




## ORDER

---

Petitioner filed a notice of appeal from the denial of his fourth application for post-conviction relief (PCR). Petitioner was asked to provide the explanation required by Rule 243(c), SCACR, showing there is an arguable basis for asserting the dismissal of his fourth PCR application was improper. Petitioner has not shown there is an arguable basis that the dismissal of his PCR application was improper. Therefore, the notice of appeal is dismissed.

In light of the number of PCR applications petitioner has filed, he was also asked to provide any reasons why this Court should not impose restrictions on his filing of collateral actions or motions in the circuit court challenging his 1999 convictions and sentences for seven counts of distribution of crack cocaine, three counts of conspiracy to distribute crack cocaine, six counts of distribution of crack cocaine within the proximity of a school, distribution of marijuana, and distribution of marijuana within proximity of a school (1993-GS-32-1793, -1796, -1798, -1801, -1805, -1807, -1936, -1795, -1800, 1809, -1794, -1797, -1799, -1802, -1806, -1808, -1803, -1804). Petitioner failed to provide any valid reason this Court should not impose restrictions on his future filings. Accordingly, we hereby prohibit Petitioner from filing any further collateral actions in the circuit court, including PCR actions and habeas corpus actions, as well as any motions relating to the previously filed collateral actions, challenging his 1999 convictions and sentences, or any motions in the underlying criminal cases, including a motion pursuant to

Rule 29, SCRCrimP, without first obtaining permission to do so from this Court.
