MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME

This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a second request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage his caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.



Counsel filed the Anders brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Michael Collins with the Court of Appeals on August 7, 2019. Counsel filed the return to petition for rehearing in the case of The State v. Anthony Martin with the Supreme Court on August 2, 2019. Counsel filed the brief of petitioner in the case of The State v. Michael Juan Smith with the Supreme Court on July 31, 2019. Counsel filed the brief of petitioner in the case of Robin Renee Herndon v. The State with the Supreme Court on July 29, 2019. Counsel filed the Anders brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Kenneth Campbell with the Court of Appeals on July 26, 2019.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.


5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office has been informed of this request.
