressed anger,  
9 resentment, wanted revenge. I think it's, you know, if this  
10 is -- the jury has one side of the story.

11 MS. WIYGUL: And, Your Honor, Mr. Markham just  
12 testified that initially he denied everything, that he did  
13 deny it at first, but then after he sat down and spoke with  
14 them he told them everything he did.

15 THE COURT: I believe the prejudicial effect would  
16 outweigh the probative value. I'll deny your request to put  
17 this in, Mr. Flores.

18 MS. WIYGUL: Thank you, Your Honor.

19 MR. FLORES: Your Honor, could we mark that as ---

20 THE COURT: Certainly we can have it as a Court exhibit  
21 for Appellate purposes.

22 (Whereupon Court's exhibit 1 was marked)

23 THE COURT: Are there any other documents that you may  
24 have that you ...

25 MR. FLORES: No, I have no other documents, Your Honor.

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1 THE COURT: That we might need to address now?

2 MS. WIYGUL: Your Honor, just for scheduling purposes,  
3 this will be our last witness.

4 THE COURT: Okay.

5 MR. FLORES: I don't believe I have any further  
6 questions, Your Honor.

7 THE COURT: You don't have anymore questions?

8 MR. FLORES: No.

9 THE COURT: Okay. All right. We'll -- all right. If  
10 the jury's ready, have them come in, Mr. Lynch.

11 (Whereupon the jury entered the courtroom at 1:24 pm)

12 THE COURT: Mr. Flores, you may continue your  
13 examination of the witness.

14 MR. FLORES: Thank you, Your Honor. I have no further  
15 questions for Mr. Markham.

16 THE COURT: Anything in redirect?

17 Redirect Examination by Ms. Wiygul:

18 Q. Dale, if you're released today are you ever going to  
19 make the same kind of mistakes again?

20 A. Never.

21 Q. What's going to stop you?

22 A. My family, the fact that they trust me and they love  
23 me. They've supported me all this time when nobody else  
24 would.

25 Q. And do you understand that you can't ever drink again?

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1 A. I don't ever want to see another drink as long as I  
2 live. It's took everything from me.

3 Q. I have no further questions. Thank you, Dale.

4 THE COURT: Thank you, Mr. Markham. You may step down.  
5 You may call your next witness, Ms. Wiygul.

6 MS. WIYGUL: Respondent rests.

7 THE COURT: Is there anything in reply from the State?

8 MR. FLORES: Nothing from the State, Your Honor.

9 THE COURT: Ladies and gentlemen, you've heard all the  
10 evidence now in the case. We're going to take a lunch  
11 break. And after that we'll be ready to let the attorneys  
12 address you in a closing statement, I'll instruct you on the  
13 law. The case will then be yours to decide. Of course,  
14 until that time you shouldn't be discussing it.

15 I'm going to let you go to lunch now. If you'll be  
16 back at 2:30 we'll be ready to start then. We'll give you  
17 time to get your lunch.

18 When you come back in after lunch I'm going to appoint  
19 Mr. Thompson to be the foreperson of the jury. If you'll  
20 just occupy the foreman's seat. He'll be the one who will  
21 help facilitate the discussions that you have when you do  
22 start your deliberations.

23 Hopefully you won't have to wait any when you come  
24 back. We have another jury coming in. We'll try to  
25 coordinate those matters so that we'll finish this case here

1 before we begin the other trial that we need to.

2 But if you have some needs, Mr. Foreman, of course,  
3 will be the one who will communicate with the Court, write  
4 out whatever need you have to the -- for the clerk, or for  
5 me on the law, and we'll certainly do our best to take care  
6 of that.

7 Have a good lunch, ladies and gentlemen. If you will  
8 be back at 2:30 we'll hopefully be ready to start at that  
9 time. Everyone else please remain seated.

10 (Whereupon the jury exited at 1:27 pm)

11 **THE COURT:** All right. We'll be at ease until 2:30.  
12 Be ready to make your statement. And my charge will be as  
13 before. Ms. Wiygul, so that you'll know what my plan is, at  
14 2:30 we're going to finish this one.

15 **MS. WIYGUL:** Yes, Your Honor.

