**APPELLANT’S NOTICE OF SUPPLEMENTAL AUTHORITY**

Appellant James H. Harrison, by and through the undersigned attorneys, hereby submits this notice of supplemental authority. The Court’s recent decision in State v. Quinn, Op No. 27966 (S.C. Sup. Ct. filed May 6, 2020) (Shearouse Adv. Sh. No. 18 at 78–98), is relevant to and will have an impact on the issue raised in Harrison’s case pertaining to First Circuit Solicitor David Pascoe’s lack of authority. Although the Court already indicated the matters briefed by the Solicitor, the Attorney General, and Rick Quinn in the Quinn appeal would be addressed during oral arguments in the present appeal,<sup>1</sup> out of an abundance of caution, Harrison respectfully

submits this request for the Court to take judicial notice of all filings related to the inquiries it posited in an Order dated March 12, 2020. Order, State v. Quinn, App. Case No. 2018-000494 (S.C. Sup. Ct. filed Mar. 12, 2020).

Should the Court require a more formal motion to supplement the record to include these matters, see Rule 212, SCACR, Harrison is happy to prepare such a motion for the Court's review. The undersigned will await the Court's guidance on that end. Based upon the opinion, however, it appears these matters are already properly before the Court. Cf. Rule 201(f), SCRE ("Judicial notice may be taken at any stage in the proceeding."). And Harrison stands ready to address them.
