3 AGENT WATSON: Christopher Morris.

4 THE CLERK: Place your left hand on the Bible and
5 raise your right hand.

6 (Whereupon, Christopher Neal Morris was duly sworn by
7 the Clerk of Court.)

8 THE CLERK: He's been sworn, Your Honor.

9 THE COURT: Sir? Has he been sworn, Mr. Clerk?

10 THE CLERK: Yes, Your Honor.

11 THE COURT: All right. You're Christopher Neal
12 Morris?

13 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

14 THE COURT: Mr. Morris, have you read or had read to
15 you the report of your alleged probation violation?

16 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

17 THE COURT: You understand why you're here?

18 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

19 THE COURT: Do you agree or do you disagree that you
20 willfully violated the terms of your probation?

21 THE DEFENDANT: I -- to some of the violations, yes,
22 sir.

23 THE COURT: All right. Well, let me ask you what you
24 agree that you did to violate your probation.

25 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

1 THE COURT: Tell me what you did.

2 THE DEFENDANT: I took a plea on a new charge. I'd
3 actually had a friend that I took to another friend's
4 house and she went in and apparently had sold narcotic
5 hydros and the girl come out and had been wearing a wire
6 and gave me a hug at the truck and so they -- I took a
7 plea on a delivery, which violated my probation.

8 THE COURT: Well, let me go over what they're saying.
9 The 1106 said that you pled to the crime of felony
10 dangerous drugs and you received a four-year suspended
11 sentence in Tennessee --

12 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

13 THE COURT: -- and also that you failed to report
14 and you moved your address without notifying your agent.
15 Is that correct?

16 THE DEFENDANT: They're --

17 THE COURT: Is that yes, sir or no, sir?

18 THE DEFENDANT: No, sir.

19 THE COURT: You didn't?

20 THE DEFENDANT: (Shakes head.)

21 THE COURT: Okay. What do you have to say in
22 mitigation then?

23 THE DEFENDANT: On the failure to report, I was
24 still -- I never left the jail. I was transported on
25 child support to another county and so that's the reason

1 why on December 3rd I did not report to my probation
2 officer for that matter.

3 THE COURT: Does that -- does that sound consistent
4 with your notes, that he was incarcerated?

5 AGENT WATSON: Your Honor, I can kind of give you a
6 rundown --

7 THE COURT: Okay. Go ahead.

8 AGENT WATSON: -- of how things happened.

9 He was transferred to Tennessee in November 2007. He
10 tested positive in November of 2007 for meth.

11 MS. McCANN: '17.

12 AGENT WATSON: November '17.

13 He tested positive for meth December 2017 and he
14 was arrested in Tennessee December 2017 for possession
15 of controlled substance, driving under suspension and
16 possession of legend drug.

17 THE COURT: Of what?

18 AGENT WATSON: Legend drug.

19 MS. McCANN: Legend drug.

20 THE DEFENDANT: It was my father's truck and his
21 prescription was in the console of the truck and we're
22 still going to court over that. I haven't been charged
23 with --

24 THE COURT: You haven't been convicted of that one?

25 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

1 THE COURT: Then I won't consider that one.

2 AGENT WATSON: He was referred to drug classes April
3 2018. He was convicted on the new offenses in Tennessee.
4 He received probation on those charges in Tennessee. He
5 was arrested in Summerton, South Carolina, for charges in
6 Chester, South Carolina, December 2018.

7 THE COURT: Say those last two, please. I'm sorry.

8 AGENT WATSON: Arrested in Summerton, South Carolina,
9 for charges in Chester, December 2018. A violation report
10 from Tennessee was issued February 2019. He had absconded.
11 A home visit listed was done at father's residence and his
12 father stated he had been gone since release from jail
13 and his whereabouts were unknown. February 2019 he was
14 arrested in the state of Oklahoma and had to be extradited
15 back to South Carolina. The cost of his extradition was
16 \$1,136 and we will be requesting a restitution order back
17 to the state of South Carolina.

18 THE COURT: Did he pay anything towards his fine
19 originally set by Judge Culbertson?

20 AGENT WATSON: Your Honor --

21 THE DEFENDANT: No, sir, I haven't.

22 AGENT WATSON: No, sir.

23 THE COURT: All right.

24 Counsel, how are you doing this morning?

25 MS. McCANN: I'm fine. How are you, Your Honor?

1 THE COURT: Good.

2 MS. McCANN: Your Honor, as far as the rendition of
3 facts that Agent Watson has provided to the Court, I have
4 gone over those with my client. We have discussed them
5 all. He denies being in Summerton, South Carolina. That,
6 of course, doesn't mean he hasn't violated his probation,
7 but we also talked about the changing addresses. He said
8 he still lived at that address, but he was picked up in
9 Oklahoma and -- I think that was his official address,
10 but he was in Oklahoma at the time. We talked about the
11 distinction between those two.

