
1. The petition for writ of certiorari and appendix are due to be served and filed with the Court today.
2. Counsel for Keenan Coakley respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. 

Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Joey Clark v. The State of South Carolina with this Court on April 24, 2019. Counsel filed the Anders brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State of South Carolina v. Jimmy Byron Keith Curles with the Court of Appeals on April 16, 2019. Counsel filed the return to petition for writ of certiorari in the case of The State of South Carolina v. Marshall Hill with this Court on April 9, 2019. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State of South Carolina v. Levance Dunham with the Court of Appeals on April 5, 2019. Counsel filed the brief of petitioner in the case of The State of South Carolina v. Maurice A. Odom with this Court on April 3, 2019.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.
5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office has been informed of this request.

WHEREFORE, the undersigned counsel would respectfully request a thirty day extension, in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in this case based upon the above exigent circumstances. 


