I'm writing in regards to an extension for my pro se brief. In your previous letter, you said in order for me to get an extension, I have to show extraordinary circumstances in my situation.

Sir, ever since that riot happened in my Dorm, it has been very, very, very difficult to get anything done. I've wrote staff requests, in which is enclosed and I didn't receive these until this past Friday, I have done the grievance process twice, I've wrote General Counsel in Columbia since day one when this started happening. I have done everything I suppose to do to get this matter handled but things have only gotten worse. I don't know what more I can do to show you that I need this extension. I'm in a lockdown Dorm where the riot took place. I don't get my required time that I suppose to get at the law library because I'm constantly given the runaround. I don't get a shower but once every two weeks. I don't get the opportunity to use the phone to call family or legal. That riot has changed a lot of things and working on our cases are one of those things. We have gone from going everyday to the law library before the riot to going once a week for 2-3 hrs. on a certain day and if you have a deadline, the officers still don't honor the paperwork as they should.

Sir, I don't know what else to do or show. Things have only gotten worse, not just for me but my fellow brethren. Please, please, please find in your heart to help me with this dilemma so that I can get my brief done and get the case laws that I need to proficiently and professionally perfect my brief.

Thank you very much for your time and patience in the matter at hand. May God continue blessing you in your walk in life.


