MOTION FOR EXTENSION TO FILE
INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER

The undersigned counsel respectfully requests a thirty-day extension in which to file the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the above-referenced case. In support of this motion, counsel would respectfully show the Court the following extraordinary circumstances:

1. The initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in this case are due to be served and filed today.
2. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of William Brockmeyer v. The State with the Supreme Court on November 6, 2019. Counsel filed the Anders brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of In the Matter



Counsel had an oral argument in the case of In the Matter of Gerald Barrett, Jr., before the Court of Appeals held in Clemson on October 22, 2019. Counsel filed the return to petition for a writ of certiorari in the case of The State v. Billy Taylor with the Supreme Court on October 14, 2019. Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Daniel Lee Fludd with the Court of Appeals on October 4, 2019. Counsel filed the Anders brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of In the Matter of the Care and Treatment of Donald Donald Hulon with the Court of Appeals on September 16, 2019. Counsel filed the Anders brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Dameon Brown with the Court of Appeals on September 4, 2019.

3. This request is made in good faith, and not for purposes of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.


4. As indicated by the counsel below, counsel for the state graciously consents to or does not oppose this request.