16 **THE COURT:** I don't think y'all will argue very long.  
17 And then we'll get this one to the jury. And we'll have our  
18 other jury just wait and hopefully start it by 3:00 anyhow  
19 to be ready to start that one.

20 **MS. WIYGUL:** Yes, Your Honor.

21 **MR. FLORES:** Yes, Your Honor. We're ready to go as far  
22 as the State's ---

23 **MS. WIYGUL:** I don't believe the next one will be  
24 nearly as long.

25 **THE COURT:** Well, we'll take -- they'll only have to

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1 wait about forty-five minutes. That won't be too bad.

2 (Whereupon court was in recess at 1:29 pm)

3 (Whereupon court resumed at 2:42 pm)

4 **THE COURT:** All right. Y'all ready to proceed with  
5 your closing statements now?

6 **MR. FLORES:** Yes, Your Honor.

7 **MS. WIYGUL:** Yes, Your Honor.

8 **THE COURT:** Okay. If our jury is ready on the Markham  
9 case, you can have them come in.

10 (Whereupon the jury entered the courtroom at 2:43 pm)

11 **THE COURT:** All right. Mr. Foreman, ladies and  
12 gentlemen, we're now ready to proceed with the attorneys  
13 addressing you in their closing statements. You've heard  
14 the evidence. And this is not evidence, what they're going  
15 to say to you now, but I nevertheless urge you to listen as  
16 they address you, each of them, as they give you their  
17 analysis of the evidence. After that I'll instruct you on  
18 the law of the case. It'll be yours to decide then. Mr.  
19 Flores, you may address the jury in your closing.

20 **MR. FLORES:** Thank you, Your Honor. May it please the  
21 Court.

22 **THE COURT:** Yes, sir.

23 **MR. FLORES:** Ladies and gentlemen of the jury, before I  
24 start into my closing argument today I do want to thank you.  
25 Thank you from myself, from Alan Wilson, the Attorney

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1 General and the rest of our Office.

2 These cases are not simple cases. They involve taking  
3 away somebody's liberty interests. They involve history of  
4 past sexual conduct. You've heard all that. Those are not  
5 pleasant things. But we come to you with your knowledge and  
6 your experience to answer questions of fact that cannot be  
7 resolved any other way.

8 The question today is is Quentin Dale Markham a  
9 sexually violent predator? As I stated in my opening  
10 statement to you the State must bear the burden in this case  
11 to prove to you beyond a reasonable doubt that Mr. Markham  
12 is, indeed, a sexually violent predator.

13 I told you that a sexually violent predator is an  
14 individual who's been convicted of a sexually violent  
15 offense and also suffers from a mental abnormality or  
16 personality disorder that makes him more likely to commit  
17 acts of sexual violence. I also told you there would be two  
18 experts in this case, one testifying for the State, one  
19 testifying for Mr. Markham.

20 As to whether or not Mr. Markham has been convicted of  
21 a sexually violent offense, that's clear. He's been  
22 convicted of four. He testified himself that he pled guilty  
23 to each of those four counts because he, in fact, did do  
24 those things.

25 Now he tempered that admission with, well, I was on

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1 alcohol, and alcohol may be the blame. That's for your  
2 decision. But, regardless, he did -- he has been convicted  
3 of a sexually violent offense.

4 Does he suffer from a mental abnormality? Both experts  
5 agree Mr. Markham is a pedophile. He's attracted to  
6 females, non-exclusively, which means he is attracted to  
7 both children and to adults.

8 The heart of this case lies with the determination of  
9 whether the mental abnormality is such that he's likely to  
10 engage in further acts of sexual violence if he's not  
11 confined for long-term control, care and treatment. The  
12 crux of this case lies upon his medical condition.

13 You heard the opinions of both doctors, one for  
14 commitment and one against commitment. Dr. Mulbry  
15 testified, he's a psychiatrist, a licensed medical doctor,  
16 that he believed that looking at all the circumstances, and  
17 I'll go through those, offenses in 1998, an offense against  
18 -- in 1998 against a four year old girl, an arrest, a  
19 release on bond, three further offenses, all taking place  
20 under the confines of Mr. Markham's home.

