MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME


1. The petition for writ of certiorari and appendix are due to be served and filed with the Court today.
2. Counsel for Keishawn Omar McManus respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Counsel filed the return to petition for writ of certiorari in the case of Michael Williams v. The State on September 16, 2019 with the Supreme Court. Counsel filed the return to petition for writ of certiorari in the case of Marie Faltas v. The State on September 13, 2019 with the Supreme Court. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari in the case of Albert Taylor v. The State on September 3, 2019 with the Supreme Court.


4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.




