**PETITION FOR EXTENSION TO FILE
INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT AND

Counsel filed the Johnson petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Jamal Hakeem v. State in the Supreme Court on March 5, 2019. Counsel filed the brief of petitioner in the case of Lucius Simuel v. State in this Court on March 4, 2019. Counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Jamie A. Makupson v. State in the Supreme Court on February 27, 2019. Counsel had an oral argument in the case of State v. Shane Adam Burdette with the Supreme Court on February 21, 2019. Counsel filed a petition for a writ of habeas corpus in the original jurisdiction of the Supreme Court in the case of Kinjta Kadeem Sadler v. State on February 19, 2019. Counsel filed the brief of respondent in the case of State v. Steven Otts in this Court on February 15, 2019. Counsel had an oral argument in the case of State v. Rickey Santoine Henley with this Court on February 12, 2019. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of State v. Gregory Sanders in this Court on February 11, 2019. Counsel filed the initial reply brief of appellant in the case of State v. Ricky L. Esaw in this Court on February 7, 2019.

3. This request is made in good faith, and not for purposes of delay.

4. As indicated by her consent below, counsel for the state graciously consents to or does not oppose this request.

WHEREFORE, the undersigned counsel would respectfully request a **final thirty-day extension until May 6, 2019** in which to file the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in this case. Counsel requests that the time limits for filing the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter be held in abeyance pending a ruling on this motion.




