stated that I wanted on the record.

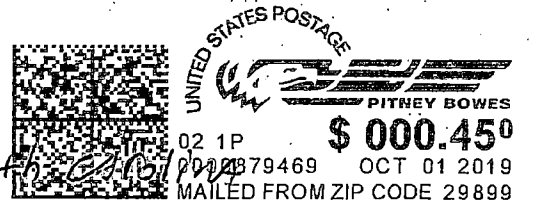
I never SPECIFICALLY stated I wanted to file
