

TO: David Osborne, Assistant Solicitor for the Ninth Judicial Circuit:

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the above-captioned defendant, by and through the undersigned attorney, moves this Honorable Court for a reconsideration of the sentence imposed upon the defendant on March 6, 2020, by the Honorable Jennifer McCoy, pursuant to the above-captioned charge.

The motion will be made upon the ground that Mr. Campbell received a sentence disproportionate to his co-Defendant's, Demetrius Young, and any further grounds mentioned in this Motion or at a future hearing:

1. On May 13, 2017, Mr. Campbell was arrested for Murder and Possession of a Weapon during the Commission of a Violent Crime.
2. On May 19, 2017, Mr. Campbell entered into a proffer agreement with the State whereby he provided details about the shooting not previously known to law enforcement.
3. On May 23, 2017, the co-Defendant - Demetrius Young - was arrested for Murder and Possession of a Weapon during the Commission of a Violent Crime as a result of Mr. Campbell's cooperation. When Mr. Young was arrested, he was on bond for unrelated Attempted Murder and Possession of a Weapon during the Commission of a Violent Crime charges.
4. Several months later, on November 15, 2017, a jury found Mr. Young guilty of Attempted Murder and Possession of a Weapon during the Commission of a Violent Crime. Mr. Young was sentenced by the Honorable D. Jefferson to ten (10) years imprisonment on the Attempted


Murder charge and five (5) years on the Possession of a Weapon during the Commission of a Violent Crime charge, to run concurrent. (Exhibit 1 & 2)

5. After Mr. Young was convicted of Attempted Murder, the State served Mr. Young with notice of its intent to seek life without parole on February 28, 2019. (Exhibit 3)
6. During the pendency of the above-captioned charge, Mr. Campbell complied with the conditions of his bond and remained a cooperating witness for the State.
7. In February 2020, despite serving Mr. Young with notice of intention to seek life without parole, the State offered Mr. Young a deal whereby he could plea to Voluntary Manslaughter for a negotiated range of twenty (20) to twenty-five (25) year to run concurrent with the sentences he was already serving for Attempted Murder and Possession of a Weapon during the Commission of a Violent Crime.
8. On February 14, 2020, Mr. Young pled guilty in front of the Honorable Bentley Price and received a twenty-two (22) year sentence to run concurrent with the ten (10) year sentence he received for Attempted Murder and five (5) years sentence he received for Possession of a Weapon during the Commission of a Violent Crime. (Exhibit 4)
9. On February 14, 2020, the State offered Mr. Campbell a deal to plea to Voluntary Manslaughter for a negotiated range of fifteen (15) to twenty (20) years. On February 24, 2020, Mr. Campbell rejected the offer and proceeded to trial the week of March 2, 2020. On March 6, 2020, Mr. Campbell was found guilty of Murder and received a thirty-seven (37) year sentence; fifteen (15) years longer than Mr. Young's. (Exhibit 5) Moreover, Mr. Young effectively only added twelve (12) years onto his sentence in light of the fact his sentence ran concurrent to the ten (10) year sentence he was already serving.
10. At Mr. Campbell's sentencing hearing, the State provided the Court with Mr. Campbell's criminal history. (Exhibit 6) During this stage of the hearing, the State informed the Court that Mr. Campbell was sentenced to seven (7) years suspended to two (2) years' probation for a 2017 conviction for Accessory after the Fact to a Felony A, B, or C. At the hearing, the Court asked whether Mr. Campbell was serving a probationary sentence when he was arrested on May 13, 2017. The State answered in the affirmative.
11. In comparison to Mr. Campbell being on probation, Mr. Young was out on bond for unrelated Attempted Murder and Possession of a Weapon during the Commission of a Violent Crime charges when he was arrested on May 23, 2017 for charges related to the present incident.
12. The Court sentenced Mr. Campbell to thirty-seven (37) years on the above-captioned charge; fifteen (15) years longer than Mr. Young's sentence. Surveillance video from the Rawan Market clearly shows a firearm in Mr. Young's hand. Furthermore, Mr. Campbell – in his May 19, 2017 statement and while on the stand – stated that Mr. Young shot the Victim. Since evidence tends to point to Mr. Young as the shooter, he arguably bears more culpability for the death of the Victim. However, Mr. Young will receive the benefit of a concurrent sentence and serve a substantially shorter sentence than Mr. Campbell

