In the Appeal from the Administrative Law Court, I Alieo Garga-Richardson (Appellant Pro-Se) move to request the South Carolina Court of Appeals for additional time to file the Records on Appeal due to the following;

Due to existential circumstances beyond my control, I cannot do other than to request for additional time to submit the Records on Appeal.

Circumstances

- 1) I was unemployed during the months of March, April and May of 2019. My efforts to secure employment have been circumvented by the fact that the Department of Motor Vehicle has my driving privileges listed as suspended. I work as an Electrician most of the time and sometimes as an Independent Contractor. During those three months, most of the Jobs I applied for required a background check and a drug test. Specific amongst their requirements was the possession of a valid driver's license.
- 2) I manage to secure an assignment as an independent contractor through a website called 'Field Nation'. Enroute to an assignment to commission an 'Electric Charging Station' for automobiles, the timing belt of the vehicle in which I was traveling broke requiring time and expense to repair.
- 3) After this, I manage to secure employment with Grus Staffing out of Atlanta/Florida to assist in the remodeling of a Walmart located in Lancaster, SC. This assignment required that the work be done at night. Start time 9pm – 7am or 9am. This lasted a couple of weeks because I took a few days off trying to meet the deadline to submit the Records on appeal.

The primary reason for this request is as a Pro-se litigant, I need time to research and present this matter in a manner that conforms to the rules and standards of the appellate process.

In so stating, I rely on the precedence set forth in ReDonna Maxwell and George Maxwell, Appellants, v. Beverly M. Genex and John Doe, Respondent. Opinion # 3511 heard April 10, 2002 in the Court of Appeals of the State of South Carolina and the South Carolina Rule for Civil Proceedings, Rule # 6.
