MOTION FOR EXTENSION DUE TO COVID-19

Appellant respectfully submits this motion for an additional 20 day extension of time to file Appellant's Initial Brief and Designation of Matter.

Both were due May 12, 2020. Appellant seeks an extension to June 1, 2020, a 20 day extension.

The basis of Appellant's motion is the COVID-19 crisis. Appellant has been forced to vacate 216 Jones Avenue, his prior address, and move to 214 Jones Avenue, (both in Simpsonville, SC) on a temporary basis because Appellant has demonstrated numerous respiratory symptoms consistent with COVID-19 infection. This move was necessary because Appellant's parents also reside at 216 Jones Avenue and

Appellant's mother is extremely high risk re COVID-19 due to her age and her pre-existing conditions (COPD and related respiratory issues).

Appellant has been advised not to return to 216 Jones Avenue until his symptoms have been absent for fourteen consecutive days.

Appellant has been asymptomatic for several days but will not have been asymptomatic for fourteen days until late May. At that time, Appellant will return to the 216 Jones Avenue address.

Appellant must be able to return to 216 Jones Avenue to complete the Initial Brief and

Designation of Matter. The only computer and printer Appellant has access to are his parents', which remain at the 216 Jones Avenue address, as does Appellant's case file. Access to these materials is necessary for Appellant to finalize and print the Initial Brief and Designation of Matter, which were approximately 95% complete when Appellant was forced to move due to COVID-19 symptoms.

Because Appellant is indigent and pro se, Appellant has no alternative but to wait to regain access to the 216 Jones Avenue address to

complete the Initial Brief and Designation of Matter. A twenty day extension will allow Appellant sufficient time to complete his home quarantine at the 214 Jones Avenue address while protecting his family members at 216 Jones Avenue, then finish his filings and submit them on or before June 1, 2020.

Appellant respectfully requests the Court grant the requested extension due to the COVID-19 situation and its effect on Appellant. Appellant understands no filing fee is required for this motion.

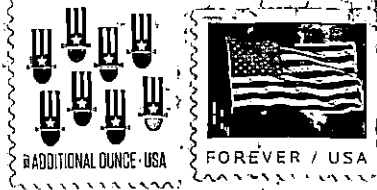