13. During Mr. Campbell's sentencing hearing, the Solicitor indicated Mr. Young and/or his attorney said he gave the gun to Mr. Campbell before the shooting. However, Mr. Young did not say this when he was sentenced by the Honorable Bentley Price on February 14, 2020. Mr. Young's attorney did state: "if we went to trial, we would be arguing two things...we'd be offering self-defense, and...that the person, K'Sone Campbell, was the one who pulled the trigger...." Transcript of Record at 9, State v. Demetrius Young (Feb. 14, 2020) (Exhibit 7). Mr. Young's attorney offered what could be a possible defense at trial; in fact, they are contradictory. Mr. Young's attorney did not offer this as a statement of fact. Additionally, Mr. Young did not say he gave the gun to Mr. Campbell during the hearing.
14. Mr. Campbell will serve fifteen (15) more years than Mr. Young despite his cooperation with the State. Mr. Campbell's cooperation helped secure Mr. Young's guilty plea. Mr. Young did not cooperate with police or the State during the pendency of this case.
15. Pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. § 16-3-20, Mr. Campbell is not eligible for work credits, good time credits, or any other credits that would reduce his sentence. Here, the Court may have been taking Mr. Campbell's probation into consideration when it sentenced him to thirty-seven (37) years. However, Mr. Campbell was on probation for Accessory After the Fact to a Felony A, B, or C pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. § 16-1-55. For that conviction, he received a sentence of seven (7) years suspended to two (2) years' probation. (Exhibit 8) If a Judge revoked Mr. Campbell's probation in full, he would likely not serve the full seven (7) years in light of the good time credits and work credits he could receive pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. § 24-13-210.
16. Defense counsel failed to inform the Court that Mr. Campbell recently started a residential and commercial cleaning business. This is indicative of Mr. Campbell's work ethic, initiative, and the positive impact he could potentially have on the community later in life; qualities corroborated by multiple character letters submitted to the Court on Mr. Campbell's behalf.

For the reasons outlined in this motion and any such further grounds as may be offered at a hearing in this matter, the Defendant respectfully requests that the Court reconsider his sentence and impose a thirty (30) year term of incarceration.





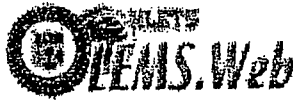

PROCEEDINGS

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THE COURT: All right. Good morning.

Are you Mr. Young?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

THE COURT: And you're here today to plead guilty to voluntary manslaughter.

Is that your understanding of what you're doing here today?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

THE COURT: All right. And you understand, by pleading guilty, you're giving up your Constitutional right to a jury trial, right to confront witnesses at that trial, right to remain silent.

Have you discussed those rights with your attorney?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

THE COURT: And are you satisfied with your attorney's representation?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

THE COURT: You need more time with your attorney?

THE DEFENDANT: No, sir.

THE COURT: All right. And you understand this is a, a violent and most serious offense.

You understand that?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

1 THE COURT: And you understand this is gonna be a
2 negotiated sentence, somewhere between 20 and 25 years,
3 which means that I can't go any lower, and I can't go any
4 higher. I must stay in that range, and that's all I'm
5 allowed to do, or I can just reject the plea altogether.

6 Do you understand that?

7 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir.

8 THE COURT: All right. Yes, sir.

9 SOLICITOR OSBORNE: Thank you, Your Honor.

10 The facts of the case are, on May the 11th of 2017 at
11 about 9:30PM, CPD responded to shots fired call for service
12 near the area of Oswego and Maverick, and that's located in
13 the City and County of Charleston.