12 He has clearly violated his probation. He has been
13 honest with me from the beginning that he has violated.
14 When he got to -- got back to Tennessee, he certainly
15 got into some trouble. He is a '99 grad of Chester
16 County High School in Tennessee. He's certified to teach
17 and evaluate carpentry, so he has some good skills for
18 construction. He's suffering from a -- he's been
19 diagnosed with a disease that's similar to narcolepsy, so
20 he's been waiting on disability and that's why he hasn't
21 paid is what he tells me.

22 He has a cousin who owns a construction company. He
23 just got awarded a bid in Nashville to build -- which
24 they're building everything in Nashville -- some sort of
25 structure. He understands Christopher's illness and the

1 implications of it. He's willing to hire Christopher on
2 in the construction company and give him an opportunity
3 there. He did go to drug and alcohol rehab. He went to
4 the Aspell Center in Tennessee. It was 30-day center.
5 He went August 7th of 2018. He completed that program
6 successfully. He tells me he has been clean ever since.

7 In Nashville there's a halfway house program there
8 that's long-term, including transitional living. One of
9 the conditions in working with his cousin is that he
10 goes to this halfway house and lives in this sober living
11 environment while he's employed with his cousin. He
12 hopes that the Court would accept that as part of his
13 long-term plans. The fact that he's clean and sober I
14 think is wonderful and is difficult to achieve and I hope
15 he gets credit for that.

16 He's been in jail for 47 days right now. There's no
17 question although that since he's violated he does have
18 plans to become a productive member of the community. We
19 would ask that you give him a 90-day revocation, terminate
20 his probation and allow him to go to Tennessee in order to
21 start this new program that he has and new hopes that he
22 has of achieving, Your Honor.

23 THE COURT: All right. Mr. Morris, anything you want
24 to add to that?

25 THE DEFENDANT: The only thing, Your Honor, the --

1 the 2018 charges, since 2017 when I was originally put on
2 probation for three years, I have not stepped foot back
3 in South Carolina since. I don't know what that's from.

4 MS. McCANN: He's still in on probation in Tennessee
5 and has things -- kind of hoping to save South Carolina
6 some money, send him back to Tennessee and let him be
7 their problem.

8 THE DEFENDANT: I also have --

9 THE COURT: Well, that's -- I'm not inclined to do
10 that, to be honest with you.

11 MS. McCANN: Thank you, Your Honor.

12 THE COURT: Mr. Morris, anything you want to add?

13 THE DEFENDANT: As far as my restitution, I do have
14 half of it on hold right now to -- to be paid and stuff
15 on --

16 THE COURT: Towards the cost your extradition?

17 THE DEFENDANT: (Nods head.)

18 THE COURT: All right. I'm gonna find that
19 Mr. Morris has willfully violated the terms of his
20 probation in that he's been convicted of the crime of
21 felony dangerous drugs, he's tested positive for
22 methamphetamine, he absconded supervision, he also left
23 the State and had to be extradited. I'm gonna revoke in
24 full, give him 47 days' credit. Your fine will be reduced
25 to a civil judgment, but restitution in the amount of

1 how much?

2 AGENT WATSON: \$1,136.10.

3 THE COURT: Okay. I'm gonna put it down there's
4 restitution, but likely it will just be a civil judgment.

5 Good luck to you.

6 AGENT WATSON: Thank you, Your Honor.

7 MS. McCANN: Thank you, Your Honor.

8 (Whereupon, the proceedings were concluded at
9 10:19 AM.)






The affiant states that there is probable cause to believe that the defendant named above did commit the crime(s) set forth, and that such probable cause is based on the following facts:

As evidenced of the violation report dated 2-13-19 and prepared by the state of Tennessee: On 12-3-18 Christopher Morris was convicted in the McHenry County TN General Sessions court for the crime of Felony Dangerous Drugs. He received a 4 year 310 days probation sentence thus failing to refrain from violation state/local law; failed to report to his TN officer as instructed after being sentenced to probation in TN on 12-3-18; failed to notify his TN officer before moving from his last known address of 311 Mitchell Street Selmer, TN 38375 to an unknown location thus absconding supervision. 
CIVIL JUDGMENT

That **CHRISTOPHER NEAL MORRIS** did in Aiken County, South Carolina, on or about October 31, 2015, knowingly or intentionally manufacture, distribute, dispense, deliver, purchase, or did aid, abet, attempt or conspire to manufacture, distribute, dispense, deliver or purchase, or possess with intent to distribute, dispense or deliver a quantity of Methamphetamine, a controlled substance under provisions of §44-53-110, et. seq, Code of laws of South Carolina (1976), as amended, such manufacturing not having been authorized by law.


