Counsel for Therron Renard Richardson respectfully requests a **fourth and final** extension of thirty days **until October 16, 2019**, in which to file the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a fourth request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter are due to be filed with the Court today. The Court has granted counsel three previous extensions.
2. Counsel for Therron Renard Richardson respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the

number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage her caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.

3. Today, September 16, 2019, Counsel will file the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Greg K. Isaac v. State with the Supreme Court. On September 11, 2019, Counsel had an oral argument in the case of State v. Brian Willie Benson Lewis before the Court of Appeals. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of Tammy Dianne Brown v. State with the Court of Appeals on August 28, 2019. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of Steven Deontae Hooper v. State with the Court of appeals on August 28, 20219. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of State v. Lance Antonio Brewton with the Court of Appeals today, August 23, 2019. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of State v. Victoria Lorraine Sanchez with the Court of Appeals today, August 21, 2019. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Torren M. Eady v. The State in the Supreme Court on August 14, 2019. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Caziek Lightly v. The State in the Supreme Court on August 14, 2019. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of State v. Bobby Jones, Sr. in the Court of Appeals on July 22, 2019. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Malik Jabree Singleton in the Court of Appeals on August 7, 2019. Counsel is preparing and consulting with Chief Appellate Defender, Robert M. Dudek, on the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of State v. William D. Pennington which he plans to file with the Court of Appeals in the upcoming weeks.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that her caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request shown by signature below.