14 Upon arrival, officers observed the victim, who was
15 later identified as Derrick Barber, lying on the ground next
16 to his car. He had been shot multiple times. Derrick's
17 11-month old child, Daia, and his seven year old boy, D.J.,
18 were in the car at the time that Derrick was gunned down.
19 Derrick was pronounced deceased later that night. After the
20 autopsy, it was shown that he was shot three to four times.

21 witnesses reported seeing a -- the shooter firing from
22 a white vehicle. That vehicle then fled the scene after the
23 shooting. Investigators located that vehicle. It was a
24 Dodge Avender (sic), Avenger, and they identified the driver
25 as being K'Sone Campbell. K'Sone is a codefendant in this

1 case. He's also been charged with murder, and, just for
2 your edification, both of these cases are set on the March
3 the 2nd trial docket.

4 All right. So, CPD found some surveillance video in
5 the area. The video showed, showed an altercation that
6 occurred about 10 minutes prior to the murder, and it was a
7 couple blocks away at a corner store located at 949 King
8 Street.

9 There were basically two groups involved in the fight.
10 This Defendant, Demetrius, was with K'Sone, they were
11 together, and they were fighting an individual by the name
12 of Derrick Milligan. Derrick is friends with the victim,
13 Derrick Barber.

14 During the fight, the video clearly shows the
15 Defendant, Demetrius, in possession of a large handgun.
16 When the fight was over, both the Defendant and K'Sone left
17 and Milligan left. A search of Milligan's phone records
18 showed that, right after that fight, he made contact with
19 the victim, Derrick, and he told Derrick to meet him in the
20 spot. After this message, Derrick's vehicle can be seen
21 pulling up to the location in which he would be murdered.

22 K'Sone was charged with murder, and, after his arrest,
23 he entered into a proffer agreement with the State. He came
24 in. He told us that he was the driver of the white car, and
25 that Demetrius, the Defendant, was sitting next to him in

1 the passenger seat. He said that -- K'Sone said that, when
2 he saw the victim, Derrick, he wanted to go talk to him
3 about the argument that he had with Milligan asking him to
4 tell Milligan to calm down. He said, during that
5 conversation, it got kind of heated, and then, unprovoked,
6 the Defendant then pulled out a gun, and, from the passenger
7 seat, shot Derrick multiple times.

8 The victim's family is here. I have spoken to them.
9 Lashay Smith, she is the mother of Derrick's children.
10 Kenneth Legare is Derrick's dad. Patricia Clark is
11 Derrick's mom. They, obviously and understandably, aren't
12 pleased with this plea. You know, they would like to see
13 more, but I think -- I hope that they understand the
14 challenges of the case, and, and based on what we have, I
15 think it's a fair resolution.

16 I will point out that the Defendant was out on bond for
17 attempted murder. He was later convicted of that, of that
18 crime, and was sentenced to 10 years. So, as part of this
19 agreement, whatever you sentence him to, we'd like to run
20 together, you know, to that sentence, and he's already doing
21 that in SCDC.

22 I haven't spoken to the victim's family. I'm not sure
23 if they want to address the Court.

24 THE COURT: Is he in SC -- he's in SCDC now?

25 SOLICITOR OSBORNE: He---

1 MR. SMILEY: That is correct.

2 SOLICITOR OSBORNE: He is.

3 THE COURT: Okay. Okay. I'd be happy to hear from
4 anybody like to say anything.

5 MR. LEGARE: Good morning.

6 THE COURT: Good morning, sir. How are you?

7 MR. LEGARE: I'm, I'm Kenneth Legare, and I'm Derrick's
8 father, and we're hurt. And, Your Honor, we don't
9 understand why Demetrius did what he done, and I want to
10 hear him tell us why he shot him.

11 THE COURT: I can't make him do that. I'm sorry.

12 MR. LEGARE: Okay. I have no other comments.

13 THE COURT: All right. Anyone else like to say
14 anything?

15 Yes, ma'am.

16 MS. CLARK: I'm Derrick's mother. It's been so hard
17 for me. He was my son. I just want them to get the message
18 before he -- when he would come out here and kill somebody
19 else. I mean, as we've gone through, killed my son in front
20 of his children. That is crazy. It don't make no sense.
21 And as to why he done that to my child always like -- once
22 he -- he's -- he ain't never gonna -- no child, no child
23 will be out there having trouble with nobody or nothing that
24 day. All he just wanted peace, and for him to get called
25 down there, and have his children in that car. That didn't

1 make no sense for him to do -- shot him four times like that
2 with a .45, and it don't make no sense. We can't see him.