21 He then pled guilty. He says he was remorseful. He  
22 says he was coming off of his alcohol. I asked him about a  
23 letter and he appeared to get agitated. Mr. Markham has not  
24 had sex offender treatment, but I do concede his condition  
25 worsened while he was at the Department of Corrections and

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1 he could not receive that.

2 Dr. Mulbry also testified that he considered the  
3 offenses because the best indicator of future conduct is  
4 past conduct. However, he said that's not the only thing I  
5 considered in this case. It's not the only thing that Dr.  
6 Jackson considered in this case. I considered assessments.  
7 I did a number of assessments 'cause that's my protocol, not  
8 the same protocol as Dr. Jackson's, but that's my protocol,  
9 my protocol that I follow that other sex offender or  
10 forensic psychiatrists follow as well.

11 They took a look at different assessments. Some helped  
12 clear the picture, some didn't. Some gave me no results at  
13 all. But I did them because that's what I do. And I also  
14 considered, Dr. Mulbry, considered heavily the kidney  
15 condition, which leads us back to the offenses. They're  
16 very intertwined in this case.

17 Sexual arousal, as Dr. Mulbry testified, is not just  
18 the ability to maintain an erection, but what is your  
19 attraction or attractiveness to others. There's no  
20 testimony received that Mr. Markham ever penetrated a child  
21 with his penis.

22 His offenses were very specific, fondling and oral sex.  
23 The fact that Mr. Markham suffers from erectile dysfunction  
24 or impotence, both of those described, does not preclude his  
25 further re-offense.

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1           Now Ms. Wiygul did bring out a very large stack of  
2           medical information. These are all Mr. Markham's treatment  
3           records since he's been at the Department, or I'm sorry,  
4           Greenville County Detention Center.

5           Dr. Mulbry said, well, that is what's going to happen.  
6           He has to go to dialysis three times a week. But that's  
7           still, in his opinion, professional opinion to a reasonable  
8           degree of medical certainty, he believes that that condition  
9           still does not preclude Mr. Markham from committing these  
10          same sexually violent offenses.

11          Now Dr. Jackson does not agree. She does not agree.  
12          Her opinion, as I asked her to read that opinion to you to  
13          make sure we clearly understood what her opinion was, is  
14          that he has low risk on an actuarial assessment, something  
15          that Dr. Mulbry also considered, did not have any dynamic  
16          risk factors or criminogenic need factors, something that  
17          Dr. Mulbry did also consider. But he believed that his --  
18          that Mr. Markham's sexual deviance or his sexual deviant  
19          arousal was of some importance in this case.

20          And Dr. Jackson said that the kidney disease will  
21          preclude him from doing these things again. I'd ask you to  
22          take a good look at that, between these two experts. One a  
23          medical doctor, psychiatrist, the other a psychologist.  
24          Don't rely just solely on the fact that Dr. Mulbry's a  
25          doctor. Look hard at that. Does this kidney problem

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1 preclude Mr. Markham from committing further sexually  
2 violent offenses?

3 Take your time, consider all the evidence. That's what  
4 I asked you at the beginning of the case, that's what I ask  
5 you now. Thank you for your time.

6 THE COURT: Ms. Wiygul, you may address the jury in  
7 your closing.

8 MS. WIYGUL: Ladies and gentlemen of the jury, when you  
9 go back to the jury room you're going to have this stack  
10 right here. You're going to have Mr. Markham's medical  
11 records for about the last thirteen months from the  
12 Greenville Detention Center. You're going to see what he  
13 suffers on a daily basis if you scan through those. You're  
14 going to see the cost for providing treatment for those  
15 conditions.

16 You're also going to have the documents that Mr. Flores  
17 introduced. And that's these here. I would urge you to  
18 take careful note of this page. This is called a sentencing  
19 sheet. Anytime that anyone pleads guilty or is convicted by  
20 a jury in a criminal case, one of these is filled out. It  
21 has a brief summary of everything, everything. It has the  
22 date of offense.

