**MOTION TO RELAX RULE 243(g), SCACR, AND
FILE RESPONDENT'S THIRD EXTENSION REQUEST OUT OF
TIME**

COMES NOW, Respondent, above named, by and through the undersigned counsel, making its Petition to Relax Rule 243(g) and Request for Extension, and would show unto this Court:

I.

Respondent's Return to Petition for Writ of Certiorari in the above-captioned matter was due to be filed and served on May 13, 2020. However, Respondent's extension request was not filed due to an oversight. Respondent therefore requests that the rules be relaxed in order to file a thirty day extension in which to prepare and submit
