COMPLAINT

The Plaintiff hereby alleges and shows unto this Honorable Court that:

1. The Plaintiff is a federally-chartered credit union, with its main office in Wake County, North Carolina.
2. Upon information and belief, the Defendant is a citizen and resident of Charleston County, South Carolina and is neither an infant nor incompetent.
3. The installment sale contract referred to herein was negotiated in Charleston County, South Carolina.
4. On or about May 4, 2008, the Defendant purchased and financed that certain 2008 Suzuki Forenza, VIN # KL5JD56Z38K748968 (the "Vehicle"), pursuant to the terms of a Retail Installment Contract of even date, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A."
5. As collateral for the monies borrowed under the Contract, the Defendant granted the creditor a purchase money security interest in the Vehicle.
6. The Contract was assigned to the Plaintiff and the Plaintiff is currently the sole holder of the same.
7. The Defendant subsequently defaulted in making the regularly-scheduled monthly payments due under the Contract.
8. As a federally-chartered credit union, no prior notice was

required of the Plaintiff to the Defendant regarding a right to cure the existing default under the Contract, as is generally applicable to consumer credit transactions pursuant to Section 37-5-110 of the South Carolina Code, Ann. 1976.

9. As a result, the Plaintiff peaceably repossessed and sold the Vehicle in accordance with the terms of the Contract and applicable law.

10. After the sale of the Vehicle, the Plaintiff applied the proceeds thereof to the Contract, after which there remained an unpaid balance due. A copy of the deficiency letter is attached hereto as Exhibit "B."

11. There is now due and payable to the Plaintiff by the Defendant under the terms of the Contract the principal sum of \$11,120.41.

12 A copy of the Defendant's complete payment history is attached hereto as Exhibit "C."

13. Pursuant to the Contract, the Defendant is also liable to the Plaintiff for interest in the amount of \$5,891.16 until October 9, 2013, thereafter accruing at the rate of 12.4000% per annum (\$3.78 per diem).

14. Pursuant to the Contract, the Defendant is also liable to the Plaintiff for any costs incurred by the Plaintiff in collection of this debt, including reasonable attorney's fees.

15. The Plaintiff's counsel has demanded payment by the Defendant of the outstanding balance due but the Defendant has failed and refused to pay same. A copy of said demand is attached hereto as Exhibit "D."


16. This law firm is a debt collector within the meaning of the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act This communication is an attempt to collect a debt, and any information obtained will be used for that

purpose.

WHEREFORE, the Plaintiff prays that this Court issue Judgment against the Defendant in the following particulars:

1. Principal sum of \$11,120 41;
2. Interest in the amount of \$5,891.16 until October 9, 2013, thereafter accruing at the rate of 12.4000% per annum (\$3.78 per diem) until date of judgment, and at the legal rate thereafter until satisfied;
3. Reasonable attorney's fees in the amount of \$2,551.74, that being 15% of the outstanding balance now due;
4. The costs and disbursements of this action.
5. Such other and further relief as the Court may deem just and proper.

1 FINANCE CHARACTERISTICS AND PAYMENTS

YOU WILL PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that Defendant, by and through the undersigned attorney, will move before the presiding Judge for the Ninth Judicial Circuit on the tenth (10th) day after service hereof or as soon thereafter as the Clerk may schedule for an Order, pursuant to Rules 12 (c) and Rule 56 (b) of the S.C.R.C P. granting summary judgment against the Plaintiff and dismissing the Complaint in this matter. This motion is based upon the following

- (1) The Plaintiff's Complaint filed in the above matter alleges that Defendant owes money for non-payment of a debt.
- (2) The Defendant timely filed her Answer and alleged therein the defense that the action is barred by the Statute of Limitations
- (3) The Defendant received from Plaintiff no documentation indicating any payments made by her after July, 2009 This action was not filed until October 21, 2013, more than three years after the last activity on the account.
- (4) §15-3-530 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina requires that an action upon a contract be commenced within three (3) years §15-3-610 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina provides that the cause of action shall be deemed to have accrued from the time of the last item proved



