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
## ORDER


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

Petitioner's "Motion to Rehear, Re-Consider, and Consolidate" is denied. The remittitur has already been sent by the court of appeals in this matter. Therefore, this Court lacks jurisdiction. *See Wise v. S.C. Dep't of Corr.*, 372 S.C. 173, 174, 642 S.E.2d 551, 551 (2007) ("When the remittitur has been properly sent, the appellate court no longer has jurisdiction over the matter and no motion can be heard thereafter.").

Furthermore, Petitioner is currently prohibited from filing any litigation *pro se* based on conservatorship and guardianship orders issued by the Richland County Probate Court. *See In re Stritzinger*, 2019-GC-40-00037 (Prob. Ct. Richland County 2019) (Belton, J.); *In re Stritzinger*, 2019-GC-40-00052 (Prob. Ct. Richland County 2019) (Belton, J.). Petitioner shall, within twenty (20) days of the date of this order, provide this Court with any reason(s) he may have why the Court should not issue an order prohibiting him from filing any document in the courts of this state unless submitted by an attorney and approved by his conservator and/or guardian.