3 THE COURT: All right. Anything further from the
4 State?

5 SOLICITOR OSBORNE: Your Honor, based on the facts and,
6 and the fact that he was out on bond, we'd ask you to go
7 ahead and impose the maximum 25 year sentence under the
8 agreement.

9 THE COURT: All right.

10 All right. Yes, sir, Mr. Smiley, be happy to hear from
11 you.

12 MR. SMILEY: Yes, sirs.

13 Demetrius is 22 years old. He is here with his mother,
14 and his grandmother, Mrs. Robinson, as he was raised in the
15 household with Mrs. Robinson on King Street.

16 The young man made straight As in school, and things
17 were going well in his life, and he saw his grandfather,
18 who's a father to him, murdered in front of him and his
19 grandmother in the home invasion. And there was nothing he
20 could do about it.

21 And that had traumatic impact on his life. That
22 happened when he was a sophomore, was it?

23 Sophomore in high school.

24 Shortly after that, he got a -- falsely accused and
25 arrested for an armed robbery, and I think he got extremely

1 frustrated with the system, that he was being arrested for
2 something that he didn't do, and they never arrested anybody
3 that killed his grandfather. And, I believe, at this point,
4 and this partly runs back to the other case I represented
5 him on, he thought he had to defend his homestead for his
6 grandmother and family.

7 The attempted murder that he's doing 10 years on, no
8 one was hit. That was shots fired in the direction of
9 somebody when he was under a sidewalk in front of his house.

10 This charge, Your Honor, if, if we went to trial, we
11 would be arguing two things different from the facts that
12 Mr. Osborne, if we were at trial, cause we would be
13 offering -- we'd be offering self-defense, and I've told him
14 he waives that today. His -- without going into more
15 details, and then the fact that he was not the one that
16 pulled the trigger, that the person, K'Sone Campbell, was
17 the one who pulled the trigger, if we went to trial. He
18 certainly was there, and involved, hand of one, hand of all.

19 Your Honor, his -- this was not Demetrius' fight is the
20 problem cause this started at the corner store, and K'Sone
21 got in a vehicle with someone. Demetrius, at the time, was
22 friends with K'Sone, and was there to back him up. That
23 ended and everybody left.

24 At trial, we'd be arguing that Mr. -- that the
25 deceased's motive for coming downtown was different.

1 However, he came downtown with his children, and certainly
2 got killed, and Mr. Demetrius Young was right in the middle
3 of it cause he certainly was seen with a gun. It's a
4 terrible thing.

5 He was served Life without Parole Notice in this case,
6 and Demetrius, in weighing his options of going to trial,
7 maintaining self-defense, or what have you, does not want to
8 risk a life sentence cause he is a young man. He's
9 extremely intelligent. He has a smile that will light up
10 blocks.

11 His grandmother, Mrs. Robinson, is got a heart of gold
12 cause she can't understand things that go on in the city
13 anymore. His mom, Pam, is sitting beside him. Just wants
14 to be able -- hopes that her son can grow up and survive the
15 event that he's gonna have in prison.

16 He still will have some kind of future this way, and
17 we're gonna ask you to impose a 20 year sentence, Your
18 Honor. He's been in on this charge since the date of



Milligan engaged in a physical altercation with two black males about fifteen minutes prior to the murder. One of the individuals is observed brandishing a firearm before the fight is separated. The two individuals then leave the store.

Multiple witnesses (who will be named later in court) were located and interviewed. During these interviews, the two black males who engaged Deangelo in the altercation in the Rawan Market were positively identified as the defendant, K'sone Campbell, and Demetrius Young.