23 You'll see fifteen years written up here. Generally  
24 someone will make a little note about what the maximum  
25 amount of time is. And Dr. Mulbry agreed with me that these

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1 offenses carry a maximum of fifteen years each. So when he  
2 pled guilty he was looking at the possibility of sixty  
3 years.

4 How do we know that? Because this box down here is  
5 checked, without negotiations or recommendations. That  
6 means this wasn't a plea deal. He didn't get any charges  
7 dismissed for -- in return for pleading guilty. He just  
8 said I was wrong, and I am guilty, and I am willing to face  
9 whatever punishment the judge gives me.

10 What judge? Judge Welmaker. Right here. This is the  
11 judge that Mr. Markham stood in front of on January 11th of  
12 2005. And he heard everything about these cases. He heard  
13 the solicitor stand there and give a summary of each  
14 offense. He heard whatever victims wanted to come to that  
15 hearing and address the court before sentencing.

16 And I say all this just for you to keep in mind, you're  
17 not here to punish Mr. Markham. He's already been punished.  
18 You're here to decide whether it's safe to let Mr. Markham  
19 go home.

20 Let's discuss briefly, Mr. or Dr. Mulbry seemed to  
21 think it was a very big deal that three of these offenses  
22 were committed while Mr. Markham was out on bond. Well,  
23 let's think about this realistically.

24 Most people know someone with a drinking problem or  
25 have known someone with a drinking problem at some point in

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1 their life. Alcoholics don't think real clearly, not when  
2 they're drinking. We're talking about a man who had never  
3 been to jail. His only criminal offenses had been driving  
4 under suspension and an open container.

5 He didn't know what jail was like. He knows now. He's  
6 been there since 2005. But at that time all he'd done is  
7 posted some money, or paid a bondsman or somehow posted bail  
8 and continued drinking. And it was undisputed that he was  
9 drinking during every offense.

10 Now, I will take issue with one thing that Mr. Flores  
11 said during his closing. At no point did Mr. Markham blame  
12 these offenses on the alcohol. At no point did he do that.  
13 However, alcohol was a factor. Both doctors testified,  
14 alcohol lowers people's inhibitions. Realistically, people  
15 do things when they're drinking a lot that they would not do  
16 as a rational, sober person.

17 Now, Mr. Flores told you Dr. Mulbry gave assessments.  
18 No, he didn't. Dr. Dwyer gave assessments. Dr. Mulbry took  
19 the results of those assessments and considered them when  
20 coming to his opinion.

21 But everyone agrees what Dr. Mulbry found most  
22 important in forming his opinion was Mr. Markham's sexually  
23 deviant arousal. Mr. Markham suffers from pedophilia. By  
24 definition that is sexually deviant arousal. So, of course  
25 he suffers from it. That's what he's diagnosed with.

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1 But Dr. Mulbry also told you, this Act is not designed  
2 to lock up every pedophile for the rest of their life. And  
3 the Judge will tell you, this Act is aimed at a very  
4 specific limited class of really dangerous people. Mr.  
5 Markham's not one of them.

6 Dr. Jackson, when she was working as the chief  
7 psychologist down at the program evaluated Mr. Markham. And  
8 she does not feel like he needs to be there. She told you,  
9 Mr. Markham is not a sexually violent predator.

10 Mr. Markham is a pedophile. Mr. Markham is an  
11 alcoholic. And Mr. Markham has had so many medical  
12 conditions that it's just not realistic to believe that he  
13 would ever be in this position again. He's a different man  
14 now than he was back in 2005. He's been sober. And he'll  
15 continue to be sober because if he drinks he'll die a lot  
16 quicker. And he knows that.

17 His family knows that. And they're going to be caring  
18 for him. And they've already looked into getting him out-  
19 patient sex offender treatment because nobody's saying that  
20 he just needs to be let go and be on his merry way. No. He  
21 needs to finish the probation portion of his sentence.  
22 He'll be on probation for five years. He has, I guess, five  
23 more years, five or ten more years hanging over his head if  
24 he messes up.

25 Let's talk about all the tests that Dr. Dwyer

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1 performed. What did we find out from all that testing?

2 Well, we found out that Mr. Markham is an alcoholic. Well,  
3 we knew that. We found out that he suffers from sexually  
4 deviant arousal. Well, we knew that too.

