
number of extensions previously granted and the order in which counsel attempts to manage her caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.

On August 21, 2019, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Domoneik Antwan Washington v. The State with the Supreme Court. On August 9, 2019, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Leroy Clifton Gibbs, III v. The State with the Supreme Court. On August 2, 2019, counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in In the Matter of the Care and Treatment of William Ralph Wilson, III with the Court of Appeals.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office has been informed of this request.