COMES NOW Coastal Federal Credit Union, by and through the undersigned attorney, and files this Memorandum of Law in support of its pending Motion For Summary Judgment as follows

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

1. On or about May 4, 2008, the Defendant entered into a transaction with a South Carolina retail car dealership (the "Dealership") for the sale of goods, namely that certain 2008 Suzuki Forenza, VIN KL5JD56Z38K748968 (the "Vehicle") As part of this transaction, the Defendant executed a retail installment sale contract (the "Contract") in the original principal sum of \$18,448 94, with interest accruing thereon at the rate of 12 4000% per annum See Exhibit "A" attached to the Plaintiff's Verified Statement and Affidavit

2. The Contract was thereafter assigned by the Dealership to the Plaintiff, thereby placing the Plaintiff in the shoes of the Dealership with respect to the Contract, as described in the "holder provision" at the bottom of page 2 of the Contract

3 Pursuant to the terms of the Contract, the Defendant agreed to pay for the Vehicle via 72 monthly payments of \$366.32 each beginning June 18, 2008

4 In July 2009, the Defendant ceased making the payments due under the Contract See the payment history attached as Exhibit "D" to Plaintiff's Verified Statement and Affidavit

5. As a result, the Plaintiff peaceably repossessed the Vehicle and mailed the Defendant a notice of its intent to sell the Vehicle if payment in full of then outstanding balance due under the Contract was not paid in full See Exhibit "E" to Plaintiff's Verified Statement and Affidavit

6 The Defendant did not exercise her right to redeem the Vehicle and it was sold by the Plaintiff as permitted by the Contract and applicable law, following which the net sales proceeds were applied to the Contract balance

7 Following the sale of the Vehicle, the Plaintiff mailed the Defendant the statutory post-sale accounting detailing the application of the sales proceeds for the Vehicle and demanding payment for the then-remaining balance due under the Contract after the sale See

Exhibit "I" to Plaintiff's Verified Statement and Affidavit.

8 The Defendant thereafter failed and/or refused to pay the Plaintiff the remaining balance due under the Contract, and the Defendant's account was referred to the undersigned counsel

9 The undersigned counsel also made demand upon the Defendant to pay the then-remaining balance due under the Contract but the Defendant continued to fail and/or refuse to pay the same

10 Accordingly, the instant lawsuit was filed by the undersigned counsel on October 21, 2013, seeking a judgment against the Defendant for the remaining purchase price owed for the Vehicle

11 The Defendant filed an Answer to that Complaint alleging that the applicable statute of limitations for filing suit to collect the remaining balance due under the Contract had expired

12 The parties have now filed competing Motions For Summary Judgment, agreeing that there is no dispute as to any material fact in this case and that this case is appropriate for resolution by the Court as a matter of law

ISSUE PRESENTED

Is the statute of limitations applicable to this case (i) the 3-year statute of limitations for breach of contract actions in general as set forth in §15-3-530 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina or (ii) the 6-year statute of limitations applicable specifically to breaches of sales contracts as set forth in § 36-2-725 of Chapter 2 of the South Carolina Uniform Commercial Code?

ARGUMENT AND AUTHORITIES

1. **The Contract In Issue Is A Chapter 2 Sales Contract** Pursuant to § 36-2-102 of the South Carolina Uniform Commercial Code (herein the "SC UCC"), the provisions of Chapter 2 – Sales apply to all "transactions in goods" between a buyer and seller. For these purposes, "buyer" is defined as a person who buys or contracts to buy goods and "seller" is defined as a person who sells or contracts to sell goods. See § 36-2-103. "Goods" is then defined as all things which are moveable at the time of identification to the contract for sale § 36-2-105(1). Financing agency is then defined as a bank, finance company or other person who in the ordinary course of its business makes advances against goods or documents of title § 36-2-104(2).