5 The only new thing we found out from all those tests is  
6 that Mr. Markham suffers from severe anxiety. And that's  
7 just not relevant. That's not something that they would  
8 treat down there at this unit.

9 The Static-99 is the one test that everybody agreed on.  
10 And it came back with his score at 1, the lowest score you  
11 can have if you've ever been convicted of this type of  
12 offense. And that score takes into account all historical  
13 data.

14 So what are we looking at if Mr. Markham is released  
15 today? Five years of probation, out-patient sex offender  
16 treatment, he'll live with his mom and step-father, his  
17 family will absorb the cost of his treatment, they'll  
18 provide him with the care he needs.

19 What are we looking at if he's sent down to this  
20 program? Probably another seven years just like the past  
21 seven he's been treated because he does have to have  
22 dialysis three times a week. You heard, he asked for sex  
23 offender treatment while he was in the Department of  
24 Corrections.

25 He, just like after the second set of offenses, he

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1 voluntarily put himself into an alcohol rehab center because  
2 this is not a man that's saying I didn't do it. This is not  
3 a man that's making excuses. This is a man that says I have  
4 made mistakes, and they are bad ones. And I want to do  
5 whatever I need to do to make it right and make sure it  
6 never happens again.

7 And all he's asking for today is that chance. I would  
8 urge you to find today that Mr. Markham is not a sexually  
9 violent predator. Thank you.

10 **THE COURT:** Anything in reply, Mr. Flores?

11 **MR. FLORES:** No, Your Honor.

12 **THE COURT:** Mr. Foreman, ladies and gentlemen of the  
13 jury, it's now my responsibility to instruct you on the law  
14 of the case.

15 Let me remind you that in addition to presiding over  
16 the trial of the case and to rule on the admissibility of  
17 evidence it's my responsibility to instruct you on the law.  
18 You're to consider only the evidence that has been properly  
19 submitted to the Court, the matters marked as exhibits, the  
20 testimony that you've heard and that alone are you to  
21 consider.

22 As the judge of the law it's your responsibility to  
23 accept the law and apply the law as I state it to you now.  
24 Some of you may already have an idea of what the law is in a  
25 case such as this. You may have a notion about what the law

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1 ought to be in a case such as this. If you have such an  
2 idea and it's in conflict with what I now tell you the law  
3 is, then you must abandon such an idea because under your  
4 oath you've sworn to accept the law and apply the law just  
5 as I state it to you now.

6 Every case that's tried in this courtroom before a jury  
7 such as yourselves, that jury becomes the sole exclusive  
8 judge of the facts in a case. A trial judge can't comment  
9 on the facts in a case. He can't have an opinion about the  
10 facts.

11 Not only does the law of South Carolina prohibit that,  
12 the Constitution in our State prohibits a trial judge such  
13 as I from expressing or having any opinion about the facts.  
14 That's exclusively, totally up to you, ladies and gentlemen,  
15 to determine what the facts are.

16 Since I have no opinion about the facts, you're not to  
17 consider any rulings I've made on the admissibility of  
18 evidence, anything I've said during the course of the trial,  
19 anything I say to you now in this instruction to you that I  
20 have an opinion about the facts. I don't have an opinion.  
21 That's up to you, ladies and gentlemen, to determine what  
22 the facts are.

23 Now, to determine those facts you're going to need to  
24 judge the credibility of witnesses who've testified.  
25 Credibility simply means believability. It becomes your

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1 duty as jurors to evaluate that evidence and determine in  
2 your own mind which evidence convinces you of its truth.

3 You can believe one witness over several witnesses.

4 You can believe several witnesses over one witness. In your  
5 discretion you can believe part of the testimony of a  
6 witness and reject the remaining part of the testimony of  
7 that very same witness. In your discretion you can believe  
8 the testimony of a witness in its entirety, you can reject  
9 the testimony of a witness in its entirety.

10 You can consider whether any witness had a bias or a  
11 prejudice or any motive in the testifying in the case. You  
12 can determine the demeanor of the witness while on the  
13 witness stand. Was he or she straightforward or hesitant in  
14 answering? Was the answers given consistent or  
15 inconsistent? How did that witness' testimony stack up with  
16 other evidence that you've heard in the case?

