PETITION TO EXCEED TWENTY-FIVE
PAGE LIMIT FOR A PETITION FOR
A WRIT OF CERTIORARI

The undersigned counsel would respectfully request an order allowing her to file a petition for writ of certiorari in this case in excess of the twenty-five-page limit imposed by Rule 243(e)(3), SCACR. In support of this motion, counsel would respectfully show the Court:

1. The petition for writ of certiorari and the appendix in this case are due on March 19, 2019. The appendix is almost three thousand pages. Petitioner was tried jointly with two co-defendants, and the trial transcript is over two thousand pages. At the PCR hearing, Petitioner raised numerous meritorious issues. At the PCR hearing, seven witnesses testified, including Petitioner and trial counsel. Judge Goldsmith's order denying relief is fifty-five pages long.


2. Counsel intends to raise three issues, but all three require a lengthy discussion of the facts. One issue involves a request for a new trial based on after-discovered evidence. Therefore, understanding the legal issue requires delving deep into the facts as presented at Petitioner's trial in contrast to the evidence presented during the PCR hearing.

3. Consequently, counsel respectfully moves that this Court allow her to file a petition for a writ of certiorari not in excess of thirty-five pages. Counsel will make every effort for brevity, and hopefully will be considerably short of that thirty-five page limit in the final analysis.

4. Opposing counsel, Lindsey McCallister, of the Office of the Attorney General, graciously does not oppose this request as indicated by her signature below.

WHEREFORE, undersigned counsel would respectfully request an order from this Court granting her the right to exceed the twenty-five-page limit of Rule 243(e)(3), SCACR. Counsel would also request that the order grant him the right to file a petition for a writ of certiorari in this death penalty case not in excess of thirty pages.