In the instant case, it is undisputed that the Defendant (buyer) contracted with the Dealership (seller) to buy the Vehicle and the Plaintiff (financing agency) provided the financing to the Defendant in that buy-sell transaction. It is also undisputed that the Defendant did not perform her obligation to pay for the Vehicle in accordance with the terms of the Contract, thereby committing a breach of same. As such, the Contract falls squarely within the express

provisions of Chapter 2 of the SC UCC as a “transaction in goods” to which Chapter 2 is specifically directed

2 **This Action Was Commenced Pursuant To The Provisions of Chapter 2 Of The SC UCC, And Neither The SC Consumer Protection Code Nor The Fair Debt Collection Practices Act Are Applicable** As an initial matter, inasmuch as it is a federally chartered credit union, the Plaintiff is exempt from the provisions of the South Carolina Consumer Protection Code in its entirety. See § 37-1-202(10). Further, the provisions of the Fair Debt Collections Practice similarly do not apply to the Plaintiff inasmuch as it is attempting to collect a debt that is owed to it, as opposed to collecting a debt on behalf of another creditor. See 15 U.S.C. § 1692a(6). Accordingly, the Defendant’s assertions that the case is “governed by the South Carolina Consumer Protection Code and the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act” are not sustainable as a matter of law, notwithstanding any prior decisions by other South Carolina trial courts to the contrary.

Moreover, while the Plaintiff does not dispute the Defendant’s assertion that the SC UCC sets out protections for buyers and sellers of “commercial” goods, this Court should note that both the South Carolina Court of Appeals and the South Carolina Supreme Court have had no issue with including motor vehicles as the type of goods covered by Chapter 2 of the SC UCC. See *e.g.*, *Brewer v Stokes Kia, Isuzu, Subaru, Inc.*, 364 S.C. 444, 613 S.E.2d 802 (S.C. App 2005) and *Singleton v Stokes Motors, Inc.*, 358 S.C. 369, 595 S.E.2d 461 (S.C. 2004). In each of these cases, the Court looked directly to Chapter 2 of the SC UCC to analyze the buyer’s and seller’s respective obligations in a breach of contract dispute involving the purchase and sale of a motor vehicle by a consumer from a retail motor vehicle dealership.

Further, the Defendant argues that the “special protection” of repossession contained in the Contract is not “covered by the Commercial Code,” which the Defendant apparently believes somehow removes the parties’ Contract from the scope of Chapter 2 of the SC UCC. However, that argument totally ignores the fact that the SC UCC includes not only Chapter 2 relating to sales of goods, but also Chapter 9 relating to the rights of secured lenders involved in those sales transaction, specifically including a seller/creditor’s right to repossess and sell the goods in question in the event the buyer fails to pay the purchase price for those goods as agreed.

Finally, the Defendant argues that the Plaintiff is “now suing over an alleged deficiency” and that this “case is an action to collect a debt,” which the Defendant apparently also believes somehow removes the parties’ Contract from the scope of Chapter 2 of the SC UCC. The Plaintiff does not take issue with either of those assertions, but states that these facts simply have no legal effect with respect to the question at hand. Sec. 36-2-301 expressly sets forth the general obligations of the parties to a Chapter 2 contract, *i.e.*, the seller is to transfer and deliver the purchased goods and the buyer is to accept and pay for those goods *in accordance with the contract* (*emphasis added*). The Complaint against the Defendant in this case clearly sets forth the Defendant’s payment obligations under the Contract for the purchase of the Vehicle, and clearly claims that the Defendant has breached the Contract by failing to pay for the Vehicle in accordance with the Contract’s terms. No other claim/cause of action against the Defendant is stated in the Complaint. Therefore there can be no dispute that, by this action, the Plaintiff is solely attempting to enforce its right to demand performance by the Defendant of her contractual payment obligations under a contract for the purchase and sale of goods, thereby bringing it

under the ambit of Chapter 2 of the SC UCC notwithstanding the various other characterizations and/or nomenclature applied by the Defendant to this action

3 **Established Rules Of Statutory Construction Dictate That A Specific Statute Prevails Over A More General One Dealing With The Same Subject Matter.** In the case of *Atlas Food Systems and Services, Inc v Crane National Vendors, et al*, 319 S C 556, 462 S E 2d 858 (1995), the South Carolina Supreme Court specifically discussed the interplay between the 3-year statute of limitations generally applicable to actions for breach of contract and the 6-year statute of limitations in Chapter 2 of the S C UCC. In that case, the Court first reiterated the general rule of statutory construction holding that a specific statute prevails over a more general one. It also held that the enactment of a later general statute does not repeal an earlier more specific statute. As such, the Court declined to find that the 1988 amendment to the general contract statute of limitations reducing it from 6 years to 3 years impliedly repealed or reduced the 6 year statute of limitations applicable at that time (and still applicable) to breaches of contract covered by the SC UCC. As such, the 6-year statute of limitations found in Chapter 2 of the SC UCC still applies -- and prevails -- when the suit in question is for breach of a Chapter 2 sales contract.