17 These and other factors you can consider in determining  
18 the credibility of the witnesses. It's up to you and you  
19 alone to make that determination.

20 Now, I mentioned briefly to you that our rules of  
21 evidence would not allow a witness to give an opinion about  
22 any matter except for the occasion when we have an expert  
23 witness testifying. And such a witness, because of their  
24 education, and experience and training has become an expert  
25 in some field, the law allows them to give an opinion in

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1 that field of expertise and may also give the reasons for  
2 that opinion.

3 Now, like other evidence, you can -- should consider  
4 the expert opinion given by a witness, give it the weight  
5 that you think it deserves. If you decide that the witness'  
6 opinion is not based on sufficient education or experience  
7 or if you determine that the reasons given for that opinion  
8 by the expert are not sound or that the opinion is  
9 outweighed by other evidence, you can disregard that opinion  
10 entirely.

11 An expert witness' testimony is to be given no greater  
12 weight than that of any other witness simply because that  
13 witness is an expert. You don't have to accept an expert's  
14 opinion even though it may be uncontradicted. An expert's  
15 opinion, like other evidence, is up to you to determine the  
16 weight, the effect to give that testimony.

17 Now, this is a case brought by the State of South  
18 Carolina under the Sexual Violent Predator Act, the law  
19 that's enacted under the -- by the Legislature in South  
20 Carolina. One of the purposes of the requirements under the  
21 Act is to ensure that the involuntary commitment procedures  
22 are only used to control the limited subclass of dangerous  
23 persons and not broadly subject any dangerous person to what  
24 may be an indefinite term.

25 Now the State in this case alleges that the Respondent

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1 is a sexually violent predator, seeks to have the Respondent  
2 involuntarily committed in a secure facility for the long-  
3 term control, and care and treatment of that individual.  
4 The burden of proof is on the State to prove by sufficient  
5 evidence to satisfy each of you beyond a reasonable doubt  
6 that the Respondent is, in fact, a sexually violent  
7 predator.

8 If the State is unable to meet the burden of proof,  
9 then you should return a verdict finding that the Respondent  
10 is not a sexually violent predator. If the State does meet  
11 the burden of proof, then, of course, your verdict would be  
12 that the State has fulfilled its obligation and that the  
13 Respondent is, in fact, a sexually violent predator.

14 Most cases tried in civil court such as what we're in  
15 now, a petitioner only has the burden of proving a fact is  
16 more likely true than not true, such as by what is called  
17 the greater weight or the preponderance of the evidence.  
18 However, in this type of case the State's burden is proof  
19 more powerful than that. It's proof beyond a reasonable  
20 doubt.

21 What is a reasonable doubt under the law? Reasonable  
22 doubt is the kind of doubt that would cause a reasonable  
23 person to hesitate to act. It would be proof that would  
24 leave you firmly convinced that the Respondent is a sexually  
25 violent predator.

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1           Now, ladies and gentlemen, there are very few things in  
2 this world that we know with absolute certainty. And the  
3 law doesn't require proof that overcomes every possible  
4 doubt.

5           If, based upon your consideration of the evidence,  
6 you're firmly convinced that the Respondent is a sexually  
7 violent predator, then you must return a verdict for the  
8 State. If, on the other hand, you think there's a real  
9 possibility that the Respondent is not a sexually violent  
10 predator, you must give the Respondent the benefit of that  
11 doubt and find that he is not a sexually violent predator.

12           Now in order to establish the Respondent is a sexually  
13 violent predator the State must prove beyond a reasonable  
14 doubt that the Respondent has been convicted of a sexually  
15 violent offense. ~~Committing a lewd act upon a child has~~  
16 been designated by our State as an offense that would be a  
17 sexually violent offense.

18           The State must also prove beyond a reasonable doubt  
19 that the Respondent suffers from a mental abnormality or a  
20 personality disorder that makes him likely to engage in acts  
21 of sexual violence if not confined in a secure facility for  
22 long-term control, care and treatment.

