MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Counsel for Mr. Andre Green respectfully requests a **final extension of thirty (30) days until March 6, 2013**, in which to file the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a fifth request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter is due to be served and filed with the Court today, February 4, 2013.
2. Counsel for Mr. Green respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage his caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.



State in Andre Martin v. State in the Supreme Court. On January 14, 2013, counsel filed the brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Christopher E. Russell with this court. On January 11, 2013, counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in Jose Tello v. State in the Supreme Court. On January 9, 2013, counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in Theodore Kyinoo v. State in the Supreme Court. On January 8, 2013, counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in Donald Whetherall v. State in the Supreme Court. On December 21, 2012, counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari with this court in State v. Marcus Addison. On December 20, 2012, counsel filed the brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Stephon Robinson with this court. On December 18, 2012, counsel filed the brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Mitchell Akeem House with this court. On December 14, 2012, counsel filed the brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Joe Ward with this court. On December 10, 2012, counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in Mayron Rashad Gilree v. State in the Supreme Court. On December 5, 2012, counsel filed the brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Alex Robinson with this court.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.


5. As indicated by signature below, Salley W. Elliott, of the South Carolina Attorney General's Office, does not oppose this request.


