

ORDER

Appellant received written notice of entry of the order on appeal on May 7, 2019. Appellant served the administrative law court with the notice of appeal on June 11, 2019. *See* Rule 203(b)(6), SCACR ("When a statute allows a decision of the administrative law court . . . to be appealed directly to the Supreme Court or the Court of Appeals, the notice of appeal shall be served on . . . the administrative law court . . . and all parties of record within thirty (30) days after receipt of the decision."); *Elam v. S.C. Dep't of Transp.*, 361 S.C. 9, 14–15, 602 S.E.2d 772, 775 (2004) ("The requirement of service of the notice of appeal is jurisdictional, i.e., if a party misses the deadline, the appellate court lacks jurisdiction to consider the appeal and has no authority or discretion to 'rescue' the delinquent party by extending or ignoring the deadline for service of the notice."). Because Appellant failed to timely serve the notice of appeal on the administrative law court, this appeal is dismissed.¹ The remittitur will be sent as required by Rule 221(b), SCACR.
