
Appellant hereby moves pursuant to Rule 263(b), SCACR, for a 30-day extension of the time in which to serve and file Appellant's Initial Reply Brief and any accompanying Designation of Matter to be Included in the Record on Appeal in this case. The grounds for this motion are that there is good cause to grant the requested extension, as the following shows:

1. The deadline for service and filing of Appellant's Initial Reply Brief and any accompanying Designation of Matter to be Included in the Record on Appeal is Monday, June 3, 2019.
2. This is the first extension of this deadline that Appellant has sought in this appeal.
3. Though Respondent served its initial brief on May 24, 2019, Appellant's counsel did not receive it until Wednesday, May 29, 2019.
4. Among other crimes, the Appellant in this case was convicted of murder, for which he was sentenced to 45 years' imprisonment. To say that the stakes are high is an understatement. The Appellant needs the best work possible done on this appeal.
5. The undersigned counsel is a private practitioner who was appointed to represent the Appellant in this case through a continuing legal education pro bono program coordinated with the Office of Appellate Defense.

6. Respondent's brief is 50 pages long – the maximum length its brief is allowed to have. Appellant's counsel needs time to review the brief in order to reply adequately to it.
7. Appellant's counsel also has numerous upcoming court appearances, including a jury trial set for the week of June 17, 2019.
8. Appellant's counsel believes there is good cause to grant the requested extension of this deadline.

WHEREFORE Appellant prays for an order extending the time in which to serve and file Appellant's Initial Reply Brief and Designation of Matter to be Included in the Record on Appeal by 30 days.


