STATEMENT OF THE CASE

On September 1, 2018, Dwight Gray brought this action against Kimbrells Furniture

Facts relevant to be submitted to this Honorable court are referenced herein as matters occurred at Greenville County Magistrate and Greenville County Court of Common Pleas. The Manager for respondents Kimbrells Furniture Company appeared on behalf of Kimbrells Furniture in a South Carolina Court which requires by law, that the representative for a business be a licensed South Carolina attorney. The transcript of the matter is in the custody and control of the Court reporter. Petitioner made every effort to secure the Transcript but was unsuccessful.

The Court of Appeals dismissed appeal on technical violation of petitioner securing transcript from Court reporter. (S.C. Ct. App. filed March 19, 2020). Petitioner seeks a writ of certiorari to review that decision.


