RE: AFIS Fingerprint Card Submissions

The South Carolina Automated Fingerprint Identification System (SCAFIS) was established at the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED), Crime Information Center in 1990.

At that time the original master arrest fingerprint cards (first time arrested) housed at the SLED Crime Information Center were manually entered by scanning the cards into SCAFIS and as new arrests were made those cards were also manually scanned into the system. Mr. Quincey McCants' first arrest was in March of 1990 and would have been scanned into the SCAFIS as his master fingerprint card.

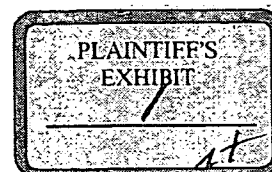
In 2001 SLED began receiving arrest fingerprint cards electronically from several local law enforcement agencies.

As of 2013, there are more than 100 agencies electronically submitting arrest fingerprint cards to SLED, which go on the AFIS within minutes of transmission.



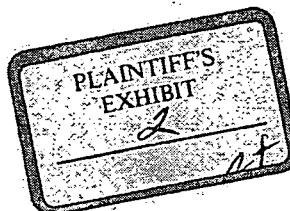

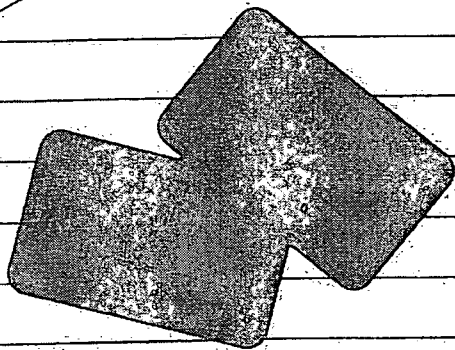

ON 1-5-05 I WAS CALLED BY LT. STAN SHARPE WHO SAID THAT THE SUSPECT HAD TURNED HIMSELF IN AT RICH LAND COUNTY SHERIFF DEPT. AND WAS AGREEING TO TALK TO LAW ENFORCEMENT. I THEN WENT AND MET WITH SHARP AND MCDONALD AT RCSD. UPON ARRIVAL I SPOKE WITH MCDONALD AND HE STATED THAT HE HAD CONFESSED TO DOING THE ROBBERY AT THE CITGO IN LEXINGTON COUNTY AND TWO OTHERS IN RICH LAND COUNTY. I MET WITH QUINCY AND I D MYSELF AS A DETECTIVE WITH LCSD. HE WENT ON TO STATE THAT HIS NEPHEW DID DRIVE HIM TO THE CITGO AND HE GOT OUT AND ROBBED THE STORE. HE SAID THAT HE TOLD JOSEPH THAT HE WAS GOING OVER TO BUSH RIVER RD. TO SEE A GIRL AND HE DID NOT KNOW THAT QUINCY WAS GOING TO ROB THE STORE. HE SAID THAT HE GAVE JOSEPH \$30.00 BEFORE THEY LEFT THE HOUSE AND HE SAID THAT HE HAD PLANNED TO GO BUY SOME MARIJUANA AND DID NOT HAVE THE MONEY TO DO IT. QUINCY SAID THAT HE GOT OUT THE CAR AND WALKED IN. HE SAID THAT HE WAS GOING TO GET A BEER AND THEN PICKED UP SOME CANDY. HE SAID THAT HE TOOK IT TO THE COUNTER AND WHEN THE CLERK RANG HIM UP HE REACHED OVER THE COUNTER AND TOOK ABOUT \$100.00 FROM THE REGISTER. HE SAID THAT THE CLERK GRABBED HIM AS HE REACHED OVER THE COUNTER (THE VIDEO PROVES THIS TO BE TRUE). HE THEN SPOKE ABOUT SOME ROBBERIES IN FOREST ACRES, COLUMBIA CITY AND IN RICH LAND COUNTY. ALL OF THESE ROBBERIES WERE STRONG ARM THAT HAD THE SAME PATTERNS AND SUSPECT DESCRIPTION. HE SAID THAT HE DID NOT DO IT AND HE DID NOT HAVE ANY IDEA HOW HIS PRINTS WERE THERE. (HE WOULD TALK ABOUT THE ROBBERIES THAT A GUN WAS NOT USED. HE ALSO SAID THAT HE DID NOT KNOW ANYTHING ABOUT A WHITE IN COLOR CUTLASS VEHICLE.)