Video surveillance obtained during the investigation shows the following sequences of events:

- After the altercation at the Rawan Market, Campbell and Young leave and walk toward King St.
- Moments later, a white Dodge Avenger turns from King St. onto Moultrie St. and stops in the area of 18 Moultrie Street. One person exits the driver side of the vehicle and walks toward 18 Moultrie and then returns to the vehicle a moment later.
- The vehicle then drives away toward Rutledge Ave.
- A moment later, a white Dodge Avenger turns onto Maverick St. from Rutledge Ave. toward the intersection of Maverick St. and Oswego St. This vehicle then turns left onto Oswego St.
- A moment later, the victim arrives in his vehicle, performs a u-turn and parks in front of 17 Maverick St. (which is on the corner of Maverick St. and Oswego St.) facing toward King St.
- Deangelo Milligan is observed walking toward the victim's parked vehicle.
- The suspect vehicle then turns on its lights and turns onto Maverick St. facing Rutledge Ave. A moment later, multiple gunshots are heard.
- As the vehicle flees the scene of the shooting on Maverick St. toward Rutledge Ave., it is observed to be the white Dodge Avenger.


A witness (who will be named later in court) stated that while travelling through the area, he observed a white sedan in the middle of the roadway on Maverick St. in the vicinity of Oswego St. A person wearing dark clothing was standing in the road next to the victim's vehicle. The witness stated that the person in dark clothing was arguing with the driver of the white sedan. Immediately after he passed the white sedan, he heard gun shots and left the area.

After speaking with an additional witness (to be named later in court), Kimberly Dwight was identified as the girlfriend of K'sone Campbell. After a search of the Charleston Police Department's (CPD) records management system, it was found that Ms. Dwight had previous interactions with CPD while driving a 2014 Dodge Avenger (white in color, bearing Alabama tag 19BJ842). An automatic license plate reader (ALPR) image was obtained which showed that the aforementioned vehicle has a dark in color wheel on the front passenger side of the vehicle which is consistent with the suspect vehicle. Ms. Dwight's residence was located at 3258 Walter Dr., Charleston, SC. Detectives responded to this address and observed said vehicle parked in the parking lot in front of this location. Upon making contact with Ms. Dwight, she was in the company of Mr. Campbell at this residence.

Ms. Dwight stated that on Thursday, May 11th, 2017, Mr. Campbell had possession of her Dodge Avenger and had the vehicle the entire day. She stated that Mr. Campbell told her he was stopping at the store on Maverick St. for a beer. At approx. 9:30 PM, Mr. Campbell's mother called her and stated that Mr. Campbell was on his way home and that his friend, Derrick Barber, had just been killed. Mr. Campbell returned to her residence at approx. 10:00 PM with her vehicle. He appeared to be upset and stated that he had been in a fight with Deangelo Milligan at the Maverick store. Ms. Dwight observed surveillance images from the scene and

positively identified her vehicle (2014 Dodge Avenger) as the vehicle in the images.

During a post Miranda statement given by the defendant he stated that he was in an altercation with Mr. Milligan in the Rawan Market. After the altercation he got into his girlfriend's white in color Dodge Avenger and was the sole occupant. He stated that he left the area immediately following the fight and went directly to Johns Island. His statements conflict with the with the video surveillance evidence obtained from the surrounding area.

The above is true and believable based upon statements of the defendant, Kimberly Dwight, and the investigation of the Charleston Police Department.

Campbell, did knowingly, willingly and unlawfully violate South Carolina State Statute, 16-3-10 (Murder), in
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On the above date, time and location the Charleston Police Department responded to the area of Maverick
Street and Oswego Street in reference to a shooting. Officers arrived and observed the victim, Derrick Barber,
on the ground suffering from multiple gunshot wounds. Deangelo Milligan was standing next to him and
shouting for help. Mr. Barber was lying next to a green Lincoln Town Car (SC License Tag: MQK 92), which
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there were two young crying children in the vehicle. CCEMS arrived and transported Mr. Barber to MUSC
where he was pronounced deceased.

Detectives spoke with Mr. Milligan, who said that he called Mr. Barber this evening to meet at "The Spot,"
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any further information.

