2 being first duly sworn, testified as follows:

3 THE COURT: Mr. Green, have you had an opportunity to
4 review the citation and the agent's report against you?

5 MR. GREEN: Yes, ma'am.

6 THE COURT: And have you had an opportunity to do so
7 with your attorney and discuss that?

8 MR. GREEN: Yes, ma'am.

9 THE COURT: And what is your position as to whether or
10 not you've willfully violated the terms and conditions of
11 your probation?

12 MR. GREEN: Guilty.

13 THE COURT: Mr. Wehman?

14 MR. WEHMAN: Thank you, Your Honor, may it please the
15 Court. Mr. Green is 19. He went through the 11th grade. He
16 tells me he was enrolled in a GED program at Oak Grove
17 Church. He says he left that program, that it wasn't meeting
18 his specific needs, and he was planning on enrolling at
19 Trident Tech to get his GED. He has a girlfriend, who he
20 lives with. They have a child on the way, and it's due June
21 16th. One of the allegations is a change in address. He
22 tells me that he did change addresses in the same apartment
23 complex. He moved out with his mom and moved in with his
24 girlfriend to help her. He tells me that the next time he
25 actually reported they have a sheet where it says, have you

1 changed your address, and he wrote it down, but he didn't
2 call the moment it happened. He tells me that's the
3 confusion with his change in address. He's paying his own
4 bills at the moment. When he can't come up with the money,
5 his mom's helping him. His mom and his girlfriend are both
6 supporting him in the courtroom today. They're in the middle
7 of the courtroom. She suffers from vasculitis and
8 stiff-person syndrome, which I've never heard of until today,
9 Your Honor. She tells me it's making it hard for her to
10 work, but she's helping him out when she can. There's an
11 allegation of a missed appointment that's part of this
12 violation. He tells me that he went to that appointment. He
13 had a job at Pizza Hut that was set to start that very day.
14 He went in and told them about it, he said I have to be at
15 work, they said they'll have him out of there by 11:00, and
16 when 11:00 came up, he hadn't been called, and he noticed he
17 was far down on the list, and he said, can I leave, I have to
18 go to work, and they said, no, you have to stay, and he said,
19 I've got to leave because I've got to keep this job, so he
20 left. He came back at 2:30, when he got off of work, and was
21 told that it was too late, he had already violated, and he
22 admits that he left, and that's why it's a willful violation,
23 Your Honor. He did work at TGI Fridays for two to three
24 weeks. He was hired for a specific job as a fry cook. They
25 moved him to washing dishes, and he was unhappy about it

1 because it was not the job he thought he was hired for, his
2 hours were way down, and he was unhappy, and he talked to his
3 boss, and his boss said, are you unhappy with this, and he
4 said, yes, well, you can go home. I think that was a real
5 learning experience for him at 19 years old, getting a job,
6 that sometimes you have to do what you have to do. Since
7 then he's just now gotten a job at Snyder Rentals. He got it
8 last week he said. He loads and unloads trucks. That's
9 paying him 8.50 an hour, and he thinks he can get around 40
10 hours a week. It kind of varies based on demand. He's
11 behind in his moneys, and he understands that, but he says
12 with this new job and hopefully with his girlfriend
13 delivering and being able to go back to work that he thinks
14 that he can work on the arrearage that he has in his moneys.
15 There's also something in the report that he was given a list
16 of jobs and that he didn't do anything with them. He tells
17 me that he asked for help. He knew he was going to be
18 violated because he didn't have work and he wasn't paying.
19 He said that the list was provided to him, he contacted some
20 of these places and that they turned him down. He had just
21 been kicked out of his home, and eventually he did find work.
22 So I understand the officer's position, but at the same time,
23 I think he's finally gotten his feet under himself. He's got
24 a job. He wants to pay. He says he'll do anything he can.
25 Whatever you tell him to do, he'll do it. I'm sure his

1 girlfriend and his mother will make sure that he does it, and
2 we would just ask that you give him another chance on
3 probation. He understands that that was his second chance,
4 but he would just submit to whatever you would have him do.

5 THE COURT: Probation?

6 MR. BROWN: Your Honor, I'll address some of the points
7 that were made. Mr. Green has not been charged with missing
8 a report. His violations are leaving without submitting a
9 urine sample, which is a de facto positive drug test. Mr.
10 Green was told in no uncertain terms that he had to submit,
11 and it wasn't that he was far down on the list. When he was
12 taken back there, he could not go, and so I put him back in
13 the lobby, let him wait until he was able to go. And he just
14 said, you know, he had to be to work at 11:00, up and left,
15 and that's how that came about. We had an administrative
16 hearing, Your Honor, and I'm not a hearing officer, but I
17 kind of could gauge where the hearing officer was going to go
18 with her recommendation. Her original, probably -- like I
19 said, I'm not a hearing officer, but I believe that Mr. Green
20 would have been continued at that hearing if he would have
21 agreed to go into substance abuse treatment. He basically
22 stated that he didn't want to do treatment, and I was taken
23 aback by that because, I mean, here the hearing officer,
24 they're offering you a way out and trying to get him help for
25 his marijuana addiction, and he's saying that he doesn't want

1 to go to treatment. Then the hearing officer had no other
2 option but to forward this case to court and recommend
3 revocation in fact, just because he didn't want to go to
4 treatment, and he's probably still using up until that point.
5 I hadn't drug tested him today but, I mean, it seems like he
6 has a marijuana addiction.

7 THE COURT: Let's test him right now.

8 MR. BROWN: Okay.

9 MR. GREEN: Your Honor, I would be testing positive.

10 THE COURT: Okay. For what?

11 MR. GREEN: For marijuana.

12 THE COURT: Anything else?

13 MR. GREEN: And when I did have the hearing I told
14 Mr. Brown only reason I don't want to do treatment is because
15 I didn't have a job. I wouldn't have the money to pay for
16 it.

17 THE COURT: Well, Mr. Green, you know, it's troubling.
18 I appreciate your honesty in telling me that you would test
19 positive. Obviously this is not your first rodeo here.
20 You've already had one continuation. You refused to do the
21 drug test. You refused to accept treatment. I'm going to
22 revoke you. I'm going to follow the recommendation and
23 revoke you.

24 MR. WEHMAN: Thank you, Your Honor.

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