23           A mental abnormality means that a mental condition is  
24 affecting a person's emotional capacity or a capacity to  
25 make conscious choices that make the person inclined to

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1 commit sexually violent offenses. Likely to engage in acts  
2 of sexual violence means the person's tendency to commit  
3 acts of sexual violence is of such a degree as to pose a  
4 menace to the health and safety of others.

5 Now, I've prepared a verdict form, Mr. Foreman. I  
6 believe it'll be self-explanatory for you. There's two  
7 possible verdicts that you can reach.

8 If you find the State has met its burden of proof  
9 beyond a reasonable doubt, then your answer would be, yes,  
10 that the Respondent is a sexually violent predator. If you  
11 find the State has failed in any way to meet its burden of  
12 proof, then your verdict would be, no, that he is -- that he  
13 is not a sexually violent predator.

14 There's no significance whatsoever in the way that  
15 they're listed. One has to be listed before the other.  
16 Once you've reached the verdict you simply sign your name as  
17 foreperson on behalf of your fellow jurors, date it, let the  
18 bailiffs know that you have reached your verdict and we'll  
19 receive it here back in the courtroom.

20 Your verdict must be unanimous. All twelve of you must  
21 agree upon the verdict. Your verdict can't be based upon  
22 sympathy, or passion, or prejudice, emotion or any other  
23 consideration not in evidence in the case.

24 Mr. Foreman, I'm going to ask you, if you will, go back  
25 to your jury room now with your fellow jurors. Don't

1 discuss the case just yet. We have a final matter of law I  
2 need to take care of with the attorneys.

3 After that, hopefully we'll have the exhibits sent back  
4 to you with the verdict form with instructions to begin your  
5 deliberations at that time. But for right now, do not  
6 discuss the case. I'll ask you to retire to your jury room.

7 (Whereupon the jury exited the courtroom at 3:15 pm)

8 **THE COURT:** Any exceptions to the charge, from the  
9 State?

10 **MR. FLORES:** None, Your Honor.

11 **THE COURT:** From the Respondent?

12 **MS. WIYGUL:** None from the Respondent, Your Honor.

13 **THE COURT:** Y'all make sure all your exhibits are in  
14 order. Here's the verdict form. I want to make sure you  
15 both have a chance to look over it and make sure we got  
16 everything spelled right and documented right.

17 (Whereupon the jury began deliberating at 3:17 pm)

18 (Whereupon court was in recess at 3:17 pm)

19 (Whereupon court resumed at 4:40 pm)

20 **THE COURT:** I understand we have a verdict in the case.  
21 Are there any matters we need to take care of before we  
22 receive the verdict, from the State?

23 **MR. FLORES:** Nothing from the State, Your Honor.

24 **THE COURT:** From the Defense?

25 **MS. WIYGUL:** Nothing from Respondent, Your Honor.

VERDICT OF THE JURY

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1 THE COURT: All right. Have the jury come in.

2 (Whereupon the jury entered the courtroom at 4:42 pm)

3 THE COURT: Mr. Foreman, I understand the jury has  
4 reached a verdict. Is that correct?

5 MR. FOREMAN: Yes, sir, we have.

6 THE COURT: Is it a unanimous verdict?

7 MR. FOREMAN: Yes, sir, it is.

8 THE COURT: If you would, please, hand the verdict form  
9 to the bailiff. Madame Clerk, you may publish the verdict.

10 MADAME CLERK: Your Honor, this is case number 2010-CP-  
11 23-9806, In the Matter of the Care and Treatment of Quentin  
12 Dale Markham, has the Petitioner, the State of South  
13 Carolina, proven beyond a reasonable doubt that Quentin Dale  
14 Markham is a sexually violent predator under the South  
15 Carolina Sexually Violent Predator Act? We, the jury,  
16 unanimously answer the question as follows; yes, Quentin  
17 Dale Markham is a sexually violent predator. Signed,  
18 Raymond Thompson, Foreperson, 3/21/12. If this is your  
19 verdict, so say you all. Please signify by raising your  
20 right hand.

21 (Whereupon all jurors raised their right hand)

22 MADAME CLERK: Thank you.

23 THE COURT: Are there any matters we need to take care  
24 of from the jury before they're discharged in this case,  
25 from the State?

