ORDER

By order dated March 19, 2020, the South Carolina Court of Appeals dismissed the appeal in this matter. While petitioner has filed a petition for reinstatement, this petition has not been ruled on by the Court of Appeals.¹

Petitioner has now filed a notice of appeal seeking review of the decision of the South Carolina Court of Appeals in this matter. This document has been construed as a petition for a writ of certiorari under Rule 242 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR).

Under Rule 242(a) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR), this Court will only review a final decision of the Court of Appeals, and a decision is not final for the purposes of review until a petition for rehearing or reinstatement has been acted on by the Court of Appeals. Rule 242(c), SCACR.


Since the petition for reinstatement has not been ruled on, there is no final decision for this Court to review. Accordingly, the petition for a writ of certiorari is dismissed without prejudice to petitioner's ability to timely seek review in the manner specified by Rule 242, SCACR, if the Court of Appeals denies the petition