4 **There Is No Inherent Conflict Between The Two Statutes of Limitation For Breach Of Contract.** Perhaps more importantly, the *Atlas* Court also found there to be no inherent conflict between the general statute of limitations for breach of contract actions contained in § 15-3-530 and the more specific statute of limitations for breach of sales contracts contained in § 36-2-725. "The U.C.C. statute of limitations applies to actions arising under that act, while § 15-3-530(1) applies to other types of general contract actions." 319 S C at 558, 462 S.E.2d at 859. Accordingly, the fact that there may be two statutes of limitation applicable to this particular case does not create a situation in which the Court herein is left to resolve competing dictates. As the South Carolina Supreme Court has clearly stated, "[a]ctions arising under Article 2 of the U C C are governed by § 36-2-725's statute of limitations," and any implication otherwise in any prior decisions is no longer good law. 319 S.C. at 559, 462 S E 2d at 859.


CONCLUSION

There is no dispute between the parties as to the material facts leading up to this case. Neither the SC Consumer Protection Code nor the Fair Debt Collections Practices Act have any application to this case as a matter of law. As evidenced by the undisputed terms of the parties' Contract and the plain language of Chapter 2 of the SC UCC, this case arises solely from a "transaction in goods" and the Plaintiff is suing the Defendant solely for her failure to pay for those goods in accordance with the terms of the buy/sell agreement for same. The fact that the Contract and Chapter 9 of the SC UCC gave the Plaintiff the right to repossess and sell the goods upon a payment default by the Defendant does not, as a matter of law, remove the Plaintiff's breach of contract claim from the ambit of Chapter 2 of the SC UCC or "transform" the nature of the Plaintiff's legal claim against the Defendant herein for breaching her obligations under the Contract.

Further, although the Plaintiff's breach of contract claim against the Defendant may well be subject to both the general 3-year statute of limitations and the specific 6-year statute of limitations contained in Chapter 2, the South Carolina Supreme Court has made clear that (1) a

more specific statute will prevail over a general statute dealing with the same subject matter and (i) when a civil action is filed alleging a breach of a Chapter 2 sales contract, the 6-year statute of limitations found in Chapter 2 is the appropriate statute of limitations to apply to the case. In this case by which it is clearly suing on a Chapter 2 sales contract, the Plaintiff indisputably filed within the applicable 6-year statute of limitations and is entitled to judgment as a matter of law against the Defendant for the remaining balance due on the purchase price of the Vehicle. Plaintiff's Motion For Summary Judgment should be granted and the Defendant's Motion For Summary Judgment should be denied.



**MEMORANDUM OF LAW
IN SUPPORT OF DEFENDANT'S
MOTION FOR SUMMARY JUDGMENT**

On May 8, 2008 Ms. Brown purchased and financed a vehicle from Johnny's Subaru Isuzu LLC. The car was financed through Coastal Federal Credit Union. Ms. Brown defaulted in making her monthly payments in 2009 with her last payment being in July of that year, according to the Plaintiff's payment history. The Plaintiff, a federally-chartered credit union, had the right of repossession under the contract and sale of the vehicle Plaintiff exercised that right a repossessed the vehicle in October 2009. The Plaintiff then sold the car and applied the proceeds from the sale to the account. The Plaintiff's Complaint, marked "Debt Collection," was filed on October 21, 2013, more than three years from the time of Ms. Brown's default.

