FIRST AMENDED NOTICE OF APPEAL

Appellant notifies this court that Chief Judge Joceyln Newman, overturned a trial setting by a Peer Judge Sr. District Judge Manning to set this case in the Circuit Court of South Carolina due to a Probate Order where Appellant was not allowed to present evidence, even though this cause was filed and served in the District Court prior to the Probate case. Appellant does not believe a lower court can terminate a setting by a more senior Judge in the Circuit court. Furthermore, the Chief Labor Inspector of the State of South Carolina ruled that the Probate and Magistrates of Texas could not review the claim due to the amounts in question far in excess of 1M dollars.

Appellant is seeking a remand in this case for a trial, either in consolidated form or in an individual action which he was not allowed to file in Texas due to an ongoing dispute over an invalid appellate order by an Associate Justice of the 5th Judicial Circuit who was having a physical relationship with his wife at the time and failed to either recuse himself, or notify his peers of the same. Furthermore, the State of Texas objected only because he filed a cross-appeal in the US 5th Circuit Court of Appeals in New Orleans, LA, and the lower court order was entered in default when he was actually standing in the 5th Circuit with his appeal. This is a case of Judicial Misconduct in Texas, but is an issue to be heard at a later time while original actions are pending.

The issue is medical doctors with no legal training want to enter professional and expert opinions on legal issues they have no qualifications or business involving themselves with to terminate his civil actions even though they have no standing to do so, nor does his brother. Appellant is not a resident of South Carolina and is only here to resolve certain contractual issues in the US District Court which he expected would take some time.
