MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE PETITION FOR WRIT OF

Counsel for Quante Priest respectfully requests an extension of thirty (30) days in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a second request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:


1. The petition for writ of certiorari and appendix are due to be served and filed with the Court today.
2. Counsel for Quante Priest respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage her caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.

3. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Lawrence Postell with the Court of Appeals on September 18, 2019. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Antonio Fairey v. The State with the Supreme Court on September 16, 2019. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Chad Stalnaker v. The State with the Supreme Court on September 5, 2019. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Susan Hendricks v. The State with the Supreme Court on August 30, 2019. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Mark Day with the Court of Appeals on August 27, 2019. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Charles Davis v. The State with the Supreme Court on August 23, 2019. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Clifton Cooke v. The State with the Supreme Court on August 16, 2019. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Willie Stevenson v. The State with the Supreme Court on August 7, 2019. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of James Frady v. The State with the Supreme Court on July 29, 2019.


4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.


