MOTION FOR A 14-DAY EXTENSION OF THE DEADLINE BY WHICH
RESPONDENT MAY FILE HIS BRIEF IN OPPOSITION TO SOUTH CAROLINA
DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS' PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI

By an order dated March 12, 2020, this Court granted the petition for writ of certiorari filed by the petitioner, the South Carolina Department of Corrections ["SCDC"]. SCDC filed its Brief on Certiorari on May 18, 2020. Upon Respondent's Motion dated June 12, 2020, this Court granted Respondent on June 22, 2020 an extension until July 7, 2020 in which to file his Brief.