Detectives canvassed the area and located video surveillance at Rawan Market (corner of Maverick Street and
King Street - which is about a block from the incident location). Video from within the store depicts Mr.

AFFIDAVIT

Milligan engaged in a physical altercation with two black males about fifteen minutes prior to the murder. One of the individuals is observed brandishing a firearm before the fight is separated. The two individuals then leave the store.

Multiple witnesses (who will be named later in court) were located and interviewed. During these interviews, the two black males who engaged Deangelo in the altercation in the Rawan Market were positively identified as the defendant, K'sone Campbell, and Demetrius Young.

Video surveillance obtained during the investigation shows the following sequences of events:

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- Moments later, a white Dodge Avenger turns from King St. onto Moultrie St. and stops in the area of 18 Moultrie Street. One person exits the driver side of the vehicle and walks toward 18 Moultrie and then returns to the vehicle a moment later.
- The vehicle then drives away toward Rutledge Ave.
- A moment later, a white Dodge Avenger turns onto Maverick St. from Rutledge Ave. toward the intersection of Maverick St. and Oswego St. This vehicle then turns left onto Oswego St.
- A moment later, the victim arrives in his vehicle, performs a u-turn and parks in front of 17 Maverick St. (which is on the corner of Maverick St. and Oswego St.) facing toward King St.
- Deangelo Milligan is observed walking toward the victim's parked vehicle.
- The suspect vehicle then turns on its lights and turns onto Maverick St. facing Rutledge Ave. A moment later, multiple gunshots are heard.
- As the vehicle flees the scene of the shooting on Maverick St. toward Rutledge Ave., it is observed to be the white Dodge Avenger.

The white Dodge Avenger in the above mentioned surveillance video is observed with a distinctive dark wheel on the front, passenger side of the vehicle.

A witness (who will be named later in court) stated that while travelling through the area, he observed a white sedan in the middle of the roadway on Maverick St. in the vicinity of Oswego St. A person wearing dark clothing was standing in the road next to the victim's vehicle. The witness stated that the person in dark clothing was arguing with the driver of the white sedan. Immediately after he passed the white sedan, he heard gun shots and left the area.

After speaking with an additional witness (to be named later in court), Kimberly Dwight was identified as the girlfriend of K'sone Campbell. After a search of the Charleston Police Department's (CPD) records management system, it was found that Ms. Dwight had previous interactions with CPD while driving a 2014 Dodge Avenger (white in color, bearing Alabama tag 19BJ842). An automatic license plate reader (ALPR) image was obtained which showed that the aforementioned vehicle has a dark in color wheel on the front passenger side of the vehicle which is consistent with the suspect vehicle. Ms. Dwight's residence was located at 3258 Walter Dr., Charleston, SC. Detectives responded to this address and observed said vehicle parked in the parking lot in front of this location. Upon making contact with Ms. Dwight, she was in the company of Mr. Campbell at this residence.

Ms. Dwight stated that on Thursday, May 11th, 2017, Mr. Campbell had possession of her Dodge Avenger and had the vehicle the entire day. She stated that Mr. Campbell told her he was stopping at the store on Maverick St. for a beer. At approx. 9:30 PM, Mr. Campbell's mother called her and stated that Mr. Campbell was on his way home and that his friend, Derrick Barber, had just been killed. Mr. Campbell returned to her residence at approx. 10:00 PM with her vehicle. He appeared to be upset and stated that he had been in a fight with Deangelo Milligan at the Maverick store. Ms. Dwight observed surveillance images from the scene and

positively identified her vehicle (2014 Dodge Avenger) as the vehicle in the images.

During a post Miranda statement given by the defendant he stated that he was in an altercation with Mr. Milligan in the Rawan Market. After the altercation he got into his girlfriend's white in color Dodge Avenger and was the sole occupant. He stated that he left the area immediately following the fight and went directly to Johns Island. His statements conflict with the with the video surveillance evidence obtained from the surrounding area.

The above is true and believable based upon statements of the defendant, Kimberly Dwight, and the investigation of the Charleston Police Department.