This case is an action to collect a debt. The statute of limitations in this case is three years under S.C. Code § 15-3-530. The debt arose from a deficiency after a repossession and sale of an automobile. After the repossession and sale, the deficiency alleged becomes an unsecured debt. The resulting actions taken by Plaintiff are those to collect a debt, including the cause of action in Plaintiff's Complaint of debt collection.


The contract in this case is a retail installment contract. Accordingly it is governed by the South Carolina Consumer Protection Code and the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act. The South Carolina Commercial Code does not grant the transaction at issue a lengthened statute of limitations. The Commercial Code sets out protections for buyers and sellers of commercial goods. The case at issue involves a deficiency which resulted after repossession of the automobile. The contract for the sale of the car contained a special protection to the seller, authorized by law, of repossession. This special protection is not provided to the contracts covered by the Commercial Code. Plaintiff utilized the right of repossession and is now suing over an alleged deficiency. In this case the special remedy of repossession as provided in the contract has already been exhausted; the car has already been repossessed and sold.

Plaintiff will argue that this case falls under the statute of limitations for a contract for the sale of goods under the UCC, which is six years. SC Code § 36-2-725 (2013). There have been no reported South Carolina cases supporting the assertion that the seller/financer in a deficiency action is entitled to a six (6) year statute of limitations. Such a lengthened statute of limitations period would afford an additional and improper advantage to one party over the other, whereas a three-year statute of limitations provides some protection for the consumer.

In one of Plaintiff's recent cases, Coastal Federal Credit Union v. Cobia, the honorable Judge W. Jeffrey Young determined that a three year statute of limitations was appropriate. The facts of that case were substantially similar to this case. In Coastal, Plaintiff sought a deficiency after the repossession. Plaintiff filed that action more than three years after default. The deficiency was considered a defaulted debt. Plaintiff filed

the action for collection of a debt. For this reason Judge Young ruled the South Carolina Consumer Protection Code and Fair Debt Collection Practices Act apply to these contracts. As the action sought the collection of a defaulted debt, it fell under the general limitations statute of three years. Judge Young granted summary judgment based on the conclusion that the three year statute applied. (See attached order)

The Plaintiff filed this action as a debt collection for which the court should grant Ms. Brown Summary judgment on the grounds that the Statute of Limitations has run. §15-3-610 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina provides that the cause of action shall be deemed to have accrued from the time of the last item proved. In this case the Defendant's last payment was in July of 2009. The Complaint was filed in October of 2013, more than three years from the last item proved. Accordingly, Plaintiff's action should be dismissed with prejudice.

This matter came before the Court on September 4, 2013 for a hearing on the Defendants' Motion for Summary Judgment. The Defendants' Summary Judgment Motion was based on the three (3) year statute of limitations found in Section 15-3-530 of the S.C. Code. While the Plaintiff contends the six (6) year statute of limitations found in Section 36-2-725 for breach of contract under the South Carolina Commercial Code applies. Appearing at the hearing was the Defendants' attorney Clifford C. McBride and representing the Plaintiff was Sarah Dalonzo-Baker, Esq.

After reviewing the Court file, documents presented by counsel, hearing counsels' respective arguments and reviewing the attorney submissions/briefs after the hearing, I hereby make the following findings:

1. The transaction for the purchase of the 2005 Chevrolet Blazer vehicle in this case was a retail installment sales contract between the Defendants and Gibbs automobile dealership.
2. The installment sales contract was assigned by the dealership to the Plaintiff, Coastal Federal Credit Union.

3 Since the transaction involving this vehicle was a retail installment sales contract, it is governed by the South Carolina Consumer Protection Code and the Fair Debt Collection Practices act.

4. The action before the Court is an action for the collection of a defaulted debt and is not an action for breach of contract under a Uniform Commercial Code filing. The Plaintiff, in its pleadings, is only seeking the collection of the amount of an alleged debt with fees and costs.


5. This being an action to collect a defaulted debt makes the three (3) year statute of limitations found in Section 15-3-530 of the S.C. Code applicable.

6. This action was not commenced against the Defendants within three (3) years required by Section 15-3-530 a fact that Plaintiff's Counsel admitted at the hearing.