1 MR. FLORES: Nothing from the State, Your Honor.

2 THE COURT: From the Defense?

3 MS. WIYGUL: Nothing from the Defense, Your Honor.

4 THE COURT: All right. Mr. Foreman, ladies and  
5 gentlemen, thank you very much for your service today. I'm  
6 sorry to have kept you waiting. We had another trial going  
7 on and we didn't have a chance to break until now.

8 You've been a conscientious group to work with this  
9 week. I can let you know now that the trial that we're now  
10 in will be the last one we have this week. We have some  
11 other matters, obviously, to take care of this week, but it  
12 won't involve a jury. So I can dismiss you for the rest of  
13 the week.

14 You've been a delightful group for me to work with.  
15 I've been honored to have that opportunity. You may  
16 remember from what we talked about on Monday that after  
17 serving this week you're excused for the next two years. If  
18 you get called to serve as a juror you can claim that  
19 exemption in 2013 or 2014. I hope you won't. If you do get  
20 called, I hope that you'll want to waive that exemption and  
21 serve again.

22 I'm confident that if you find yourself sitting in this  
23 courtroom, not in the jury box, but at one of these tables,  
24 you'll want jurors such as yourself of sound good judgment  
25 to sit in that box to hear your dispute that you may have

1 with the State, or with a neighbor, or another citizen or  
2 whomever it may be.

3 Some of you may need employment statements to show that  
4 you've been in jury service this week. If your employer  
5 does require that, I think Ms. Olson will be down in the  
6 assembly room, if you'll just stop by there this evening on  
7 your way out you can pick that up.

8 Thank you for your service very much, ladies and  
9 gentlemen. You're dismissed at this time. If you'll go  
10 with the bailiffs, they'll escort you out of the courtroom.

11 (Whereupon the jury exited the courtroom at 4:46 pm)

12 **THE COURT:** All right. Any other matters that we need  
13 to take care of from either side?

14 **MR. FLORES:** Nothing from the State, Your Honor.

15 **THE COURT:** All right.

16 **MS. WIYGUL:** Nothing from the Respondent.

17 **THE COURT:** Do you have a proposed order?

18 **MR. FLORES:** I have a proposed order.

19 **THE COURT:** I'll be glad to review it.

20 (Hearing Ended at 4:48 pm)



This matter comes before me on petition of the State of South Carolina for an order requiring the Respondent, Quentin Dale Markham, to submit to an examination and to be detained in an appropriate secure facility pending a trial, pursuant the Sexually Violent Predator Act (S.C. Code Ann. Sections 44-48-10 *et seq.*). A Probable Cause hearing was held on January 28, 2011 in Greenville; the State was represented by Assistant Attorney General Lloyd V. Flores, Jr., and the Respondent was personally present and represented by Elizabeth P. Wiygul, Esquire.

I have considered the showing made in respect to this matter and am of the opinion that probable cause exists to find that the Respondent is a Sexually Violent Predator as defined by S.C. Code Ann. Section 44-48-30.

**THEREFORE IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED:**

That the Respondent shall be:


- (a) Upon completion of his criminal sentence at the South Carolina Department of Corrections, transferred to and confined in the Greenville County Detention Center until a final disposition of this action; and
- (b) Transported to an appropriate facility of the South Carolina Department of Mental Health for an evaluation to determine whether the Respondent suffers from a mental abnormality or personality disorder that makes him likely to engage in acts of sexual violence if not confined in a secure facility for long-term control, care, and treatment.

The court-ordered examination shall be requested by the Office of the Attorney General of South Carolina and scheduled by the examining facility as soon as possible. The Respondent is to arrive at the examining facility at the time established by confirmed appointment with the staff of the examining facility. The Respondent continues under jurisdiction of this Court.

The qualified expert appointed by the Court at this Probable Cause hearing to examine the Respondent is Rebecca L. Jackson, Ph.D.

Within five days of the receipt of the written report of the examination by the Office of the Attorney General of South Carolina, said office shall make a copy of such examination available to the Respondent's attorney.
