


ORDER

In the explanation required by Rule 243(c), SCACR, Petitioner has failed to show that there is an arguable basis for asserting that the determination by the lower court was improper. Accordingly, this matter is dismissed. The remittitur will be sent as provided by Rule 221(b), SCACR.

Additionally, in light of the number of PCR applications Petitioner has filed we hereby prohibit Petitioner from filing any further collateral actions in the circuit court, including PCR actions, habeas corpus actions, and any motions relating to the previously filed collateral actions, challenging his 2003 conviction and sentence for trafficking cocaine base, or any motions in the underlying criminal case, including a motion pursuant to Rule 29, SCRCrimP, without first obtaining permission to do so from this Court.