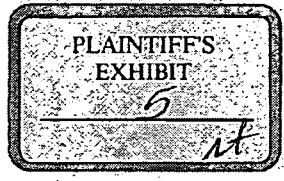

ON 1-7-05 I WENT TO THE JAIL AND MET WITH THE SUSPECT. I ASKED HIM IF STILL WISHED TALK (ON 1-6-05 WHEN HE WAS BEING BOOKED INTO LCSD HE TOLD ME THAT HE WAS TIRED AND ASKED IF I WOULD COME AND TALK TO HIM ON THE NEXT DAY). HE SAID THAT HE DID WISH TO TALK AND AGREED TO GO WITH ME TO AN INTERVIEW ROOM AT LCSD. WE ARRIVED IN THE INTERVIEW ROOM WITH DET. MELTON. THE SUSPECT WAS AGAIN ADVISED OF HIS RIGHTS AND HE AGREED TO TALK TO LAW ENFORCEMENT. MELTON HAD PAST CASES WITH THE SUSPECT AND HAD INTERVIEWED HIM IN THE PAST. THE SUSPECT WAS CONFRONTED WITH THE FINGER PRINTS ON THE BAG OF CHIPS FROM THIS ROBBERY. HE SAID THAT HE DID NOT REMEMBER DOING THE ROBBERY AND THE HE WAS ON COCAINE AND IT MADE HIM UNABLE TO REMEMBER SOME DETAILS. WE ALSO ASKED HIM ABOUT THE WHITE CUTLASS IN THE VIDEO AND HE SAID THAT HE DID NOT HAVE ANY INFORMATION ON THIS CAR. WE SPOKE WITH HIM FOR ABOUT THIRTY MINUTES AND HE STILL SAID THAT HE DID NOT KNOW WHY HIS FINGER PRINTS WERE ON A BAG OF CHIPS THAT WERE IN THE STORE AND VIDEO WHEN IT WAS ROBBED. HE SAID AGAIN ABOUT THE COCAINE USE AND THAT HE DID NOT REMEMBER. HE WAS THEN ESCORTED TO THE JAIL AND INTERVIEW WAS ENDED.

THE STORE VIDEO SHOWED THE SUSPECT ENTER THE STORE AND GRAB THE BAG OF CHIPS THAT WERE PROCESSED BY LCSD. ALSO THE PRINTS THAT WERE LIFTED AND COMPARED WERE THAT OF QUINCY MCCANTS. THE VIDEO ALSO SHOWS THE SUSPECT PICK UP THE CHIPS WITH THE SAME HAND THE PRINTS WERE MATCHED TO THE SUSPECT

I am writing to let you know about additional information on this case that I received today. During my interview of Chandra Wright, she informed me that sometime after the robbery on November 7, 2004, an officer came by with a piece of paper containing one to three photographs. She believes the photos were of the same individual. She said she recognized the man in the photo as the man who robbed the store on the night of November 7, 2004. She mentioned that after she identified the man in the photograph, she learned that the man's cousin or nephew had given law enforcement information on the man as well.

This is the first I have heard of this. I am in the process of trying to determine who she spoke to, and what if any photos were shown to her. I will keep you apprised of this situation.

Dear Mr. McCants:

I enjoyed meeting with you along with Mr. Jonathan Harvey on September 20, 2006, at the Lexington County Detention Center. As you already know, your trial is set for the week of October 16, 23006. Prior to meeting with you, Mr. Harvey and I met with the records custodian at the Lexington County Sheriff's Department and received all information they claim they have on your case. Mr. Harvey and I will be evaluating this material as we continuously prepare for your trial.

I believe Mr. Harvey and I were able to clarify your concerns regarding the fingerprint analysis which was initially done by SLED. As Mr. Harvey explained to you, SLED's test came back inconclusive, which means they could not find a match in their database. Thereafter, they sent your fingerprints to Lexington County. Lexington County was able to find a match based on previous prints you provided. Mr. Harvey obviously saw something wrong that SLED did not have a match, but Lexington County did. He hired a fingerprint analyst who did say that there was nothing wrong with the process and there was a positive match to your fingerprints. With that in mind, Mr. Harvey and I do not believe the expert he hired should testify on your behalf because he can only corroborate that prints were found that belong to you.


This letter will further confirm my understanding that you do not wish to plead guilty at this time. Nevertheless, I believe that we owe an ethical duty to you to continue to negotiate with the Solicitor handling this matter so as to attempt to secure a possible resolution to this matter short of trial. You already know what you are facing. Those negotiations with the Solicitor would just be attempts to try and minimize your exposure time so you don't have to spend the rest of your life behind bars. In my opinion, your case will come down to a swearing contest. 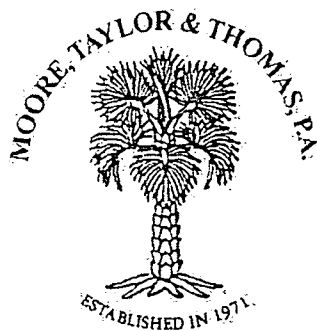

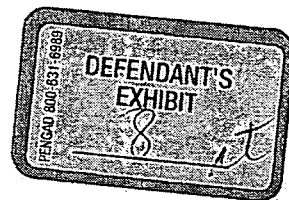

I enjoyed meeting with you and Mr. Harvey on Monday, October 9, 2006. This will confirm my understanding that you do not wish to plead guilty to the armed robbery charge which allegedly took place on November 7, 2004. Mr. Harvey and I discussed the possibility of a conviction and the consequences. I believe you understand those consequences, but still would like to go to trial. It is certainly not our intention to force you to do something you do not wish to do; however, I will caution you that regardless of this outcome, the Solicitor can try you on the other charges pending against you. If Mr. Harvey and I were able to work out a deal with the Solicitor, then we could probably wrap up all charges at one time so as to avoid multiple trials.
