
1. The petition for writ of certiorari and appendix are due to be served and filed with the Court today.

Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Hector Villafuerte v. The State with the Supreme Court on January 6, 2020.


4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.


