

COMES NOW, Respondent, above named, by and through the undersigned counsel, making its Petition to Relax Rule 243(g) and Request for Extension, and would show unto this Court:

I.

Respondent's Return to Petition for Writ of Certiorari in the above-captioned matter was due to be filed and served on January 2, 2020. However, the due date for this matter was inadvertently left off the calendar. Respondent therefore requests that the rules be relaxed in order to file a thirty day extension in which to prepare and submit its Return to Petition for Writ of Certiorari. 
