
ORDER

Respondent South Carolina Office of Regulatory Staff (ORS) moves for an extension of time to serve and file any initial brief and designation of matter in these consolidated cases. Appellant-Respondent Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC, Duke Energy Progress, LLC and Respondent-Appellant South Carolina Energy Users Committee consent to the motion.
