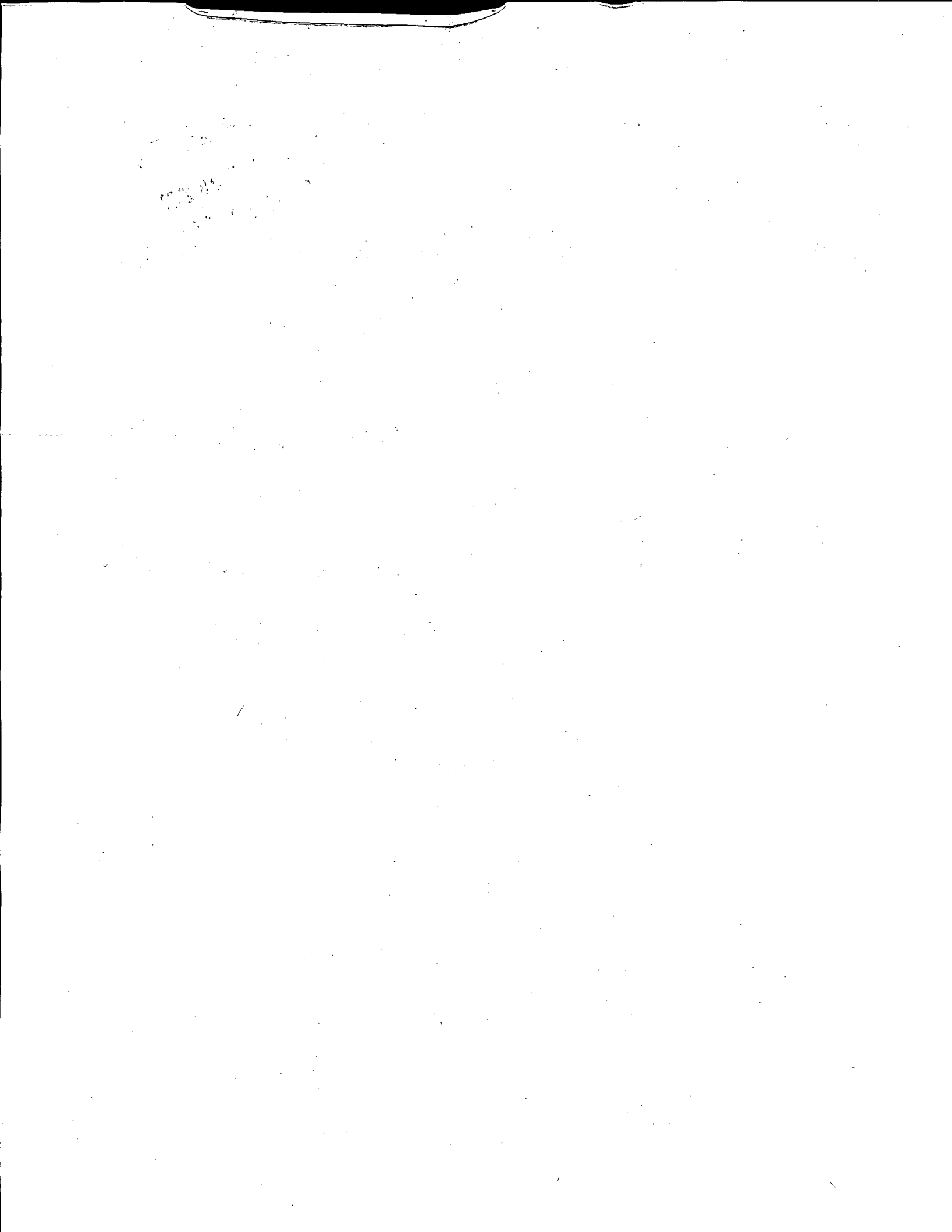

## Statement

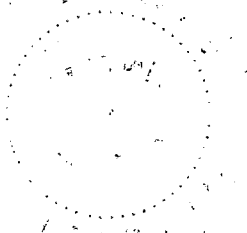
Come Now Calvin E. Snell The Petitioners Pro Se
