Finally, as to the case title, I have amended the title to read as follows:


Of whom Courtney Feeley Karp, Individually and As Trustee of the Deborah Dereede Living Trust dated December 18, 2013, is the Petitioner.

In Re: Deborah Dereede Living Trust dated December 18, 2013.

Rather than placing the "In Re" language at the start of the title as the Court of Appeals did, I have moved this language to the end of the title which is more consistent with the prior practice of this Court. Further, in the title used in the petition for a writ of certiorari, you have reordered the title to list the petitioner first. This fails to comply with Rule 267(a), SCACR, which, among other things, states "the party commencing the action in the lower court shall always appear first in the

title regardless of whom is appellant or petitioner."
