

ORDER

By order dated February 12, 2020, petitioner's counsel was relieved, and petitioner was directed to either provide this Court with the name of retained counsel, or provide the Division of Appellate Defense with a completed affidavit of indigency so that office could determine whether petitioner is eligible for the appointment of counsel. Based on Petitioner's failure to submit the name of retained counsel, or to submit a completed affidavit of inidgency to Appellate Defense, the records of this Court will now reflect that petitioner is proceeding without counsel in this case.

Petitioner shall serve and file the petition for a writ of certiorari and appendix in accordance with Rule 243 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR) within thirty (30) days of the date of this order. If he has not already done so, Jeremy A. Thompson, Esquire, petitioner's former counsel, shall immediately send a copy of the transcript of the post-conviction relief hearing to the petitioner.