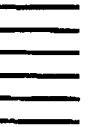

THIS MATTER comes before the court upon Plaintiff and Defendant each filing a Motion for Summary Judgment Defendant based her Motion for Summary Judgment on the three (3) year statute of limitations found in Section 15-3-530 of the S.C. Code Plaintiff based its Motion for Summary Judgment on the six (6) year statute of limitations found in Section 36-2-725 of the S C Code Defendant was present for the hearing with her attorney Matthew M. Billingsley, Esq Sarah Dalonzo-Baker, Esq appeared for the Plaintiff.

Based on arguments set forth by the parties, the pleadings, submissions of the parties, and documents on file, the court finds as follows

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1 Defendant purchased a 2008 Suzuki Forenza from Johnny's Subaru Isuzu, LLC ON My 4, 2008. The transaction was a retail installment sales contract
- 2 Johnny's Subaru Isuzu, LLC assigned the contract to the Plaintiff also on May 4, 2008
- 3 Defendant subsequently defaulted on her payments with the last payment being in July 2009

- 4 Plaintiff repossessed the vehicle in October 2009 and sold the vehicle on November 19, 2009 Plaintiff applied the proceeds of the sale to the balance of the loan and notified Defendant of the resulting deficiency by letter dated November 24, 2009.
- 5 Plaintiff originally filed this Complaint against this Defendant on October 21, 2013 in Chesterfield County. The parties agreed that Charleston County was the proper venue and the case was transferred to Charleston County by consent order March 17, 2014.
6. Plaintiff sought the relief of collection of a defaulted debt with fees and costs in its Complaint The action before the Court is for the collection of a defaulted debt

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


1. After Plaintiff repossessed and sold the vehicle, it applied the proceeds to the balance of the loan This resulted in a deficiency owed by Defendant. Plaintiff's action is one to collect the defaulted debt of the deficiency
2. The three (3) year statute of limitations found in Section 15-3-530 of the S.C. Code applies to this action to collect a deficiency debt. In as much as the sale of the repossessed vehicle was on November 19, 2009, more than three years elapsed from that date before Plaintiff filed their Complaint on October 21, 2013
- 3 The South Carolina Consumer Protection Code and the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act apply to this case.
4. Section 15-3-610 of the S.C. Code provides that the cause of action shall be deemed to have accrued from the time of the last item proved







15 however, we have filed, along with our motion for summary
16 judgment, which was filed on -- well, which was signed on
17 April 25th, we filed a verified statement of account and
18 affidavit which lists out the date of default, when the
19 payments stopped coming and that the vehicle was repossessed
20 and sold. So we feel like based on the pleadings and the
21 affidavit filed that there is no genuine issues to any
22 material fact.

23 THE COURT: Okay. What's your response?

24 MR. BILLINGSLEY: Our motion is based on statute of
25 limitations. First, while there is not a disputed issue of

1 fact as far as whether or not the car was repossessed and
2 that there is an amount of debt owed, if our statute of
3 limitations fails, then the issue of material fact that we
4 would argue would be to the actual amount of the debt or the
5 amount dealing with how much they sold the car for, etc. It
6 would not be a liability, it would be essentially an amount
7 kind of an argument. Our statute of limitations is based on
8 the last payments being made by my client were in 2009.
9 That's, as verified by their complaint and the attachments to
10 their complaint, more than three years prior to the filing of
11 this action that they filed in October of 2013. They do
12 argue a case, basically this exact same issue has been before
13 the Circuit Court before, but there's not really a reported
14 case from the Court of Appeals or Supreme Court that
15 specifically sets out the plaintiff's argument that a
16 six-year statute of limitations applies under UCC as a sales
17 contract. Our position is that the three-year statute of

20 THE COURT: By whom?

21 MR. BILLINGSLEY: It was heard by Judge Young, so it is
22 not precedent, and we recognize that.

23 THE COURT: You would agree, would you not -- and I
24 think it's an interesting issue, I really do, you've briefed
25 that, and I appreciate that. Do you concede that this

1 transaction was governed and under the UCC?

2 MR. BILLINGSLEY: I don't know if I would concede.

4 there's some debt that clearly is under it. It involves a




