Dear Mr. Halcomb:

The Court has received your motion to reconsider grant of counsel's motion to withdraw. The Court declines to consider this motion because you remain represented and there is no right to hybrid representation. See *Miller v. State*, 388 S.C. 347, 347, 697 S.E.2d 527, 527 (2010) ("Since there is no right to 'hybrid representation' that is partially pro se and partially by counsel, substantive documents, with the exception of motions to relieve counsel, filed pro se by a person represented by counsel are not to be accepted unless submitted by counsel.").

Additionally, this Court cannot entertain a petition for rehearing unless the action of the Court has the effect of dismissing or finally deciding the case pursuant to Rule 221(c), SCACR.
